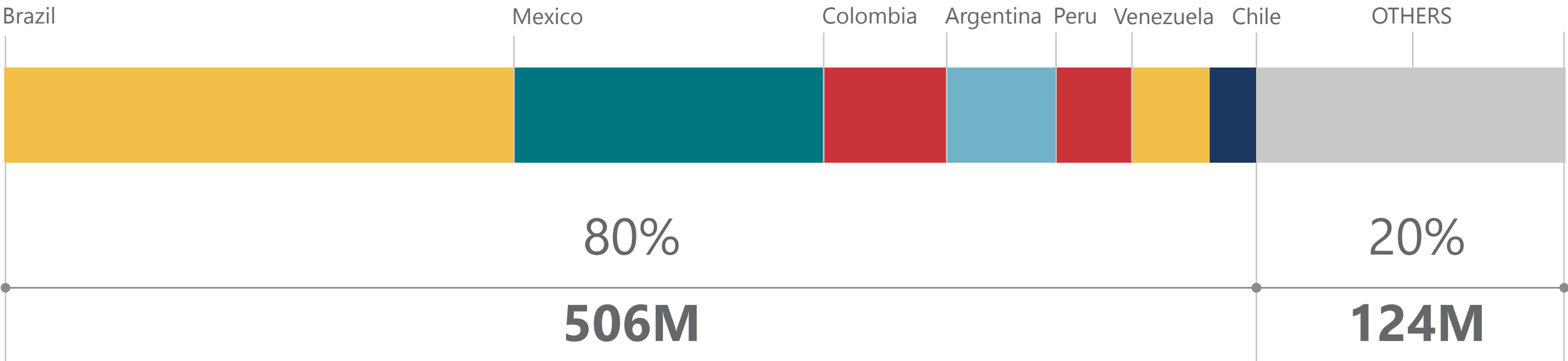


# **Socio-Political & Economic Trends in Latin America**

# The 7 largest countries of Latin America make up 80% of the region's population

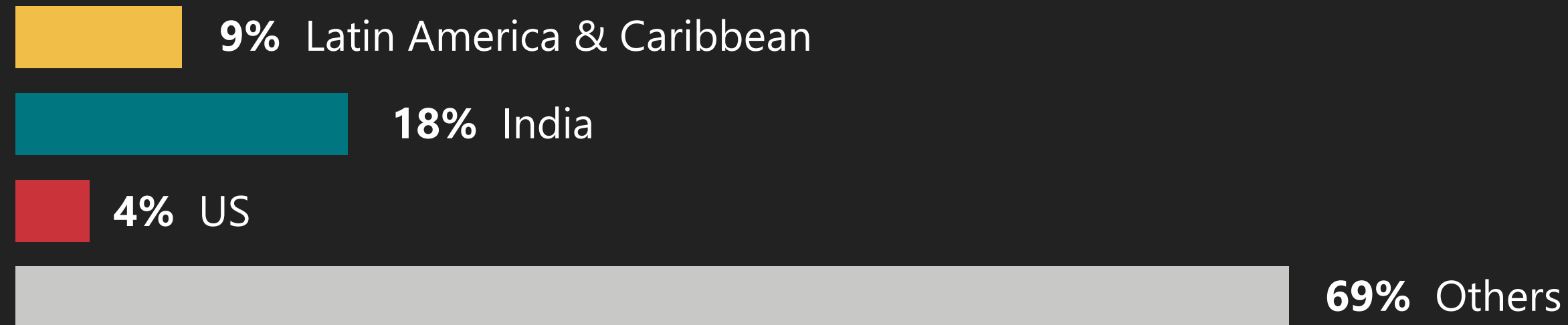
% of Latin American population

% Of world's population



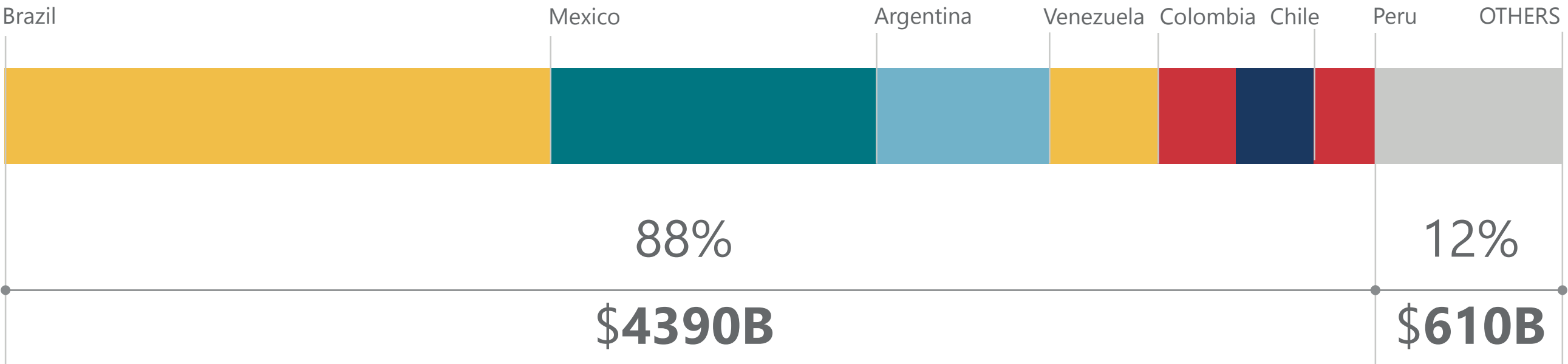

# The 7 largest economies of the region make up 88% of Latin America's GDP

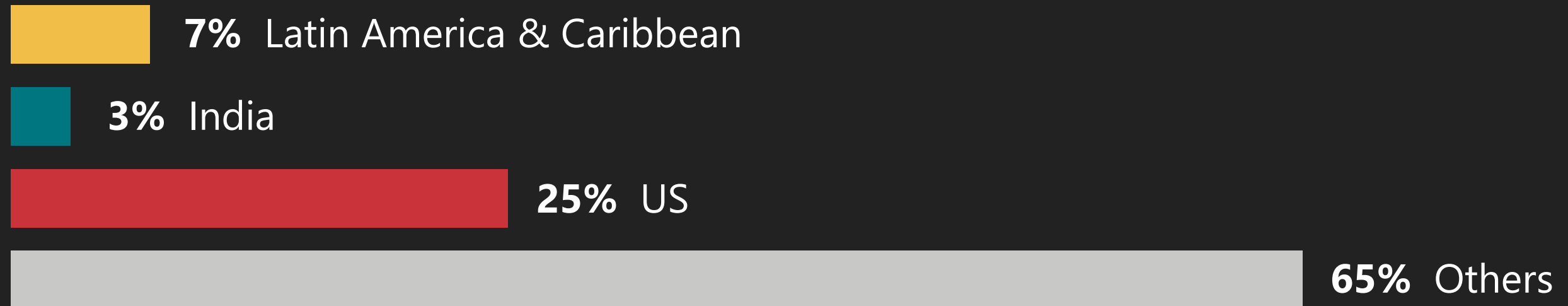
% Distribution of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in Latin America

% Distribution of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the world

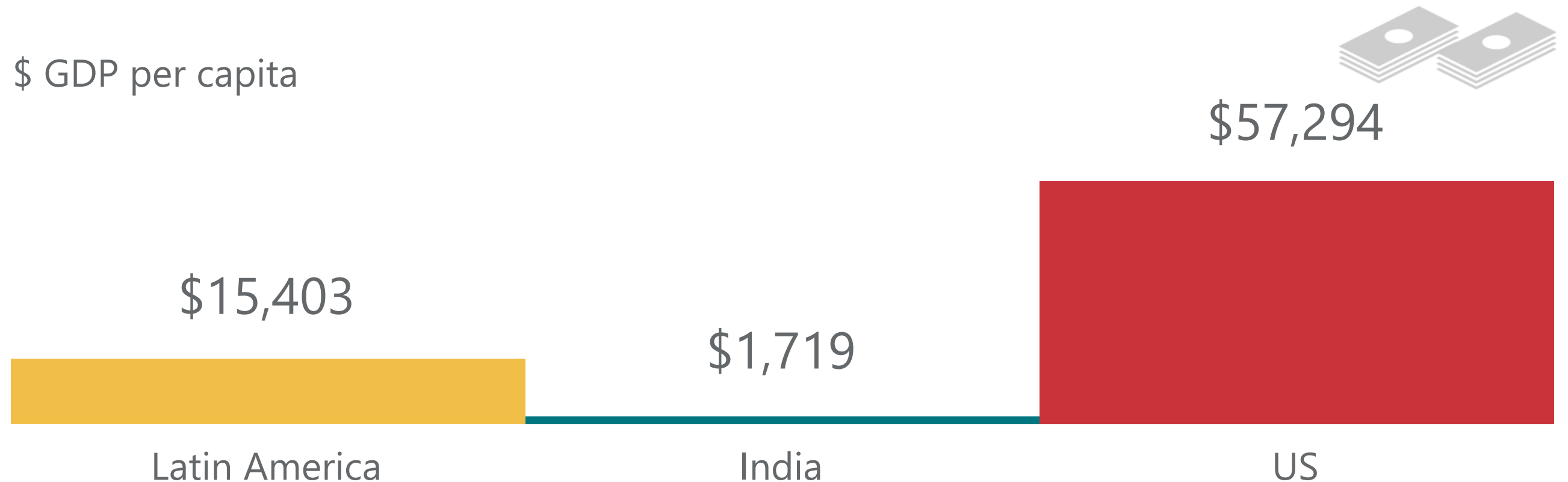

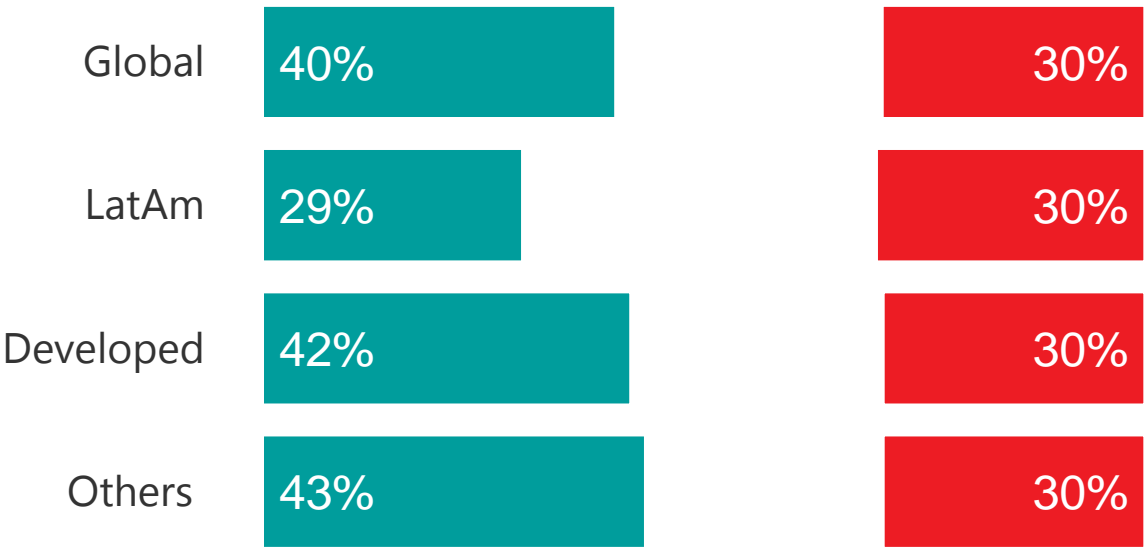
# The satisfaction with standard of living is lower in Latin America than in the rest of the world

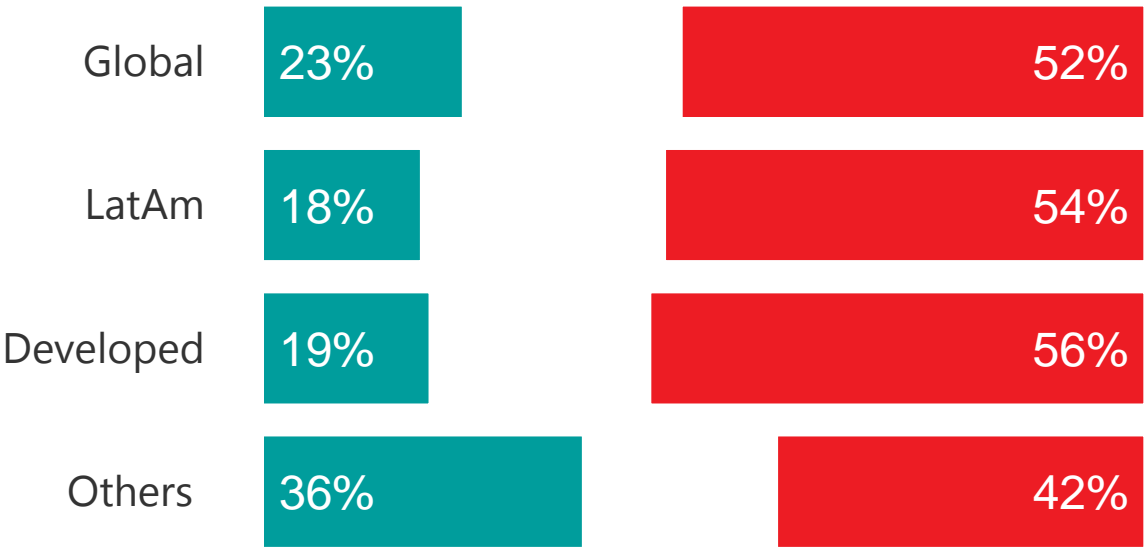

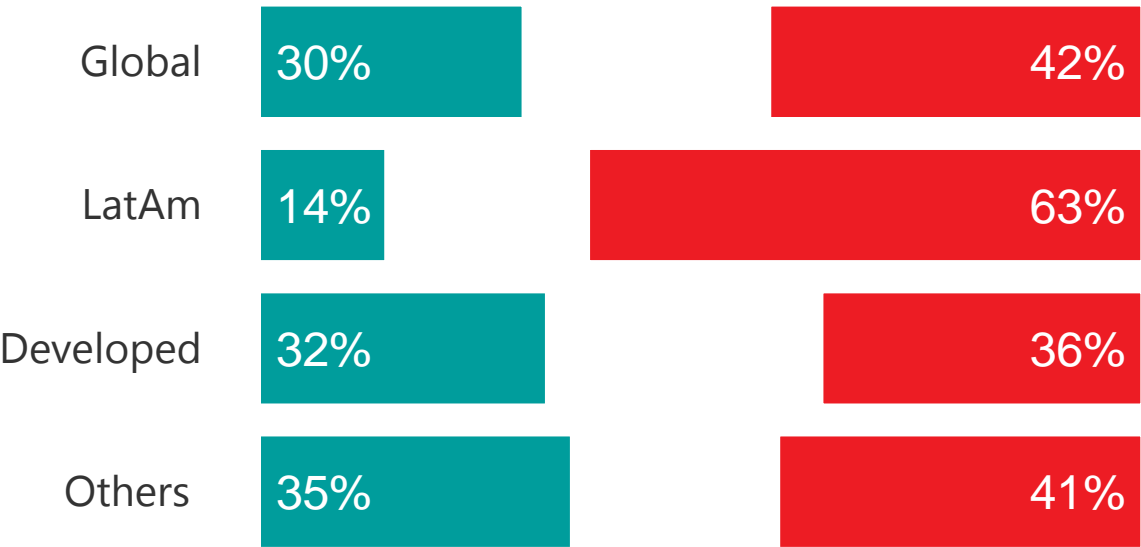

How satisfied or dissatisfied do you feel about local public services (e.g. public transportation, public education, public safety and social services)?

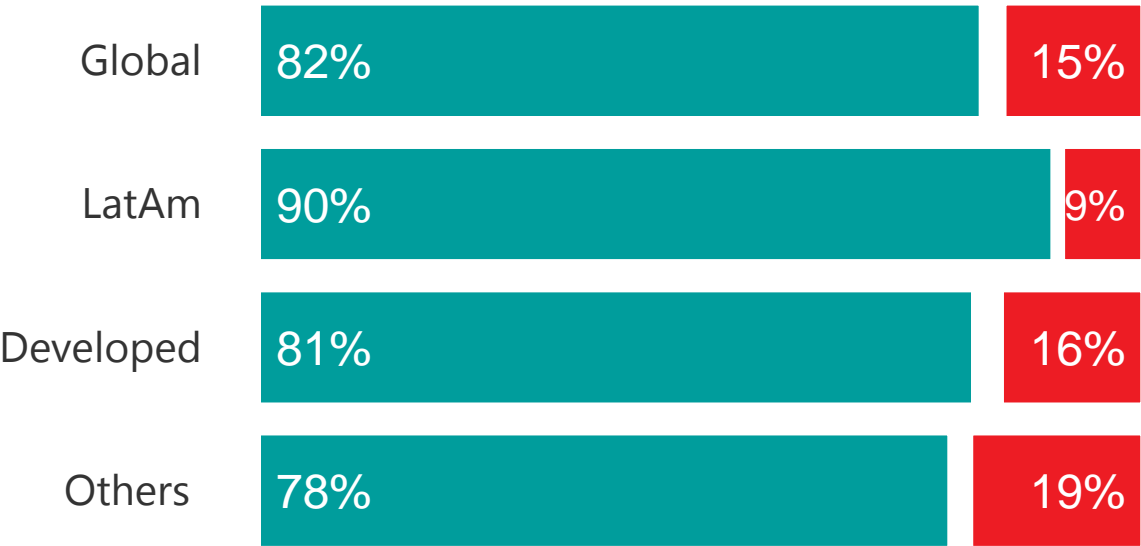

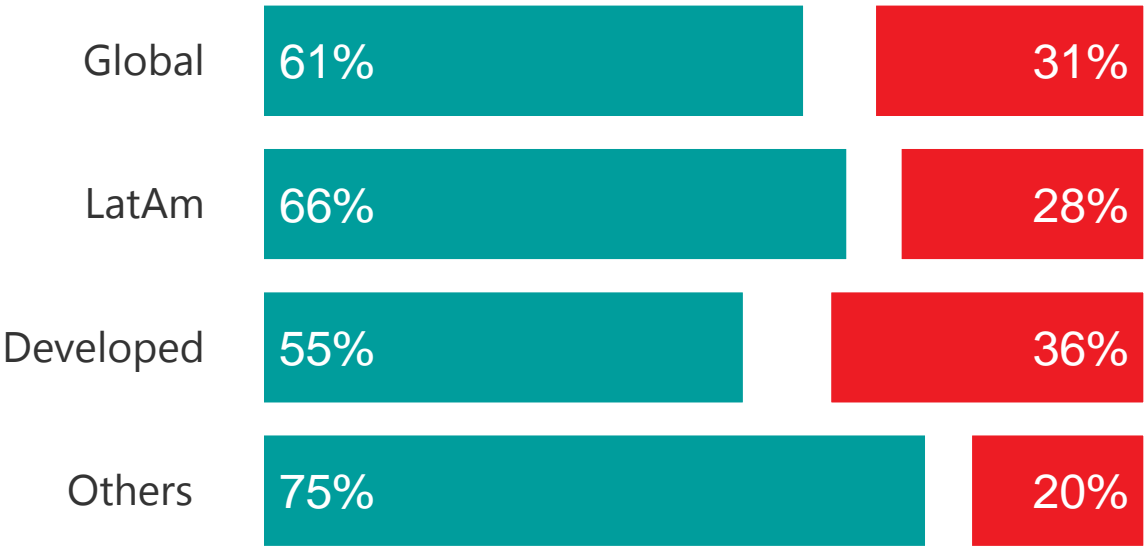

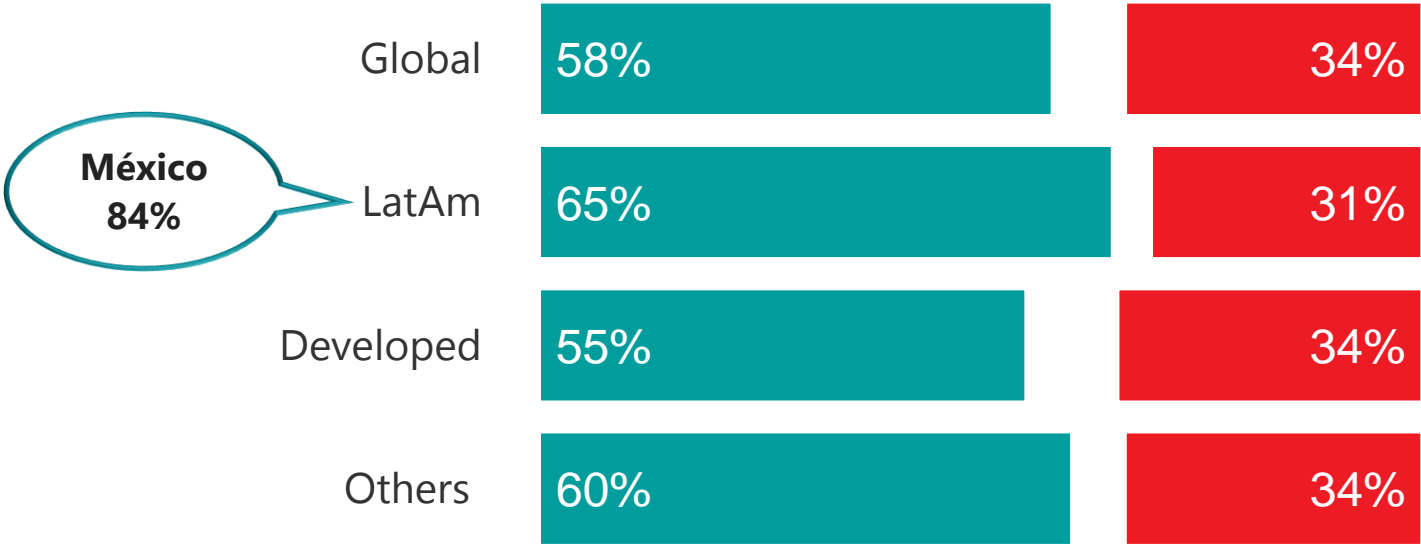

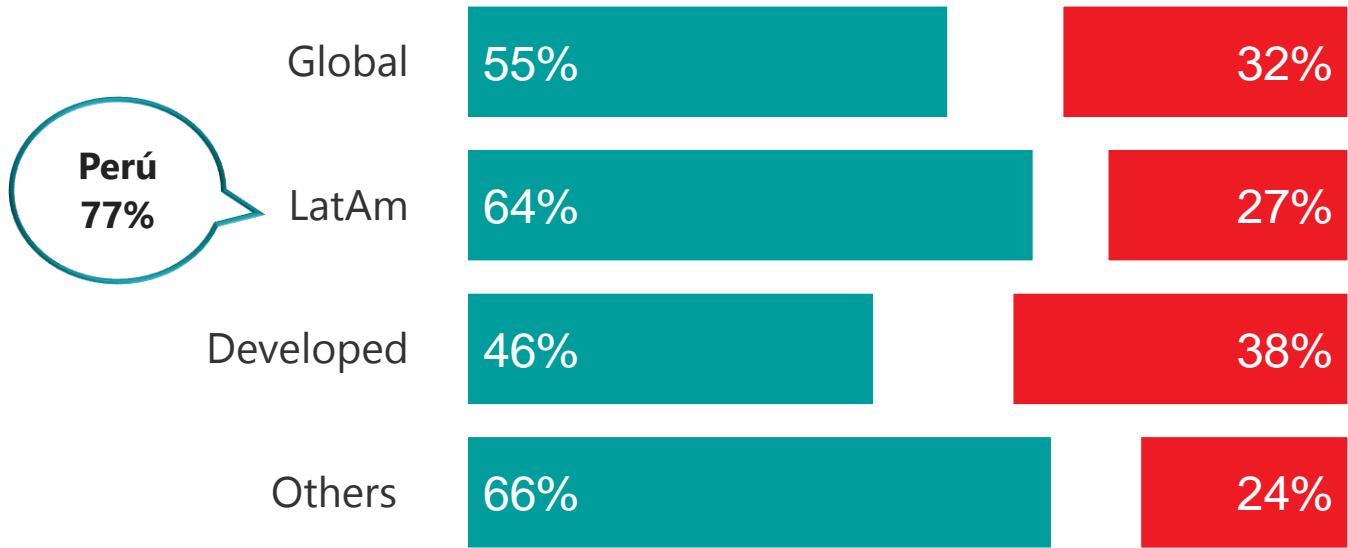
- **Latinos are not satisfied with their standard of living and they are very critical about their governments; due to crime, corruption and the poor quality of public services.**

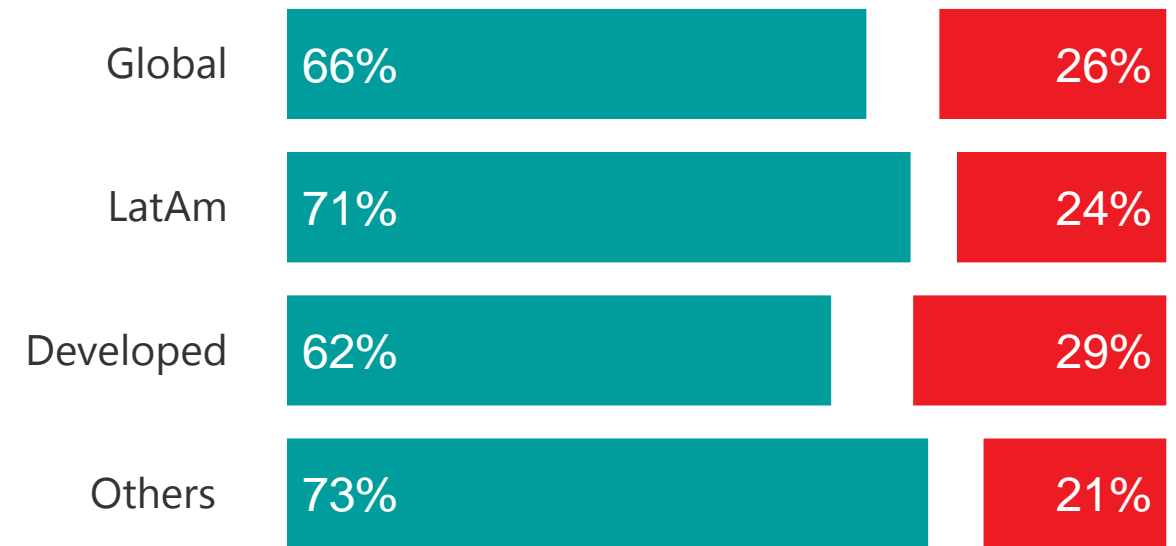

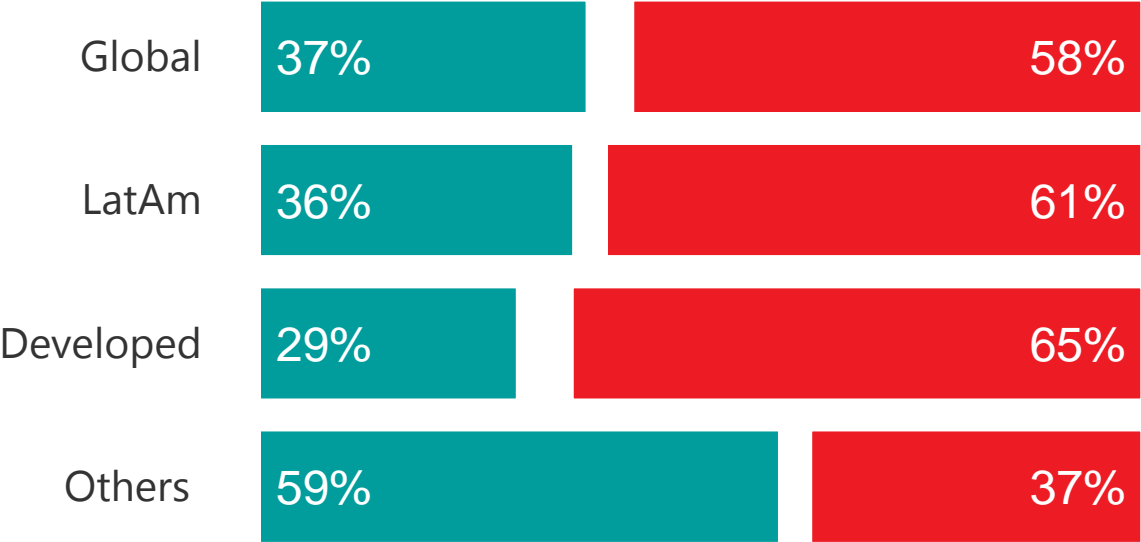

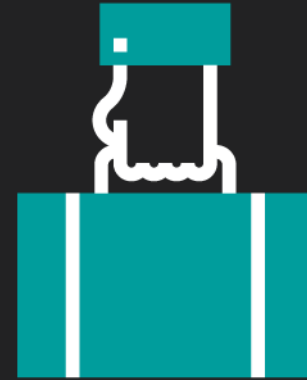




# World and Society insights

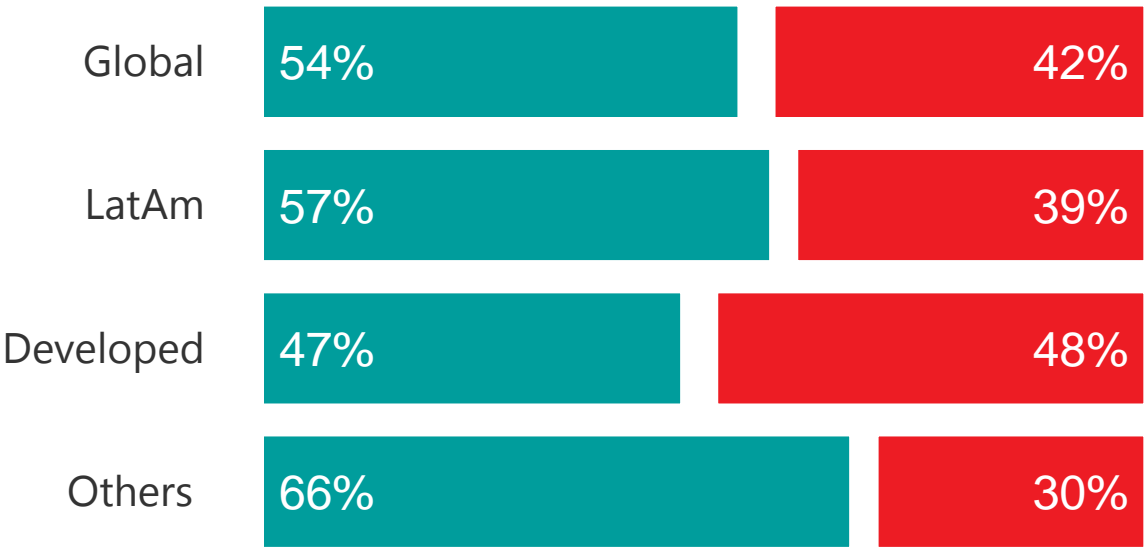

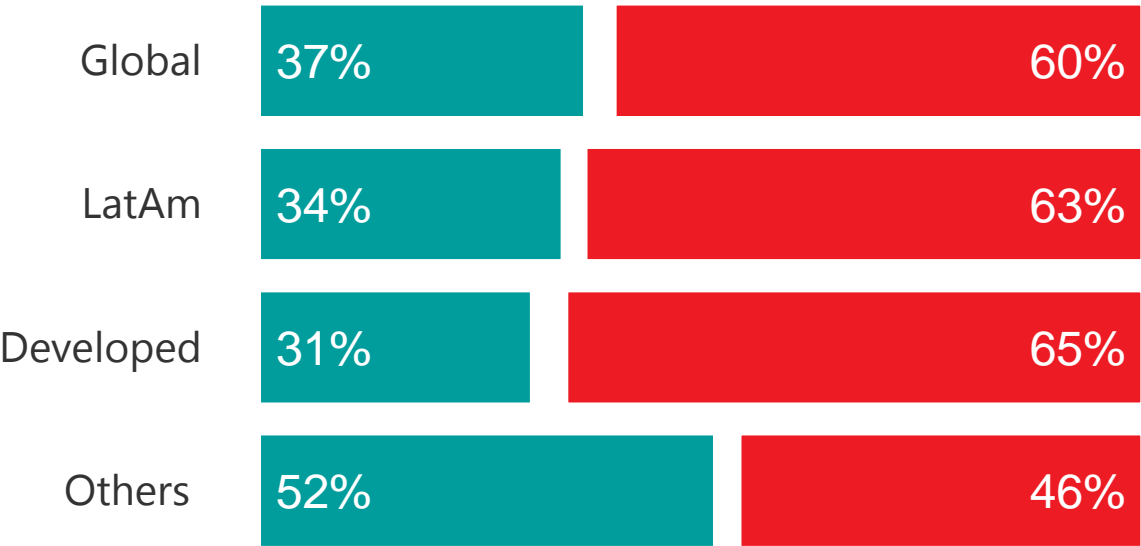

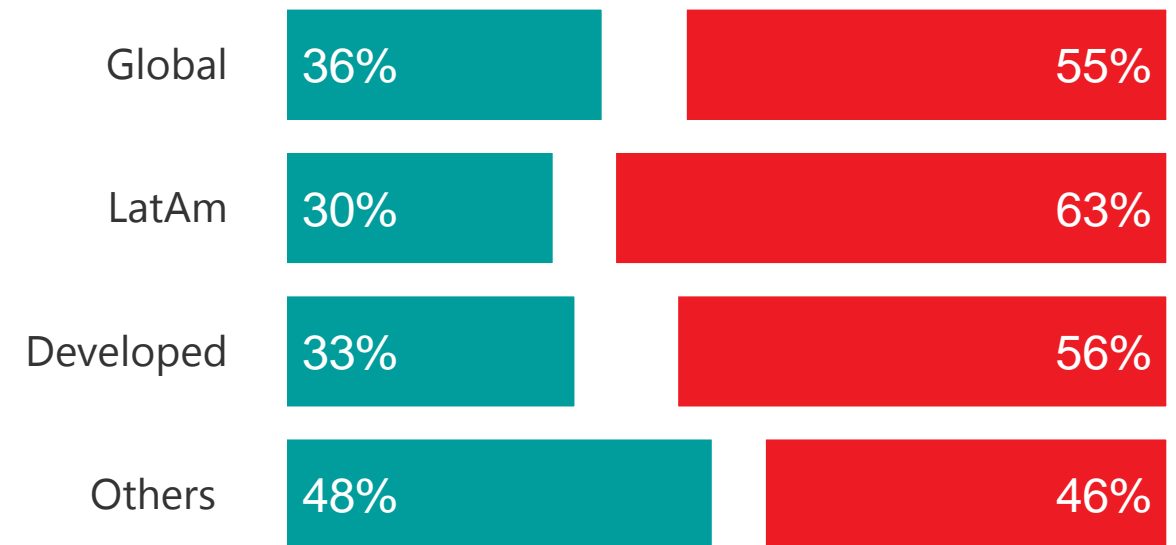
# Two out of three Latin Americans do not trust their governments. This distrust is higher than in other parts of the world.

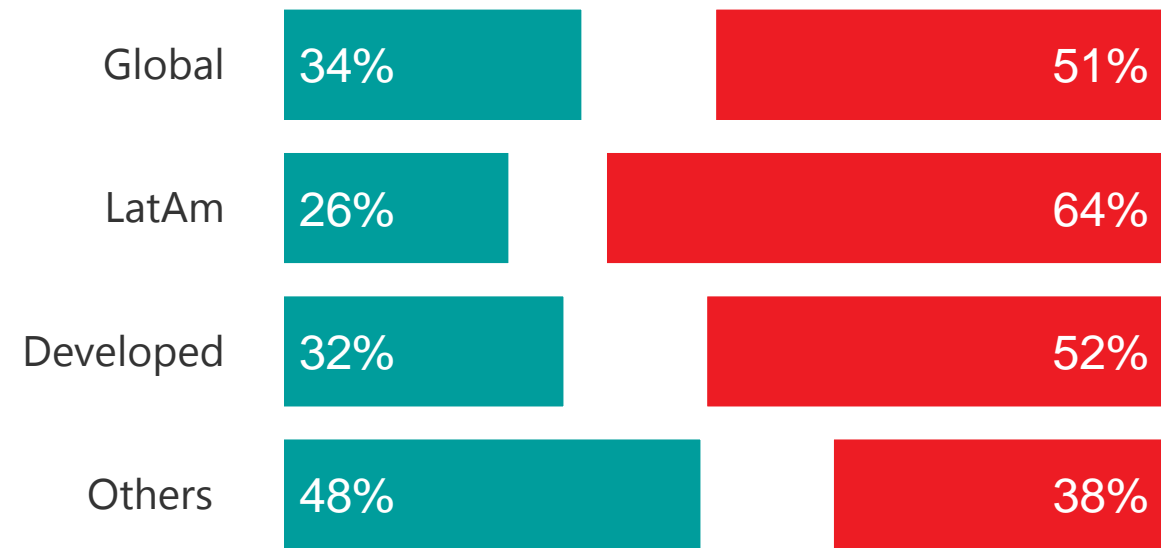

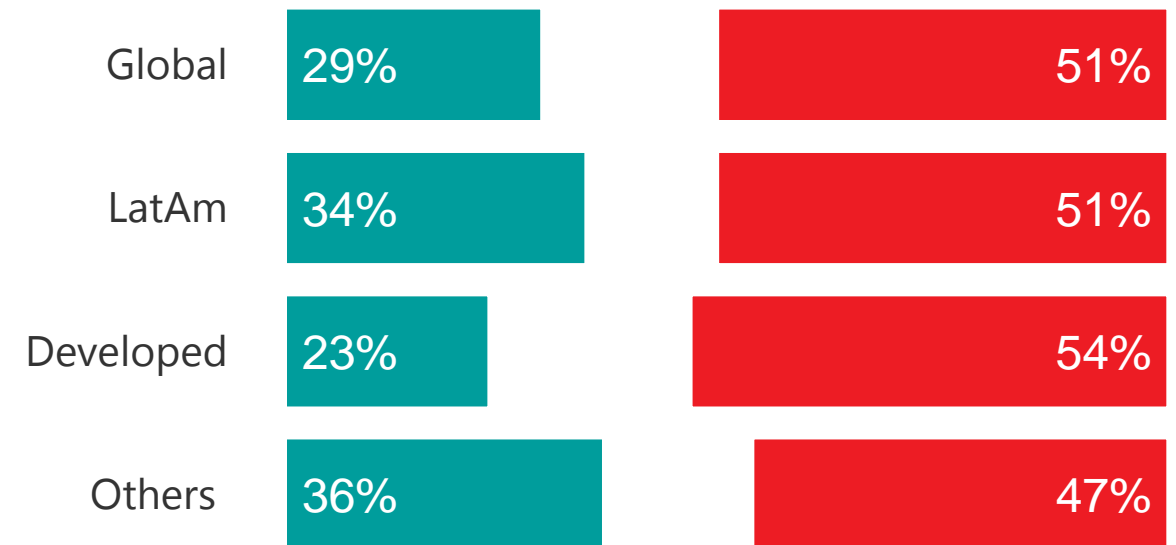

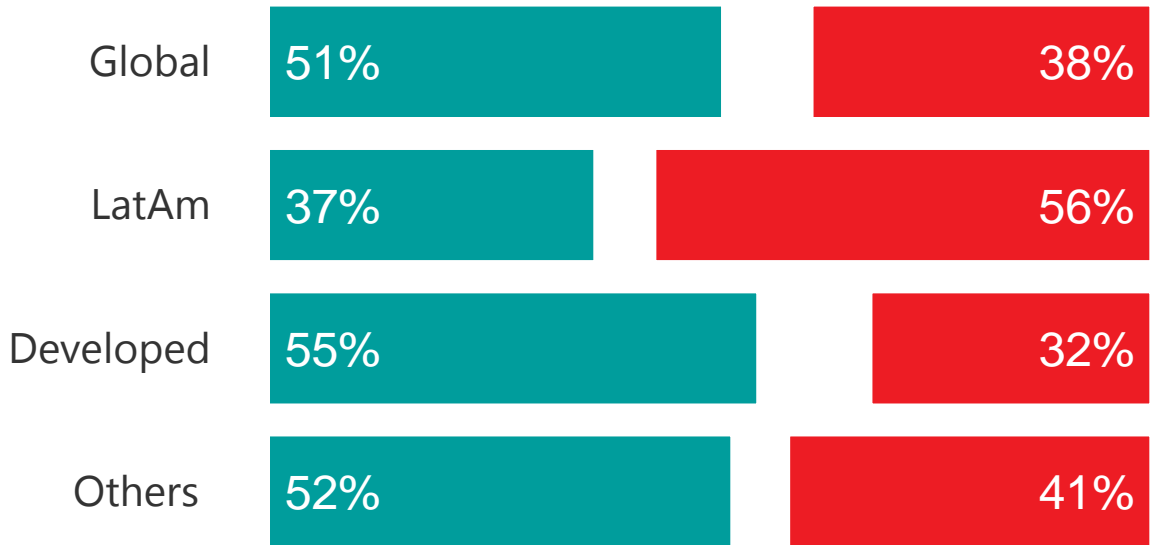

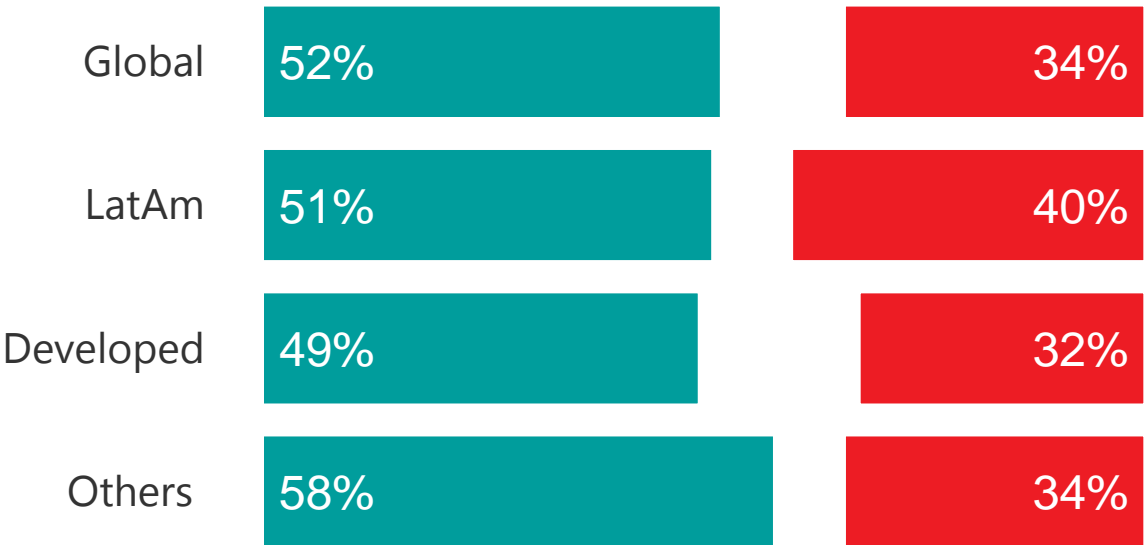

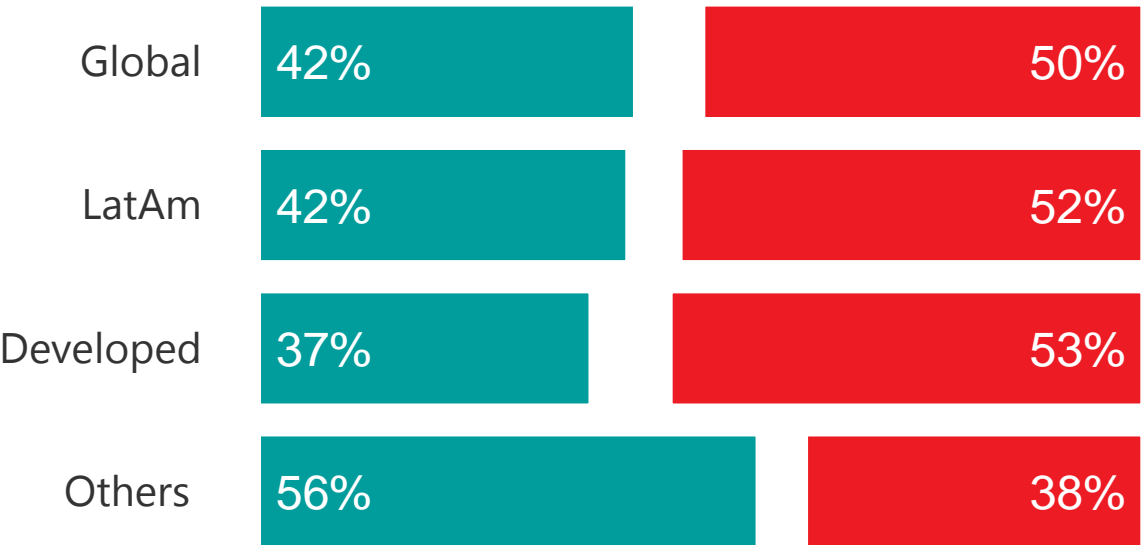

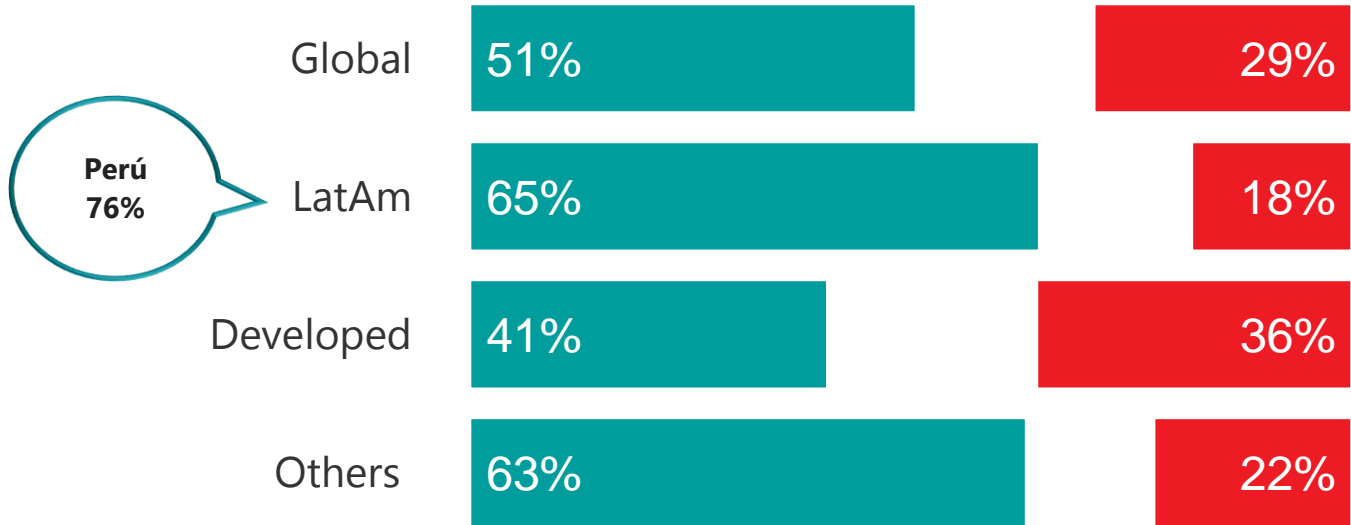

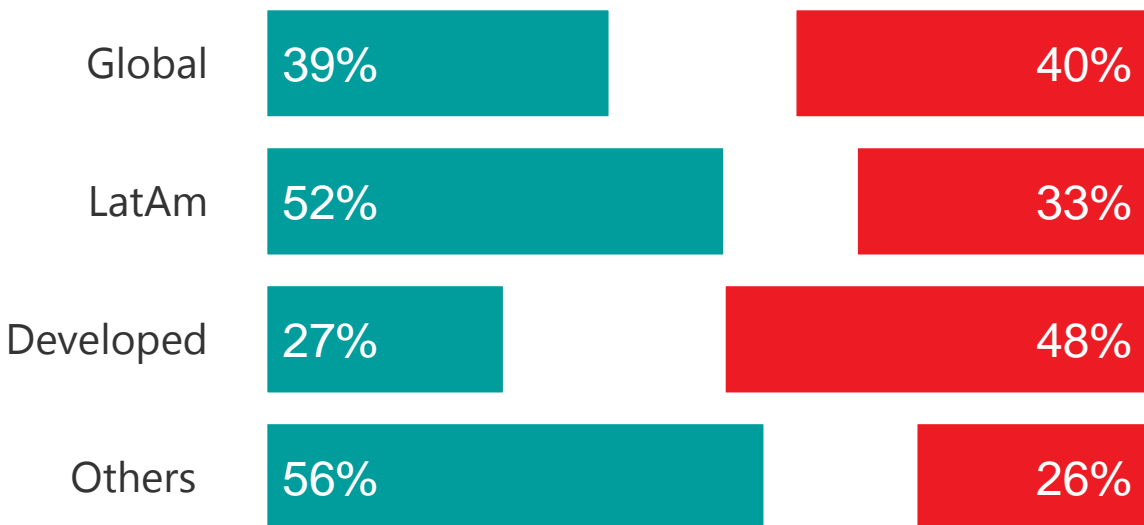

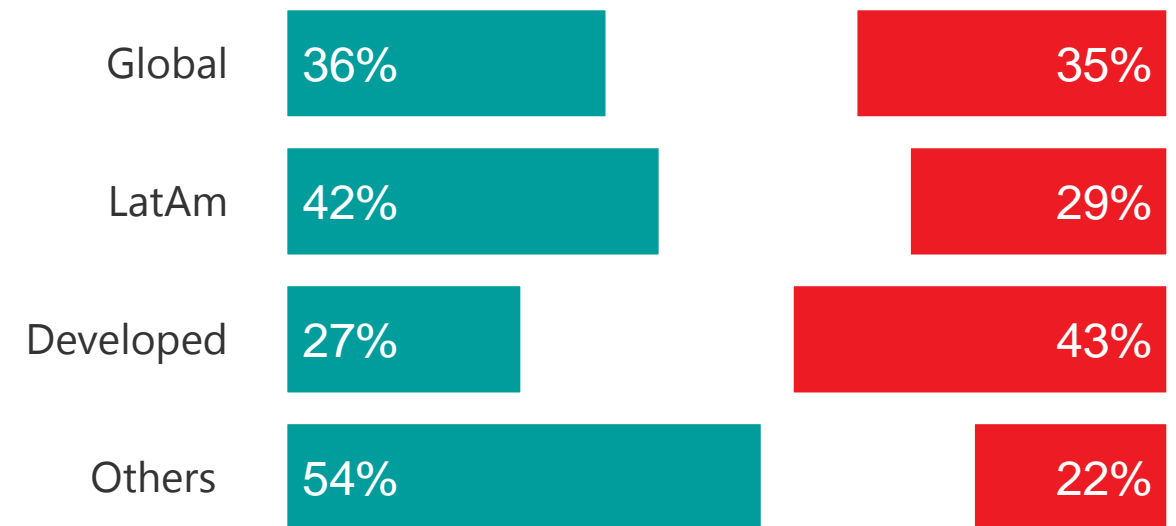

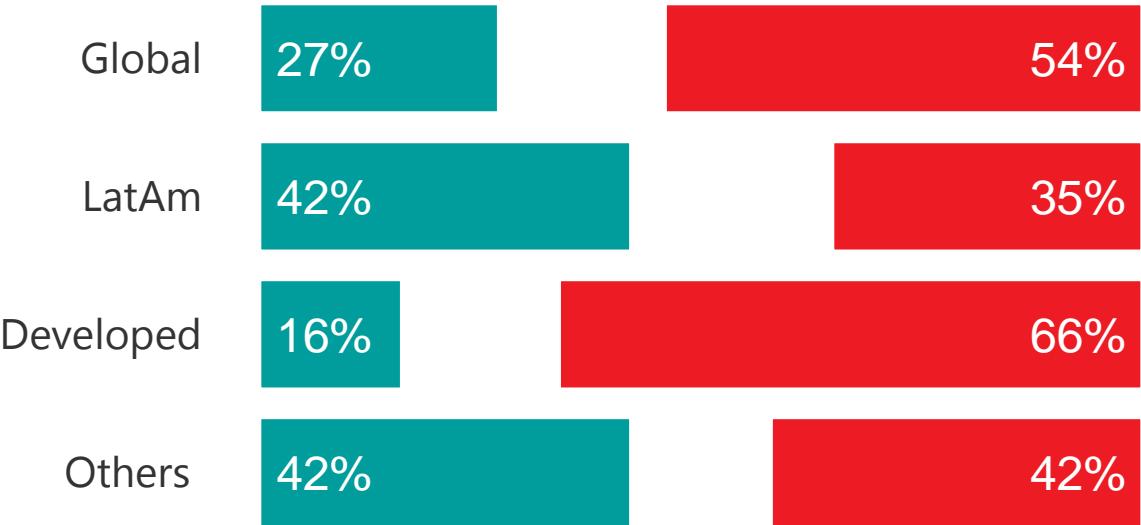

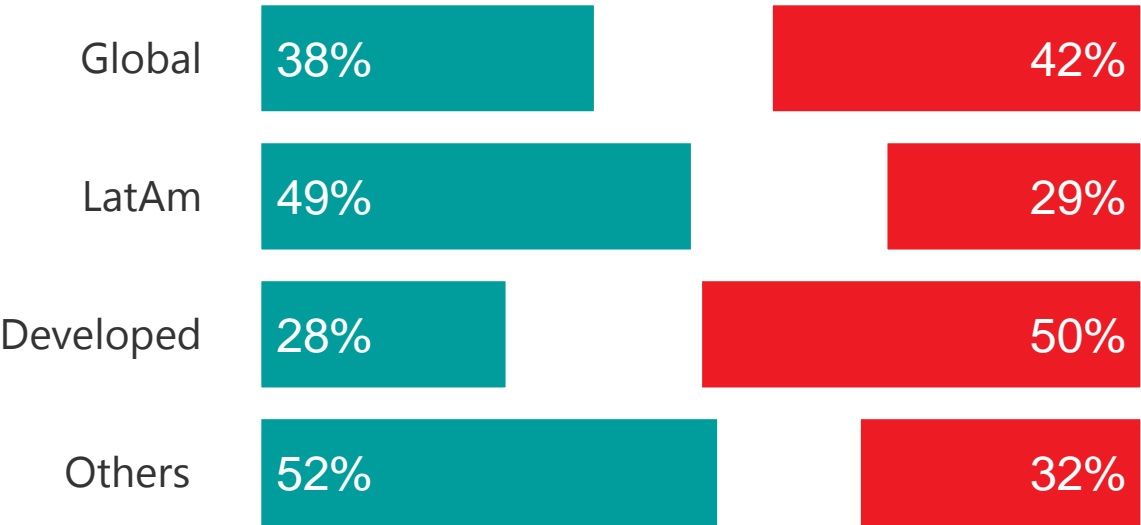

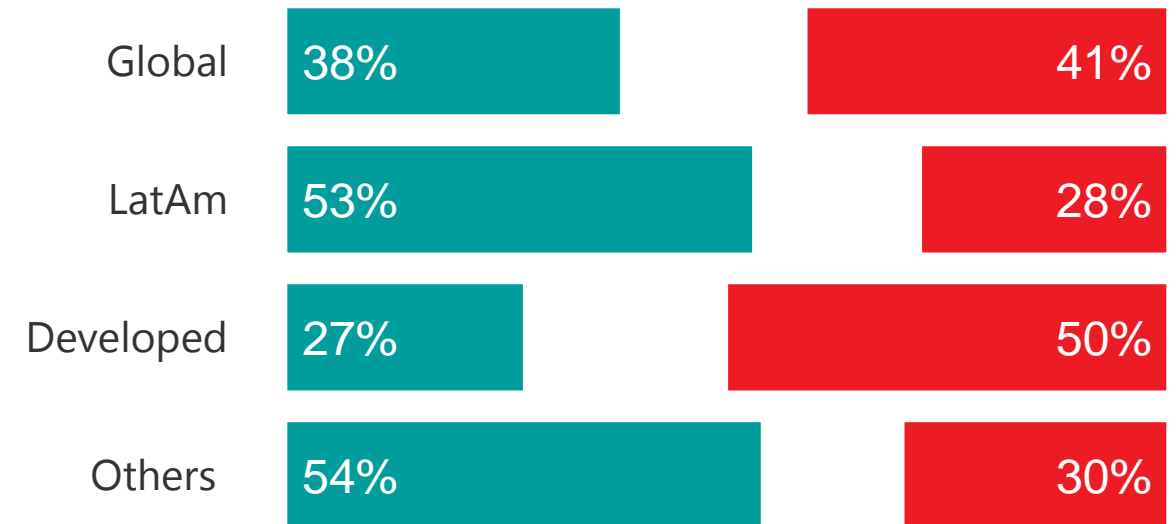
