Majority of Californians approve of Governor Newsom’s handling of COVID-19, wildfires

Spectrum News/Ipsos poll finds that majority support state law mask mandate and closure of universities in response to pandemic

Topline Findings

Washington, DC, October 21, 2020

These are the findings of an Ipsos poll conducted between October 7-15, 2020 on behalf of Spectrum News. For this survey, a sample of 1,400 adults age 18+ from California was interviewed online in English, including an oversample of 400 respondents in the Los Angeles media market, for a total of 824 interviews in that market. The poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus 3.0 percentage points for all respondents and plus or minus 3.9 percentage points for respondents in the Los Angeles media market.

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About the Study

These are some of the findings of an Ipsos poll conducted between October 7-15, 2020, on behalf of Spectrum News. For this survey, a sample of 1,400 adults age 18+ from California was interviewed online in English, including an oversample of 400 respondents in the Los Angeles media market, for a total of 824 interviews in that market.

The sample for this study was randomly drawn from Ipsos' online panel (see link below for more info on "Access Panels and Recruitment"), partner online panel sources, and "river" sampling (see link below for more info on the Ipsos "Ampario Overview" sample method) and does not rely on a population frame in the traditional sense. Ipsos uses fixed sample targets, unique to each study, in drawing a sample. After a sample has been obtained from the Ipsos panel, Ipsos calibrates respondent characteristics to be representative of the U.S. Population using standard procedures such as raking-ratio adjustments. The source of these population targets is U.S. Census 2018 American Community Survey data. The sample drawn for this study reflects fixed sample targets on demographics. Posthoc weights were made to the population characteristics on gender, age, race/ethnicity, region, and education.

Statistical margins of error are not applicable to online non-probability polls. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error and measurement error. Where figures do not sum to 100, this is due to the effects of rounding. The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus 3.0 percentage points for all respondents. Ipsos calculates a design effect (DEFF) for each study based on the variation of the weights, following the formula of Kish (1965). This study had a credibility interval adjusted for design effect of the following ($n=1,400$, $DEFF=1.5$, adjusted Confidence Interval= ± 4.5 percentage points).

The poll also has a credibility interval of plus or minus 3.9 percentage points for respondents in the Los Angeles media market.

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
