

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

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

Concern about the Delta variant is up, but less so among those least likely to get the vaccine


Percent extremely/very concerned about the Delta variant...






Proposed measures to promote the vaccine have little impact on the unvaccinated

Meanwhile, vaccinated America blames the unvaccinated for the Delta surge; unvaccinated America blames everyone else



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






Week to week swings in consumer sentiment
