
Methodology

- These are the findings of an Ipsos poll conducted on exclusively for Global News
- A sample of n= 2,001 Canadians aged 18+ was sampled via the Ipsos I-Say panel and non-panel sources from December 7 to 12, 2018.
- Quotas and weighting were employed to ensure that the sample reflects that of the Canadian population by region, age and gender according to Canadian census information.
- The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case the results of the poll are considered accurate to within +/- 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what the results would be had all Canadian adults been polled.




Immigration

Canadians are split in terms of their views on the impact that immigration has had on Canada, but lean more positive than negative.






There is a growing belief (44%, up 8 points) that there are too many immigrants in Canada. Six in ten (57%, up 5 points) say immigration has put to much strain on public services.



One in three (34%) Canadians say we should closer our borders to refugees entirely.
