


'Algorithm' in planning reforms turns some people off

Central government setting new targets using an algorithm for the number of new homes local councils will be expected to allow to be built





How concerned, if at all, are you with the following... Your ability to pay the rent/your mortgage repayments at the moment?





How concerned, if at all, are you with the following... Your ability to pay the rent/your mortgage repayments in 12 months' time?








Financial measures taken due to the Coronavirus
