Reuters/Ipsos Core Political Data

These are findings from a Reuters/Ipsos poll conducted **August 21-24, 2026**. A sample of **1,215** Americans ages 18+ were interviewed online for this survey using the probability-based KnowledgePanel®.

This included **357** Democrats, **324** Republicans, and **534** independents/Other.

The precision of the Reuters/Ipsos Core Political is measured using a margin of error which includes the design effect error. In this case, the poll has a margin of error of plus or minus the following percentage points:

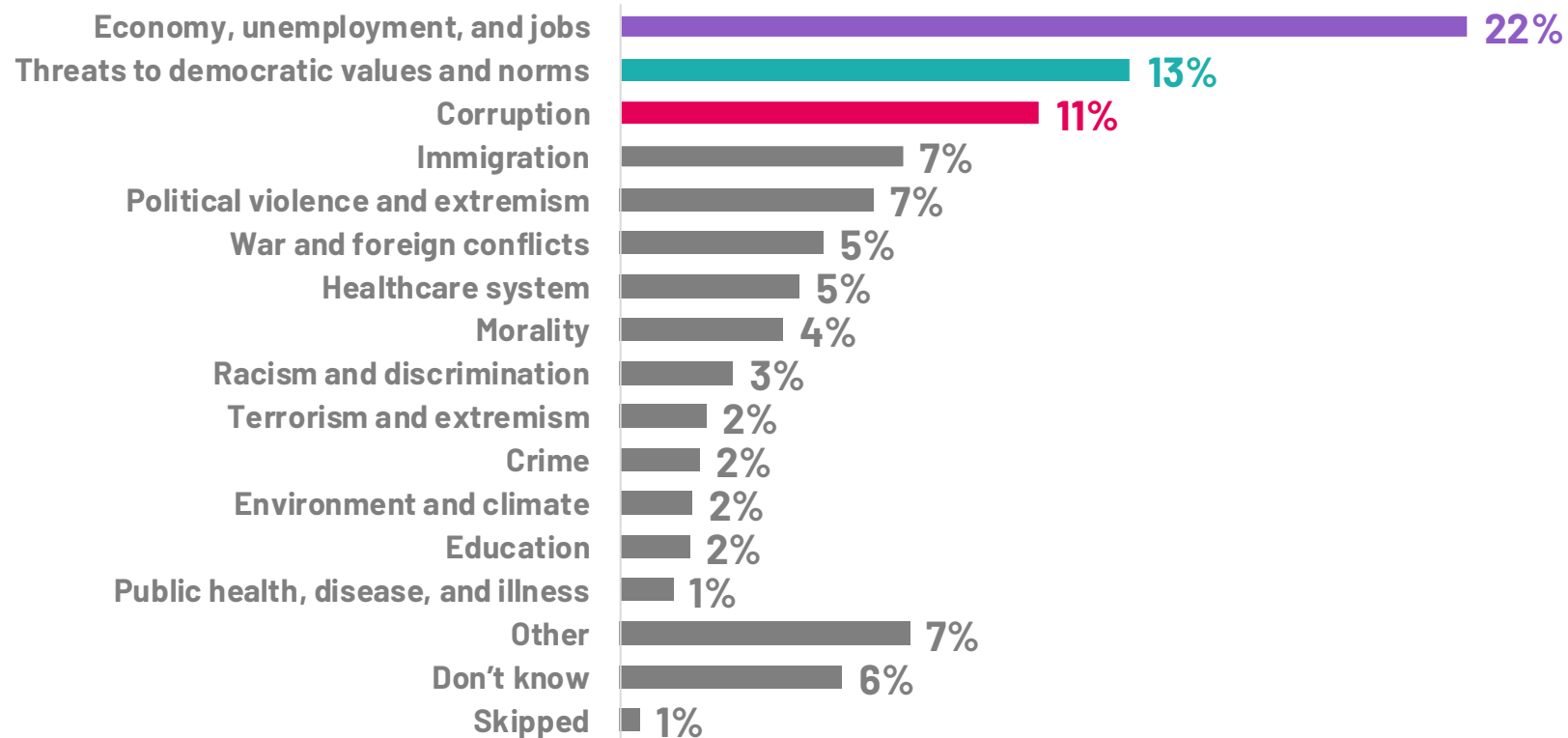
2.9 for All Adults, **5.3** for Democrats, **5.6** for Republicans, and **4.4** for independents.

The data from this survey was weighted to the U.S. current population data using gender by age, race/ethnicity, education, Census region, metropolitan status, household income, political party affiliation, and 2024 presidential vote choice.

All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error and measurement error. Where figures do not sum to 100, this is because of rounding. See page 8 for full methodology.

In your opinion, what is the most important problem facing the U.S. today?



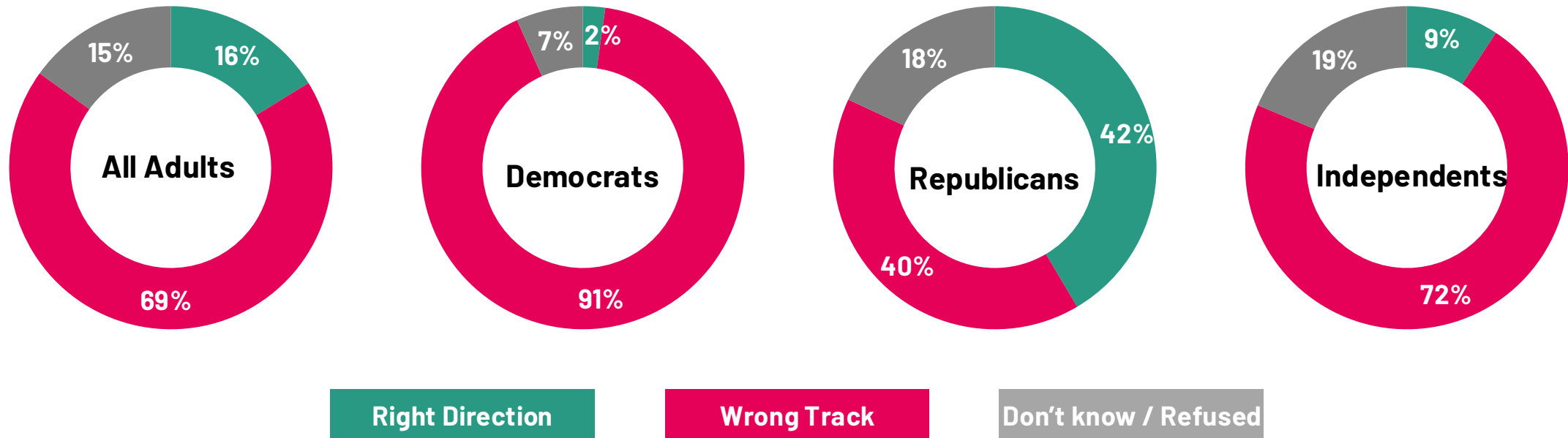

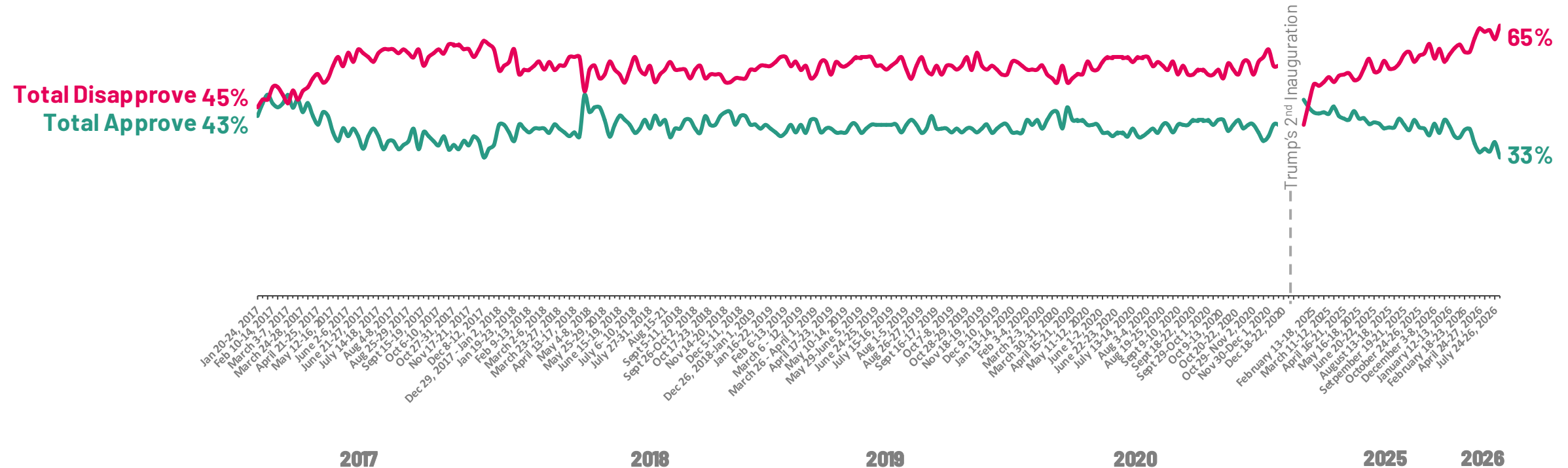
Generally speaking, would you say things in this country are heading in the right direction, or are they off on the wrong track?

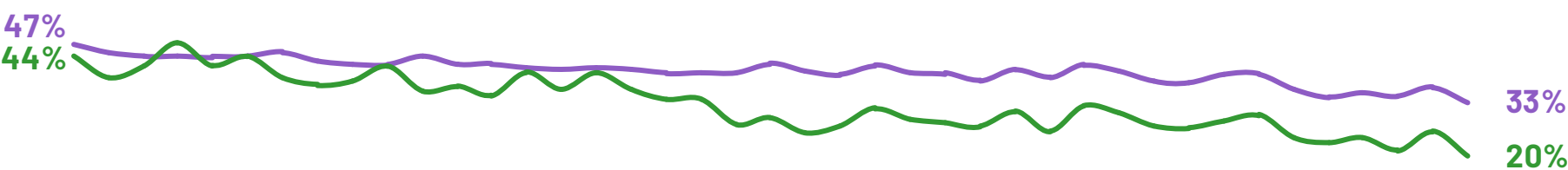

Methodology

Methodology

This Ipsos poll was conducted August 21-24, 2026, by Ipsos in partnership with Reuters, using the probability-based KnowledgePanel®. This poll is based on a nationally representative probability sample of 1,215 general population adults aged 18 or older.

The study was conducted in English. The data were weighted to adjust for gender by age, race and ethnicity, census region, metropolitan status, education, household income, 2024 vote choice and political party identification. Political party identification benchmarks are from the 2026 National Public Opinion Reference Survey (NPORS). The demographic benchmarks came from the 2025 March supplement of the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey (CPS).

- Gender (Male, Female) by Age (18-29, 30-44, 45-59 and 60+)
- Race/Hispanic Ethnicity (White Non-Hispanic, Black Non-Hispanic, Other, Non-Hispanic, Hispanic, 2+ Races, Non-Hispanic)
- Education (Less than High School, High School, Some College, Bachelor's degree, Master's degree or higher)
- Census Region (Northeast, Midwest, South, West)
- Metropolitan status (Metro, non-Metro)
- Household Income (Under \$25,000, \$25,000-\$49,999, \$50,000-\$74,999, \$75,000-\$99,999, \$100,000-\$149,999, \$150,000+)
- 2024 Vote Choice (Trump, Harris, Another candidate, Did not vote)
- Political Party ID (Democrat, Lean Democrat, Republican, Lean Republican, Independent/Something else)

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 2.9 percentage points at the 95% confidence level, for results based on the entire sample of adults. The margin of sampling error takes into account the design effect, which was 1.07. The margin of sampling error is higher and varies for results based on sub-samples. In our reporting of the findings, percentage points are rounded off to the nearest whole number. As a result, percentages in a given table column may total slightly higher or lower than 100%. In questions that permit multiple responses, columns may total substantially more than 100%, depending on the number of different responses offered by each respondent.
