
Sexual orientation and attitudes to LGBTQ+ in Britain **June 2020**







Support for teaching about LGBT relationships in Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) in secondary schools






Discrimination faced by LGBTQ+ communities in Britain






Which, if any, of the following, best describes how you think of your sexual orientation?
