


Attitudes towards government communications during coronavirus pandemic

■ Strongly agree ■ Tend to agree ■ Neither agree nor disagree ■ Tend to disagree ■ Strongly disagree ■ Don't know






Awareness and understanding of 'R'

Before now, how much did you know about 'R'?*




- A great deal
