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





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

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
People's expectations of the NHS are mostly thought to be realistic, though a significant minority say they are not



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They think taxes should increase to maintain the current level




*Note this was a split sample question – half asked with wording 'Increase taxes', half 'I would be willing to pay more taxes'



Thinking about the treatments and services that are available on the NHS, which of these statements most closely matches your opinion?







On this screen are two statements representing either ends of a scale from 1 to 10. Please give me a number between 1 and 10 to show where your view fits on this scale.







They think they should be consulted on decisions about the NHS


