






#### 2016 Leave voters are more positive about Britain's role in the world compared to Remain voters






## The proportion saying Britain is a force for good in the world has fallen ten percent since April 2019



Below are a number of statements about Britain's role in the world, please select whether you agree or disagree with each.


Even though Britain is not as powerful economically or militarily as some other countries, it should try to punch above its weight in world affairs

#### Britain should stop pretending it is an important power in the world










### Public split between increasing Britain's influence or keeping it as it is a small but growing proportion say it should reduce it

Do you think Britain should try to increase its influence around the world, reduce it, or keep it as it is?










### Meanwhile, nearing half think leaving the European Union <u>will</u> reduce Britain's influence around the world








# Labour and Remain voters are more likely to say Britain's influence will reduce, whilst Conservatives and Leaver voters are less concerned









### Although Leave voters and Conservatives are more likely to say the United States or the Commonwealth








## Despite leaving the EU, four in five still think it will be important for Britain to maintain a close relationship






## But fewer than two in five think a close relationship between Britain and the EU is <u>likely</u> – down from a majority last year








# Labour and Remain voters are more pessimistic about whether a close relationship will happen








# Two in five now think Brexit will make Britain less secure against its enemies, but a majority of Leave voters and Conservatives think it will make no difference



And now thinking about the next five to ten years, what impact do you think Britain's relationship with the European Union will have on...



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






#### A trade agreement with the EU is the top priority for Britons







