

Total Approve




Total Disapprove

Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling his job as president? (previously 'president-elect')








Half of Americans do not agree with how Joe Biden is handling Ukraine and Russia

Most Americans do not support direct military action or support for Ukraine, but do support economic pressure and diplomatic efforts





While large majority are satisfied with their jobs, numerous warning signs of ongoing strain remain








Even with all the measures being taken we will never be able to fully stop the spread of COVID-19 and variants








