According to an Ipsos study in Spain on public opinion around the Coronavirus crisis

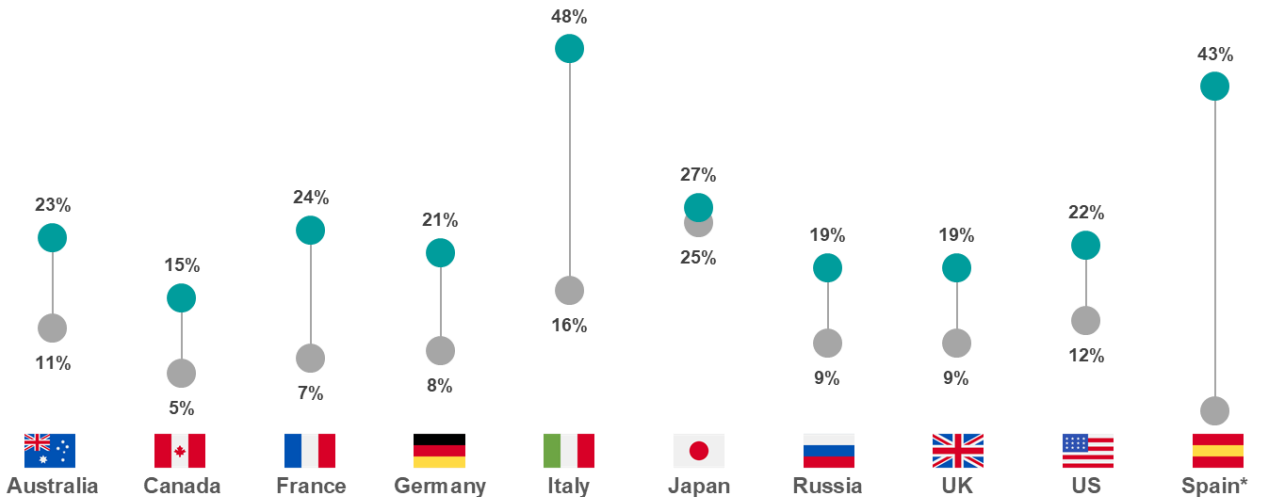

Spain ranks second of all countries in perceiving a high personal threat, behind only Italy. Both countries are suffering at the 'peaks' of the curve, where the number of affected people continues to grow at alarming rates every day.



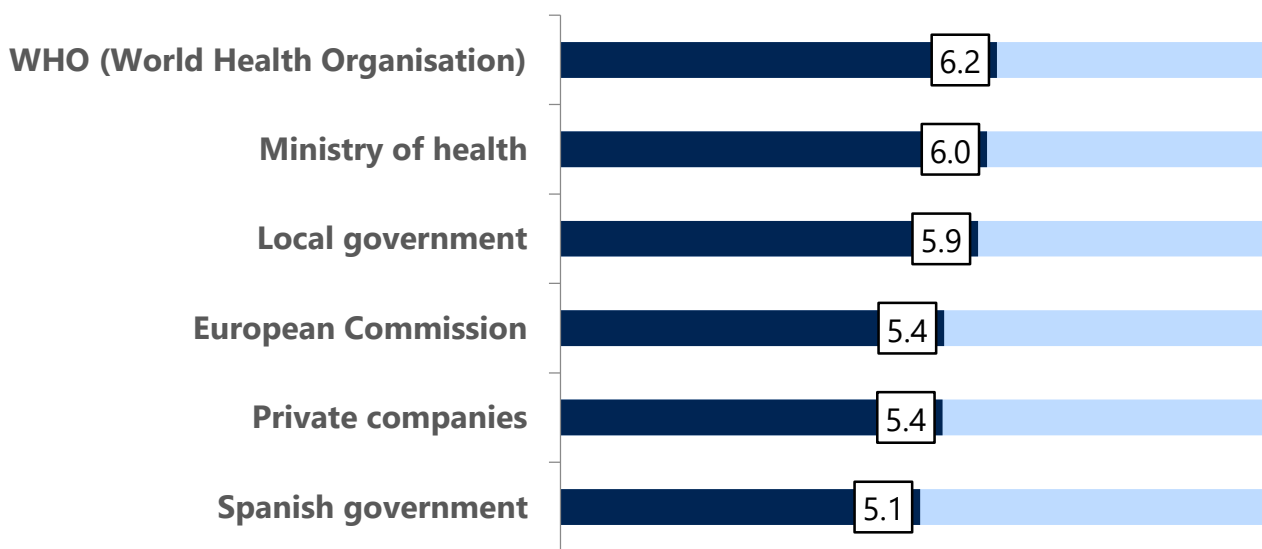

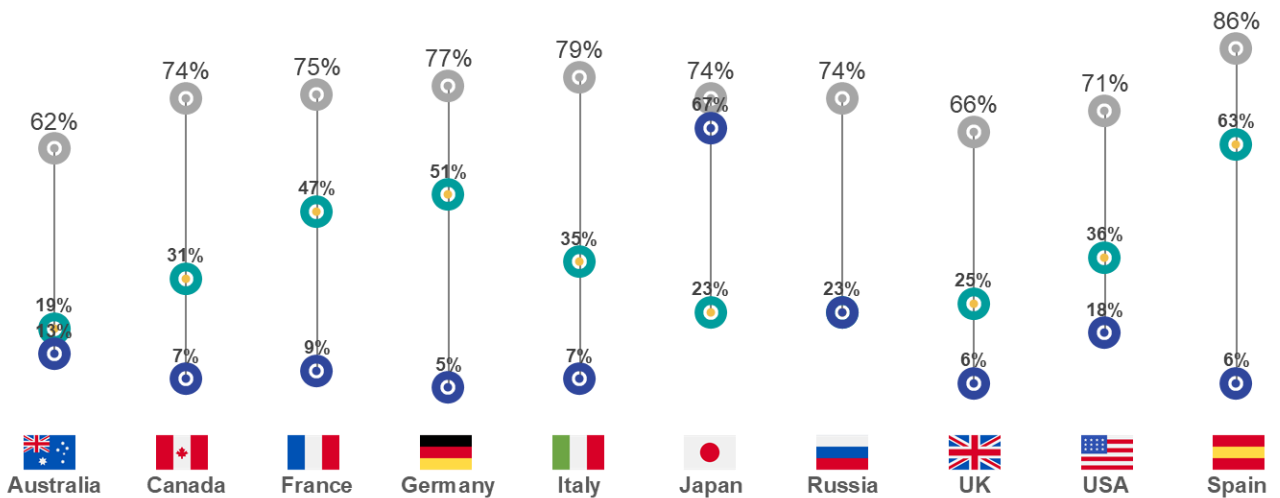
Spanish people will wash hands more and shake hands less, but they won't wear masks

According to an Ipsos study in Spain on public opinion around the Coronavirus crisis



Spain is the country that reports washing hands most and shaking hands least to tackle Covid-19. However, like the rest of Europeans, they don't choose to wear masks as a measure to avoid transmission of the virus.

● Wash hands more frequently ● Avoid shaking hands with others ● Wear a protective face mask



The measures that Spanish people have put into practice are those advised by official health bodies: wash hands frequently, cough into your elbow and use hand sanitiser.

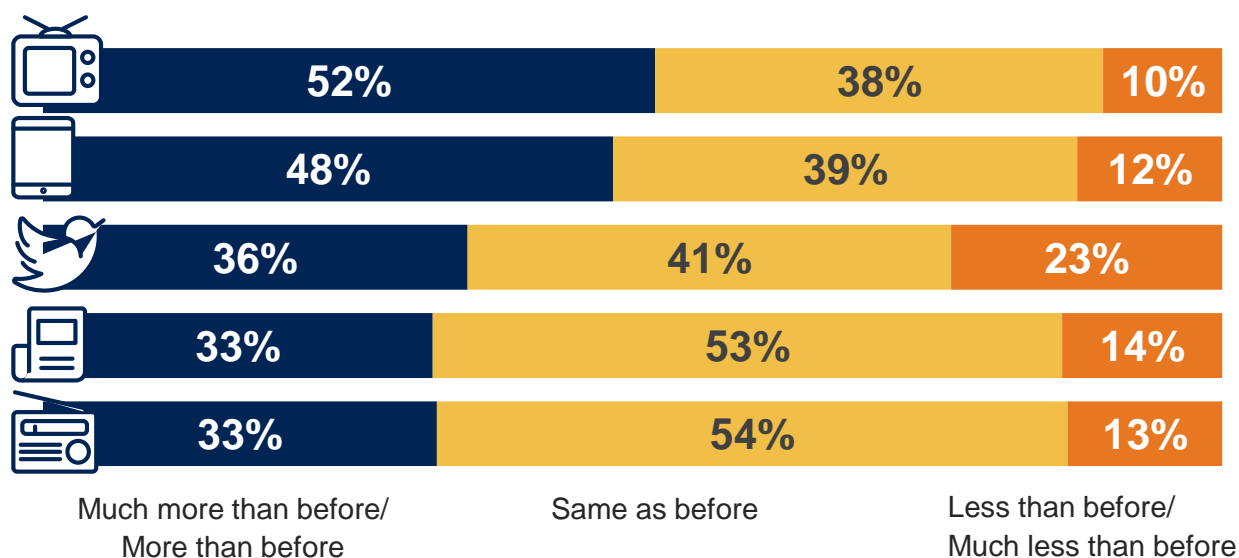

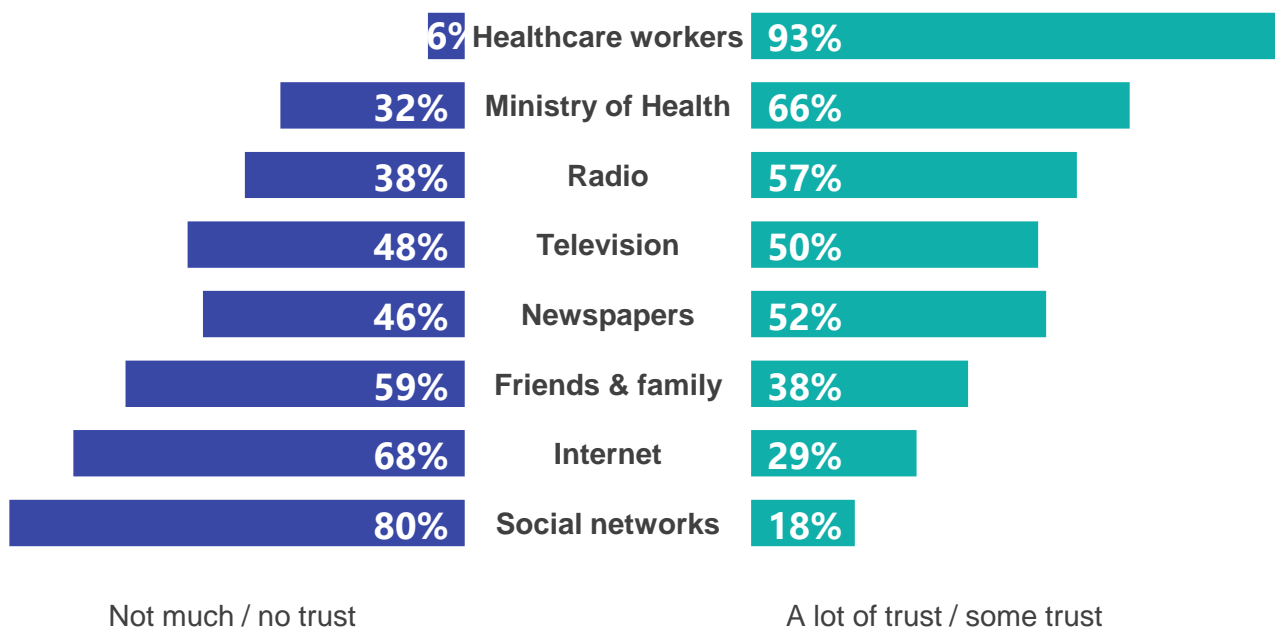
