Ipsos MORI Young People Omnibus Survey 2018 The Sutton Trust Topline Results July 2018

- 2,381 interviews conducted and processed among school children aged 11-16 in schools in England and Wales.
- Pupils were selected from a random sample of schools drawn from the Edubase database (a database of schools maintained by the Department for Education).
- Pupils either completed online or filled in questionnaires at school between 5th February 25th May 2018.
- Results are based on ALL participating pupils, unless otherwise stated.
- Data are weighted by school year, gender and region to match the profile of school children across England and Wales.
- An asterisk (*) represents a value of less than half a per cent, but not zero
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this is due to multiple responses or computer rounding.

Trend data from previous Sutton Trust Young People Omnibus surveys has been included where applicable.
