

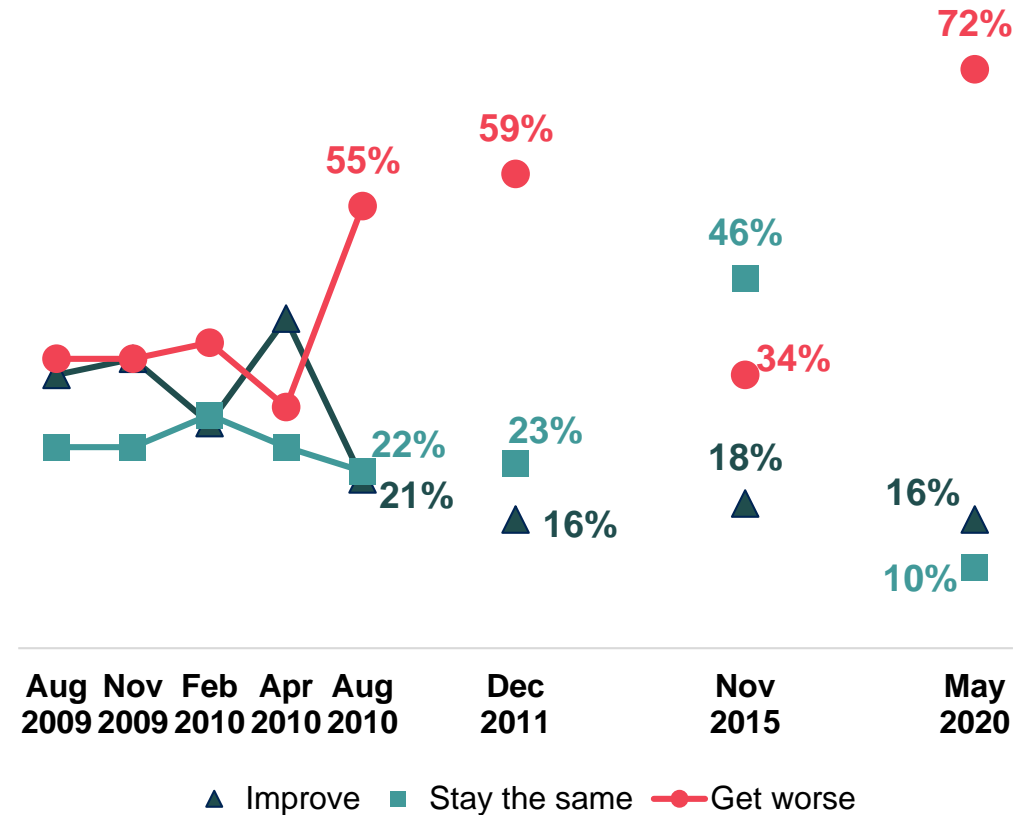
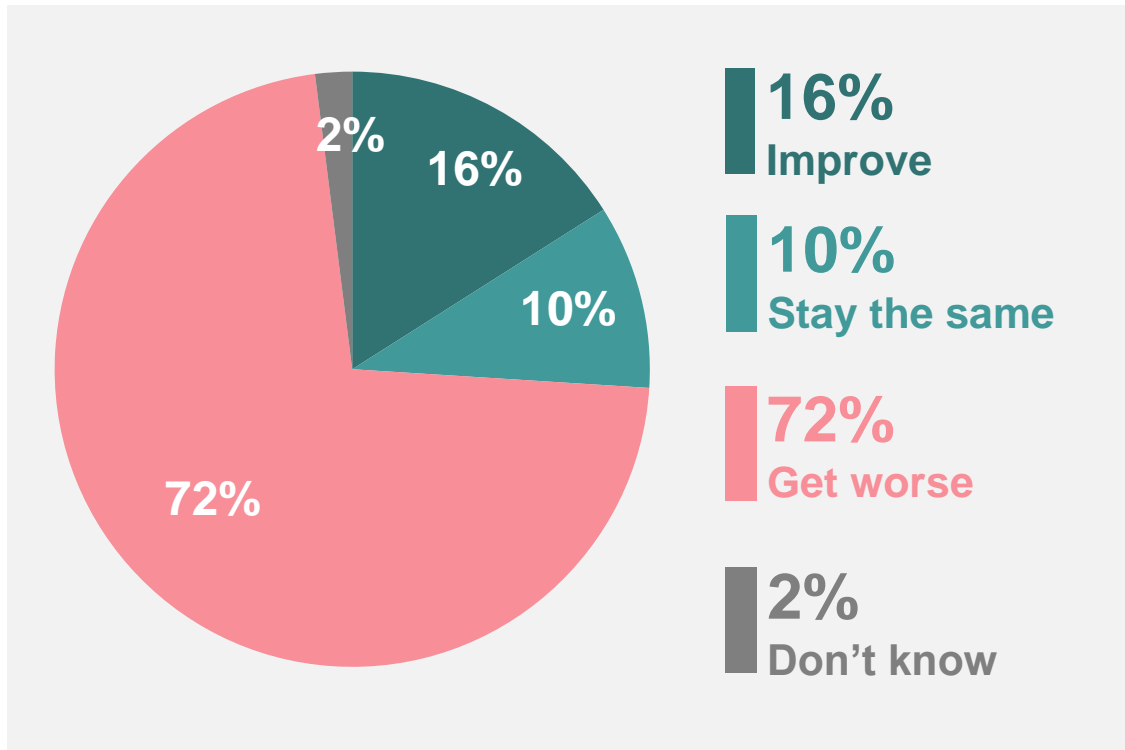

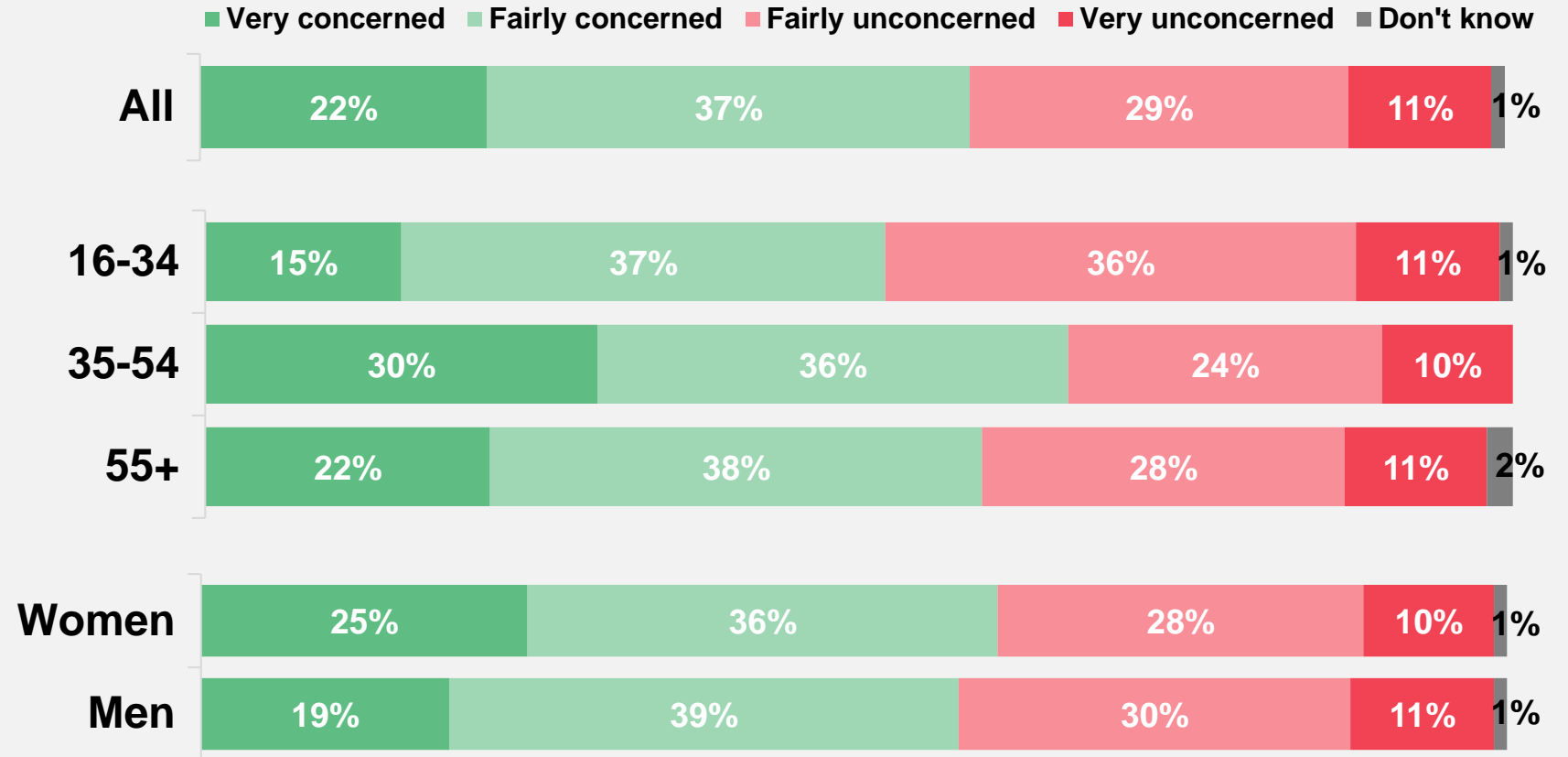

unconcerned

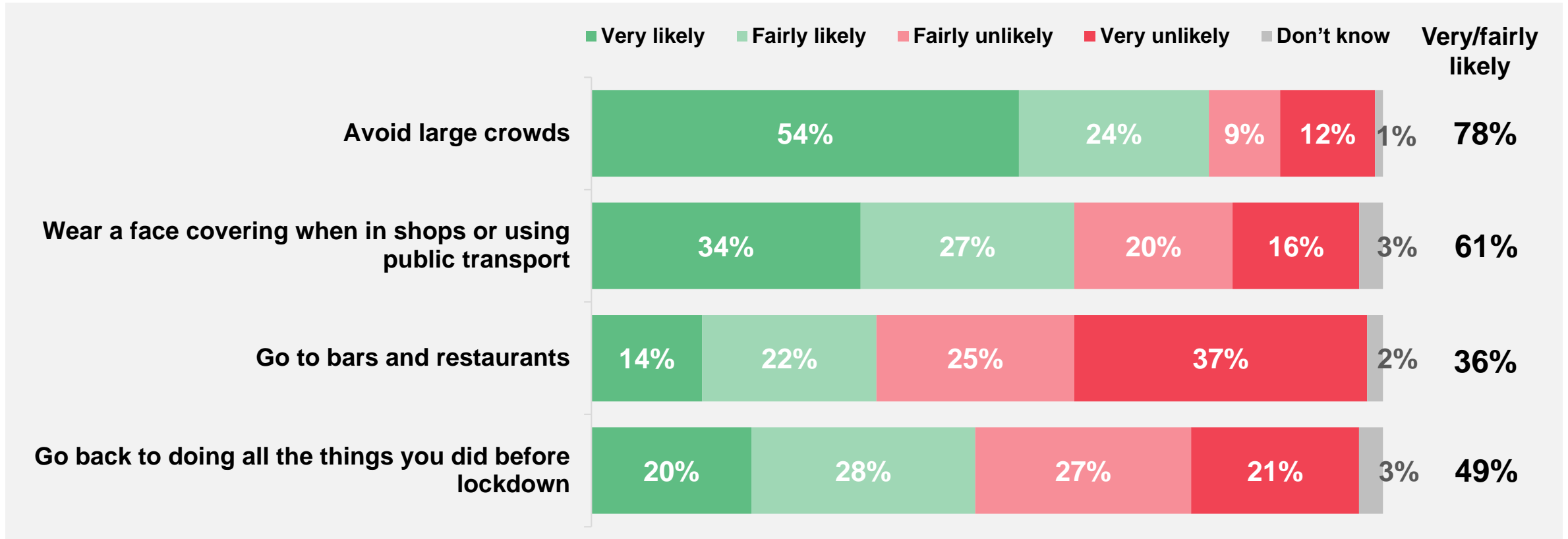

How likely or unlikely are you to do each of the following after the current lockdown restrictions are lifted?

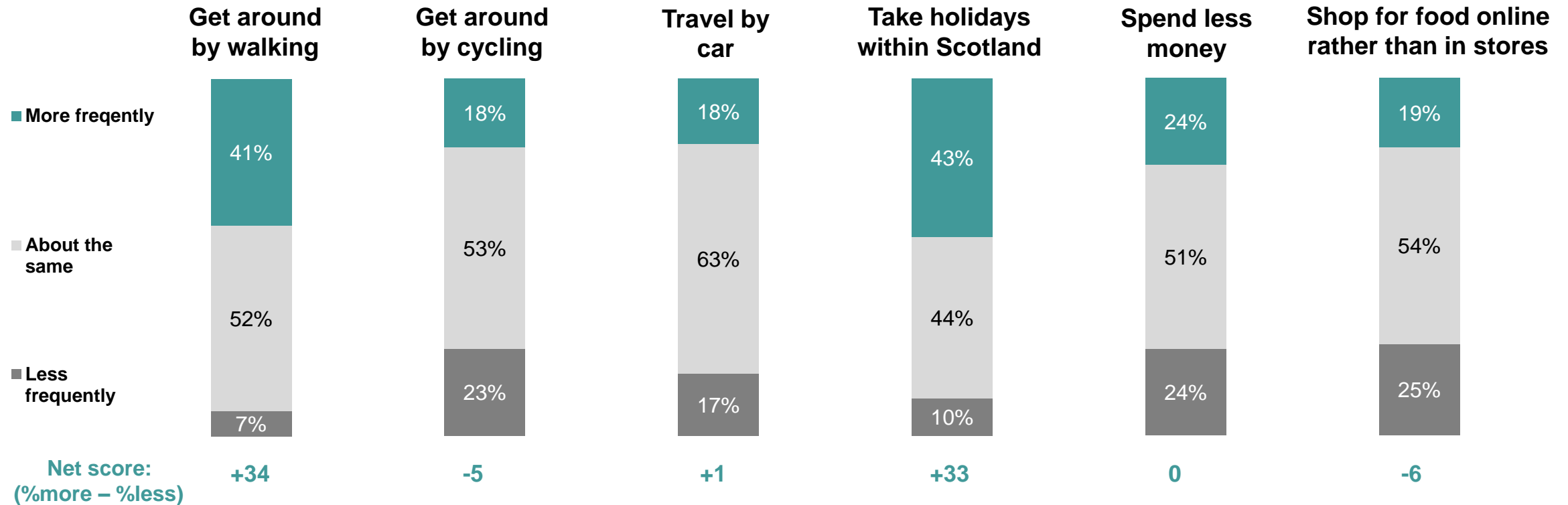

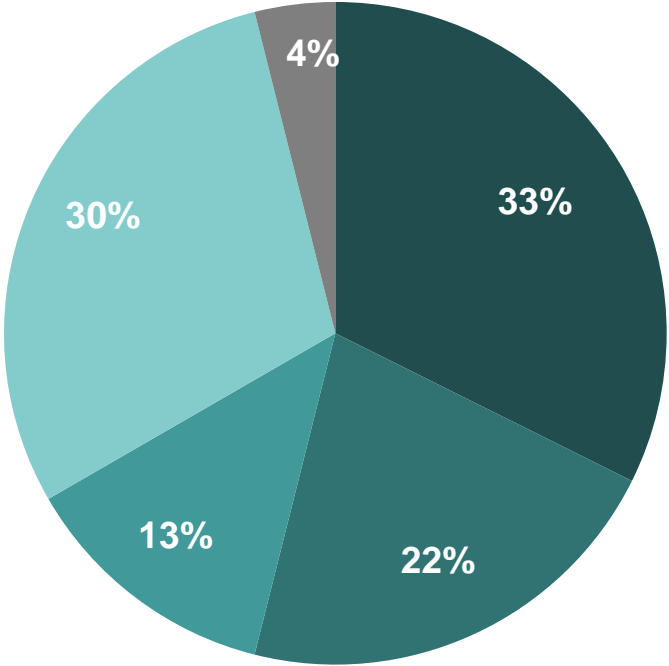

# Likelihood of using a contact tracing app

## Technical note

Ipsos MORI Scotland interviewed a representative sample of 1,006 adults aged 16+ across Scotland. Interviews were conducted by telephone: 14 – 20 May 2020. Data are weighted by age, sex, region, social grade, working status, tenure and education to match the profile of the population.

Where percentages do not sum to 100 this may be due to computer rounding, the exclusion of “don’t know” categories, or multiple answers. An asterisk (\*) denotes any value of less than half a per cent.

Questions are asked of the total sample of n=1,006 unless otherwise stated.
