

**Ipsos MORI Political Pulse
Topline Results**

16th October 2019

Fieldwork: 11th – 14th October 2019

Technical Details

Ipsos MORI interviewed a representative sample of 1,074 adults aged 18-75 across Great Britain. Interviews were conducted online: 11th – 14th October 2019. Data are weighted to match the profile of the population.

Where percentages do not sum to 100 this may be due to computer rounding, the exclusion of “don’t know” categories, or multiple answers. An asterisk (*) denotes any value of less than half a per cent.

Questions are asked of the total sample of n=1,074 unless otherwise stated.
