To increase the amount of funding available for adult social care in the United Kingdom, some people suggest increasing each rate of income tax.

If:

- The basic rate of income tax, which applies to anyone with an annual income over £11,500, increased from 20 pence in every pound to 21 pence in every pound
- The higher rate of income tax, which applies to income over £45,000 [IF ENGLAND, WALES OR NORTHERN IRELAND] / £43,000 [IF SCOTLAND], increased from 40 pence in every pound to 43 pence in every pound
- The additional rate of income tax, which applies to income over £150,000, increased from 45 pence in every pound to 50 pence in every pound
