How are the Socio-Economic groupings defined?



Socio-Economic groups in emma™ are defined according to the Education level, Personal or Household Income, Occupation and Home Status of a respondent.

Social Grade Scores

For each of the above demographic factors, the respondent is given a score and scores are then tallied to allocate the respondent to one of five equal-sized groupings for analysis purposes.

Education Score

The Education Score is based on the respondent's answers on "Highest level of education achieved" and "Currently Studying".

Scores are applied as per the following table:

Income Score

The Income Score is calculated using one of two methods, applying scores to answers provided by survey respondents to questions on "Work Situation" and "Personal or Household Income".

Calculation Option 1

If respondent is a full time worker, a score is applied according to the income bracket selected in Table 4.
