Technical Details

Ipsos MORI interviewed a representative sample of 1,084 adults aged 16-75 across Great Britain. Interviews were conducted online on 22-26 February 2019. Data are weighted to match the profile of the population. Questions were answered by all respondents unless otherwise stated.

Where percentages do not sum to 100 this may be due to computer rounding, the exclusion of "don't know" categories, or multiple answers. An asterisk (*) denotes any value of less than half a per cent.
