

Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling his job as President (previously president-elect)?





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









What impact do you think the plan will have on Americans in general ...






TOKYO OLYMPICS



Slight majority of Americans think the Tokyo Olympics should go ahead


The Olympics should go ahead in 2021, even if the COVID pandemic isn't over yet
