


Young people more likely to have used public transport, and taken part in non-essential activities such as shopping, visiting friends or family, or going for days out than older cohorts.

Since lockdown eased, which if any of the following have you done?







How challenging would you say you are finding working at home at the moment?



Which, if any, of the following are the main reasons that you are finding working at home challenging?





And which one of the following statements best applies to you? I expect to return to my workplace...



Do you expect to be able to choose when you return to your normal workplace, or do you expect that your employer or manager will decide when you must return?



To what extent, if at all, would you be concerned if you had to return to your usual place of work in the near future?



Most common concerns focus on overall risk and the inability to practice social distancing, with mask use also a concern.


Which if any of the following are / would be your main concerns about returning to your usual place of work / working in future in a location similar to your former workplace ?

Which if any of the following are / would be your main concerns about returning to your usual place of work / working in future in a location similar to your former workplace ?





Most have not noticed much of a difference in their work performance or quality whilst working from home although more are satisfied in their job at home.


Now, comparing your recent experiences working at home and your previous place of work, please say for each of the following whether working at home or your previous place of work is better.

More than half think their ability to collaborate with colleagues and sense of community is better in the office, and a third feel their day working has more variety when they are not at home












One in three feel under pressure to prove they are working when working from home, one in four disagree.


How strongly do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements? – When I am working at home, I feel under pressure to prove that I am working
