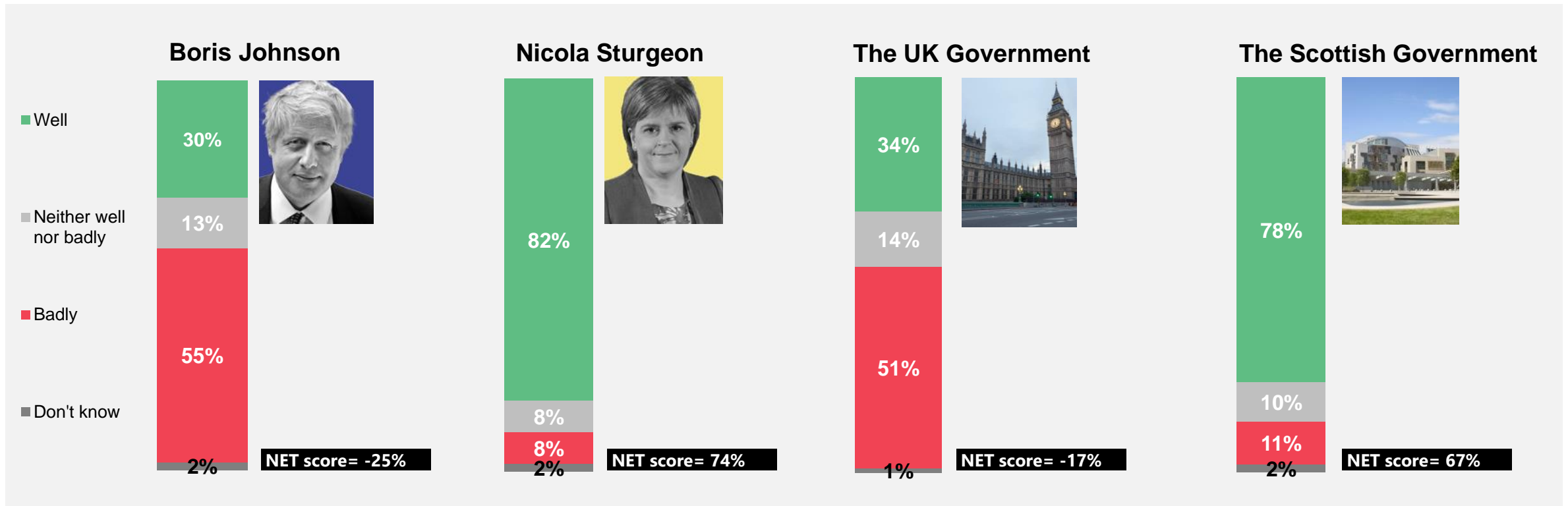

Overall, how well or badly do you think each of the following have handled the coronavirus outbreak so far?

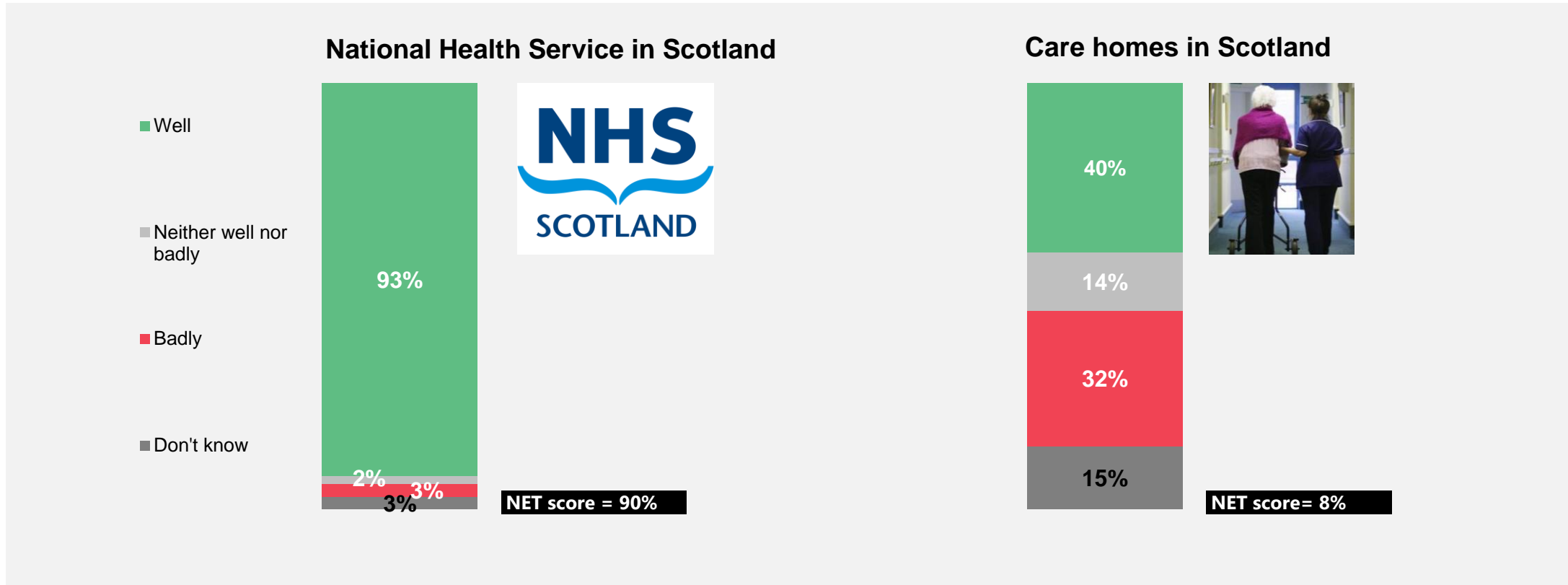

How well or badly, if at all, do you think each of the following have responded to the coronavirus outbreak so far?



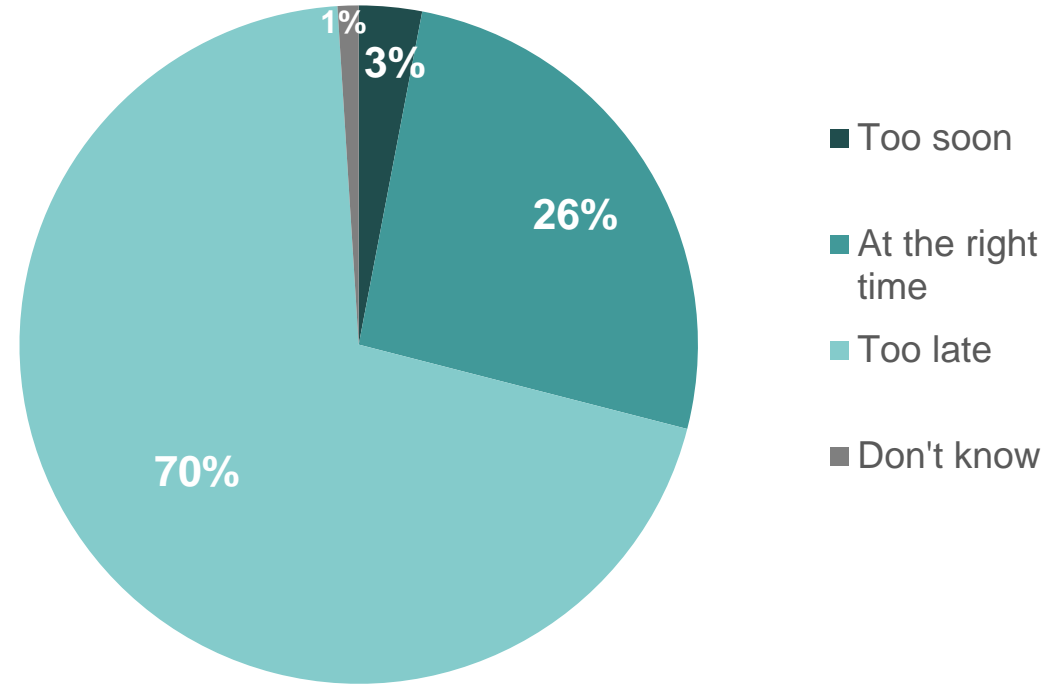

Do you think these measures were taken too soon, too late, or at the right time?

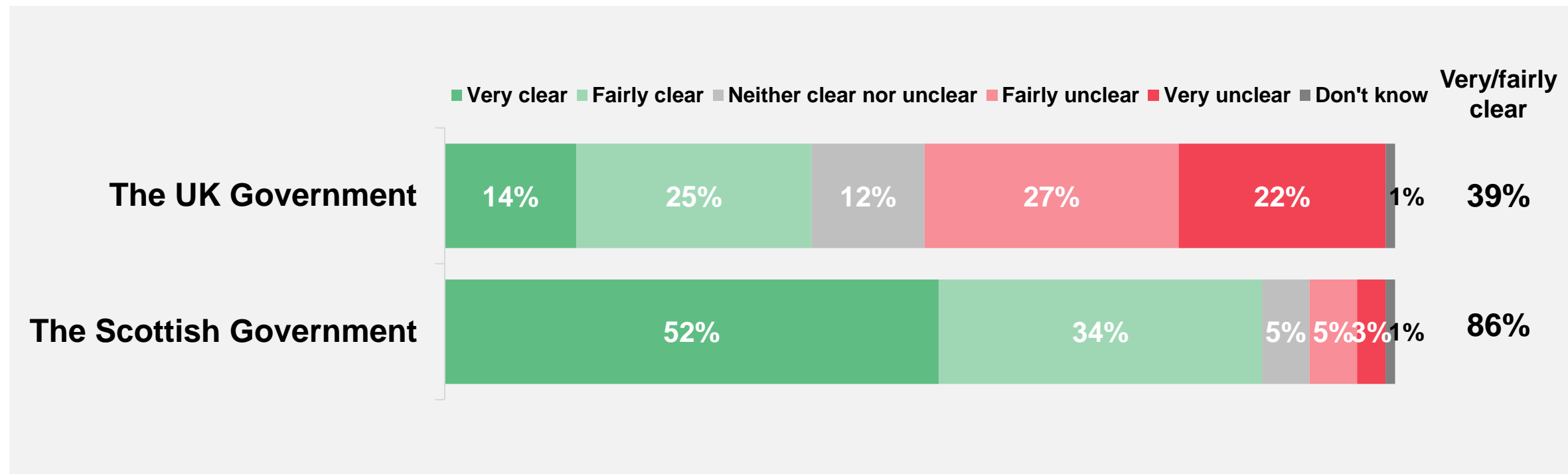

How clear or unclear have the UK/Scottish Government's messages been about what to do in response to the coronavirus?

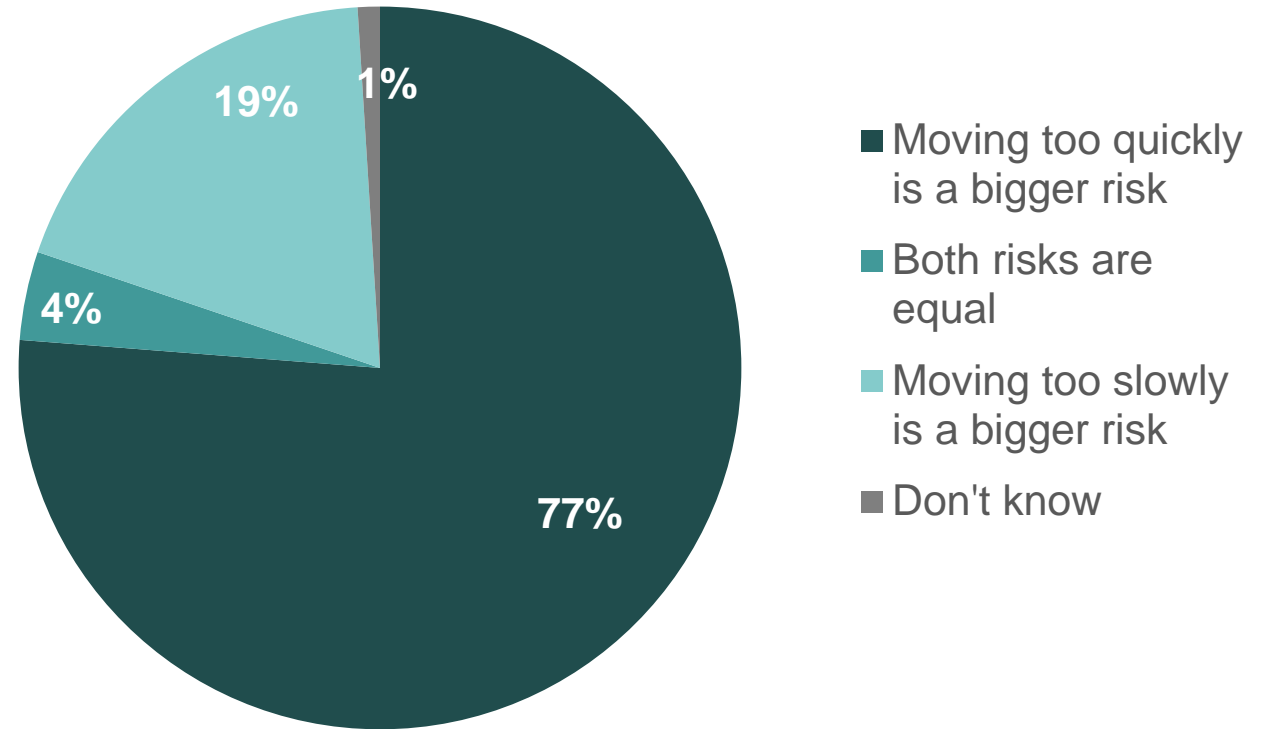

In your view, which of these is a bigger risk to Scotland: moving too quickly to lift the current restrictions to deal with the coronavirus outbreak, or moving too slowly?

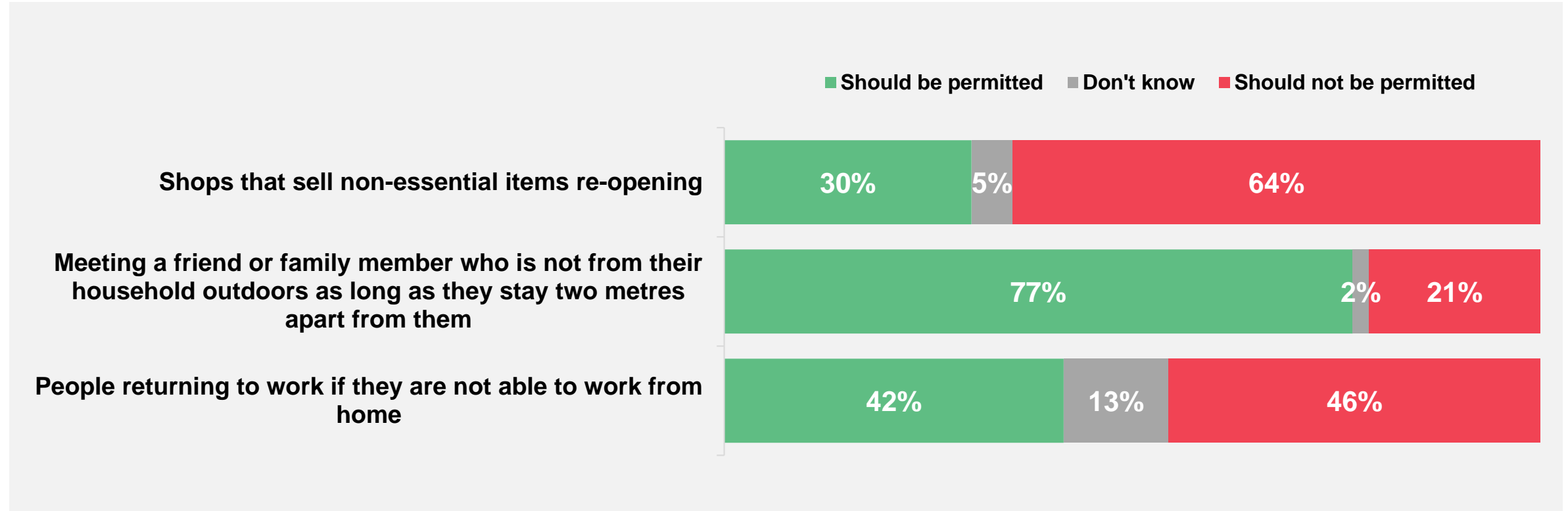

The lockdown restrictions should be lifted in Scotland at the same time as in the rest of the UK

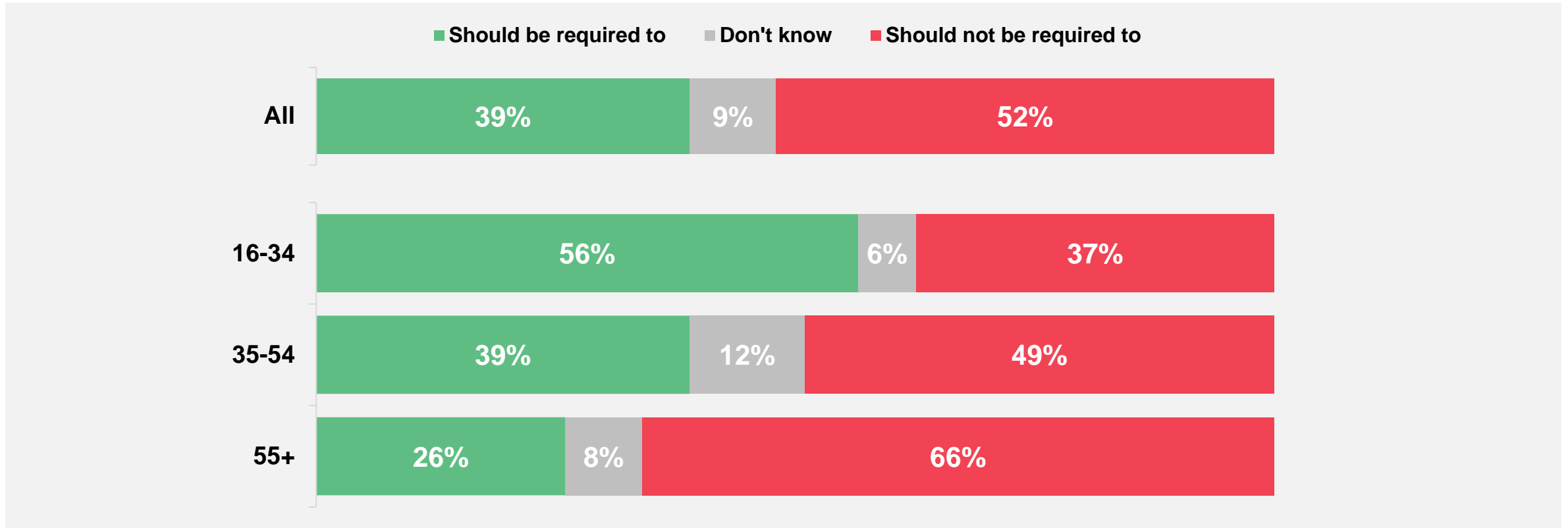

Do you think that people aged 70 and over should or should not be required to stay at home after lockdown restrictions have been lifted for other age groups?

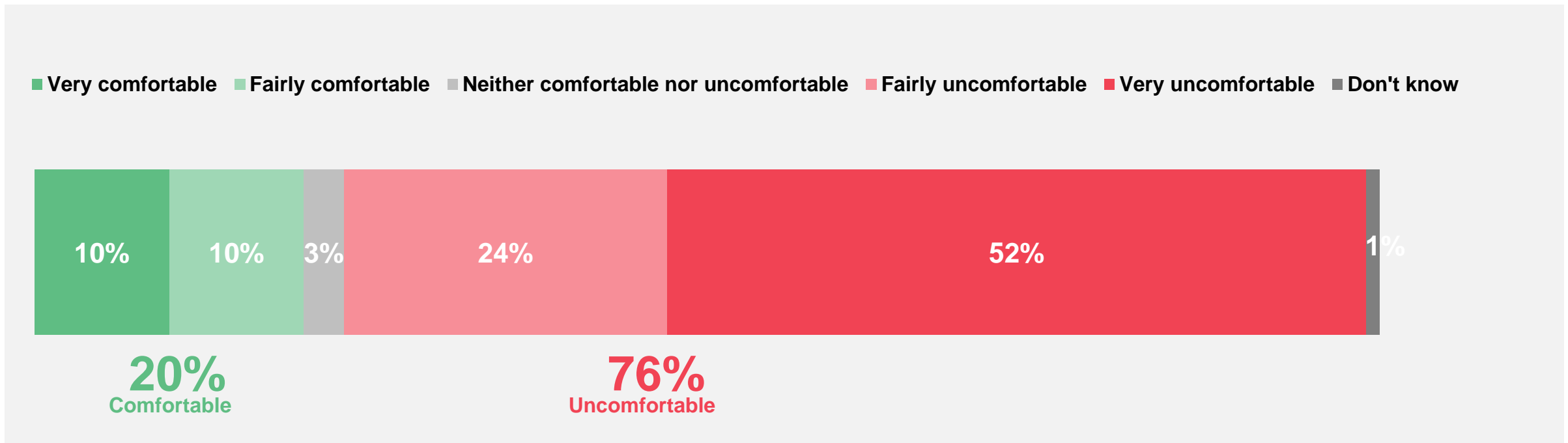

Technical note

Ipsos MORI Scotland interviewed a representative sample of 1,006 adults aged 16+ across Scotland. Interviews were conducted by telephone: 14 – 20 May 2020. Data are weighted by age, sex, region, social grade, working status, tenure and education to match the profile of the population.

Where percentages do not sum to 100 this may be due to computer rounding, the exclusion of “don’t know” categories, or multiple answers. An asterisk (*) denotes any value of less than half a per cent.

Questions are asked of the total sample of n=1,006 unless otherwise stated.
