








THINKING ABOUT THE WAY YOUR AREA IS POLICED OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS DO YOU EXPECT IT TO....?






THINKING ABOUT THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS DO YOU EXPECT IT TO....?






THINKING ABOUT THE NHS OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS DO YOU EXPECT IT TO....?























One in four say they have been affected by cuts so far






Half think cuts to welfare and benefits have gone too far, while those who disagree that reductions were necessary continue to rise
