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#### Methodology

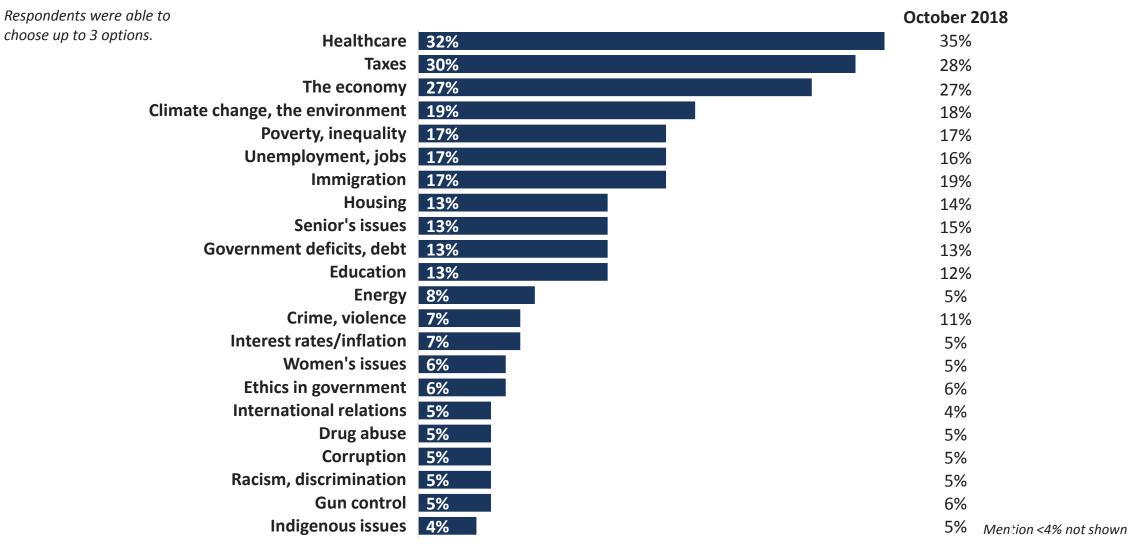
- These are the findings of an Ipsos poll conducted on exclusively for Global News
- A sample of n= 2,001 Canadians aged 18+ was sampled via the Ipsos I-Say panel and non-panel sources from December 7 to 12, 2018.
- Quotas and weighting were employed to ensure that the sample reflects that of the Canadian population by region, age and gender according to Canadian census information.
- The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case the results of the poll are considered accurate to within +/- 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what the results would be had all Canadian adults been polled.





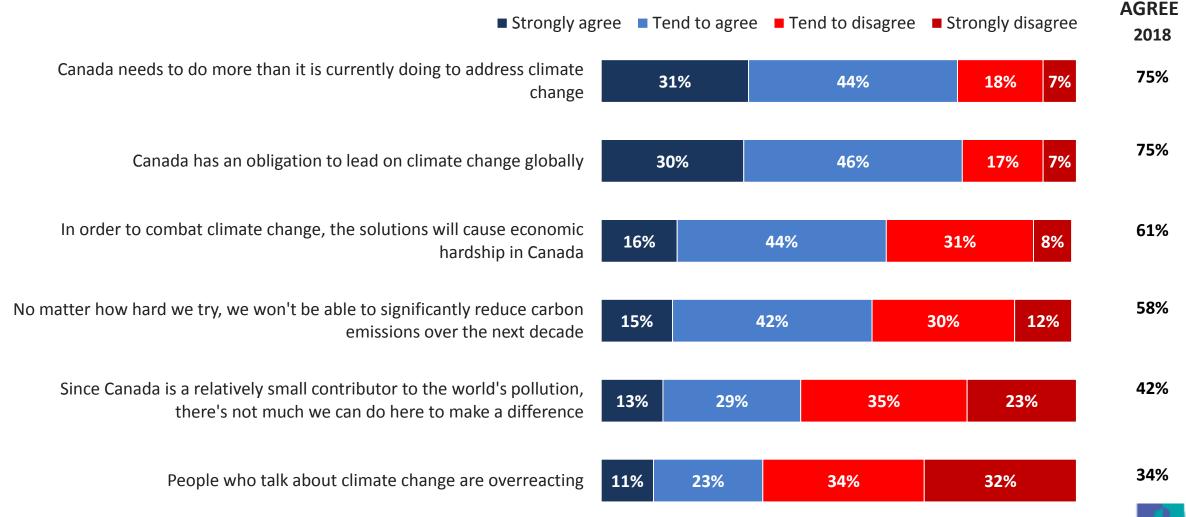

## Healthcare, taxes and the economy continue to be the top issues that Canadians say will determine how they vote in the 2019 federal election.



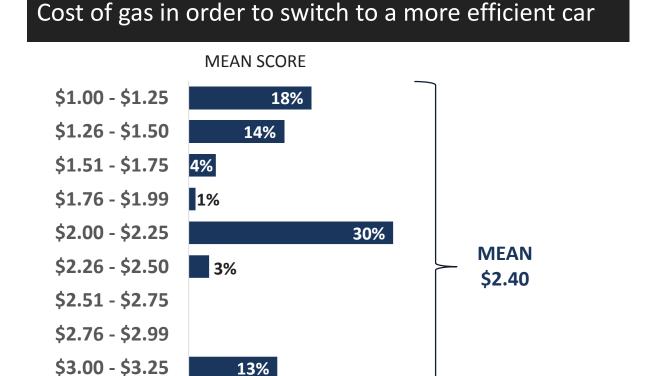


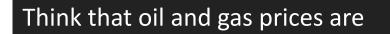
## Most Canadians believe that their country needs to do more to address climate change, and that Canada has an obligation to lead on this issue globally.

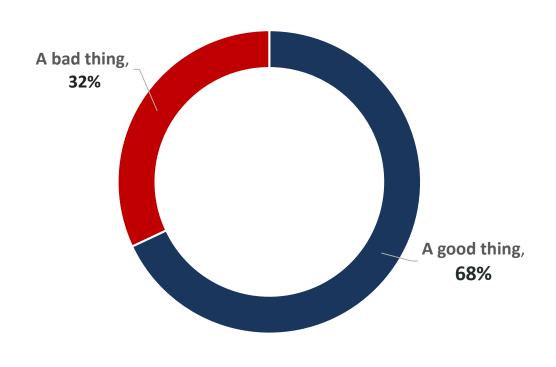
