This is all occurring as global energy diversification continues in response to the threat of climate change and a focus by investors and corporations on ESG (environmental, social and governance) principles. Energy producing countries stand to benefit from the push to toward "net zero" greenhouse gas emissions, while still acting as safe, reliable and ethical suppliers of the world's energy needs. The question has shifted from whether energy diversification will occur to when it will occur, and how it will be achieved and paid for.
