

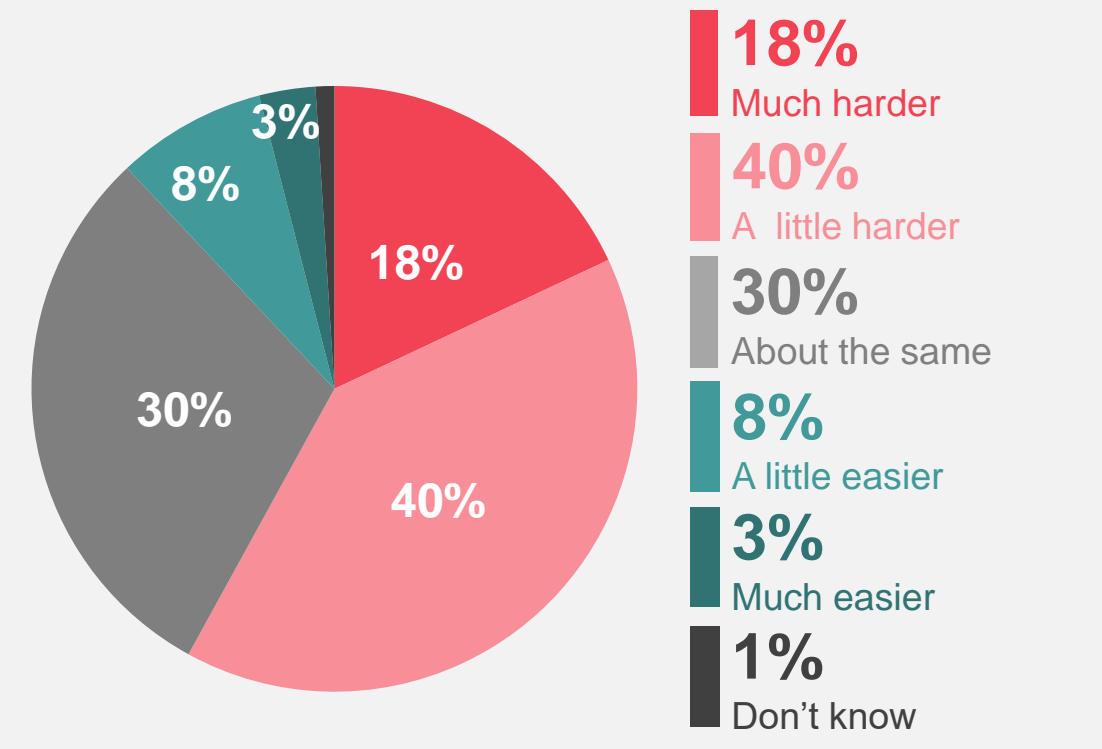

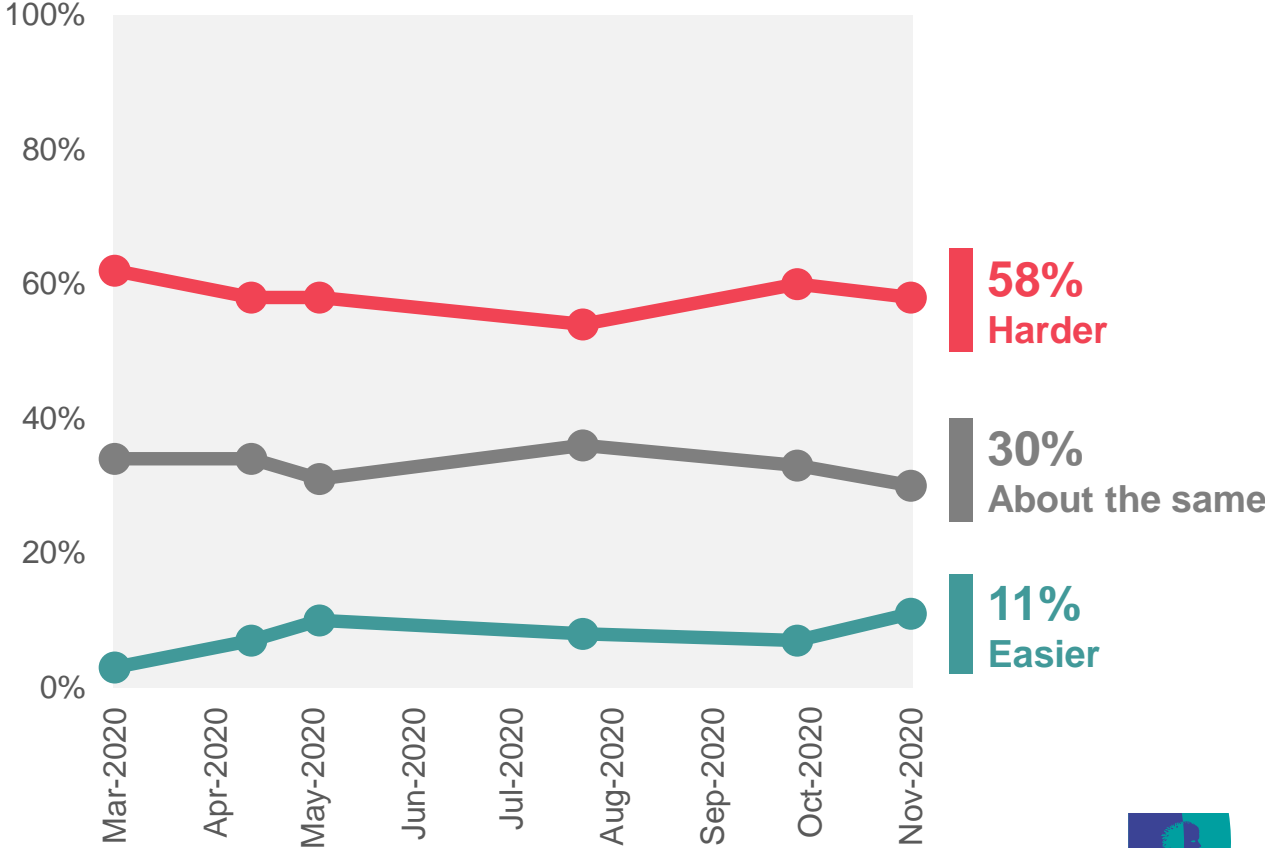
At the moment, are you finding each of the following easier, harder, or about the same compared with before the Coronavirus outbreak? Staying positive about the future

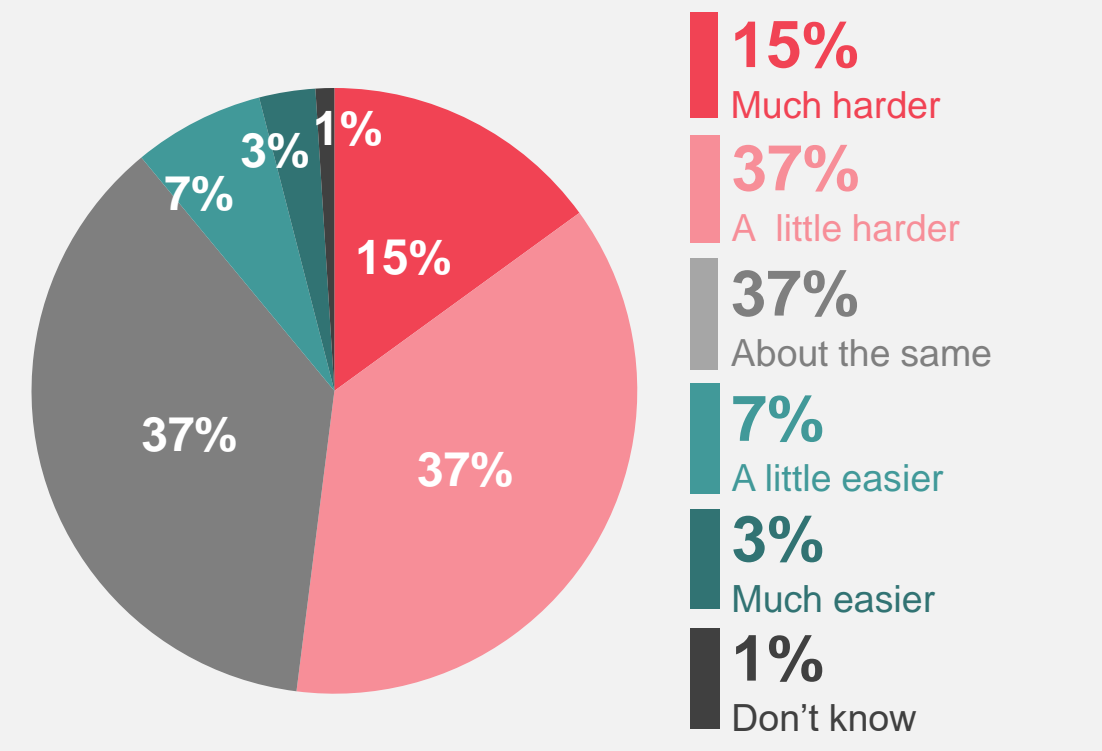

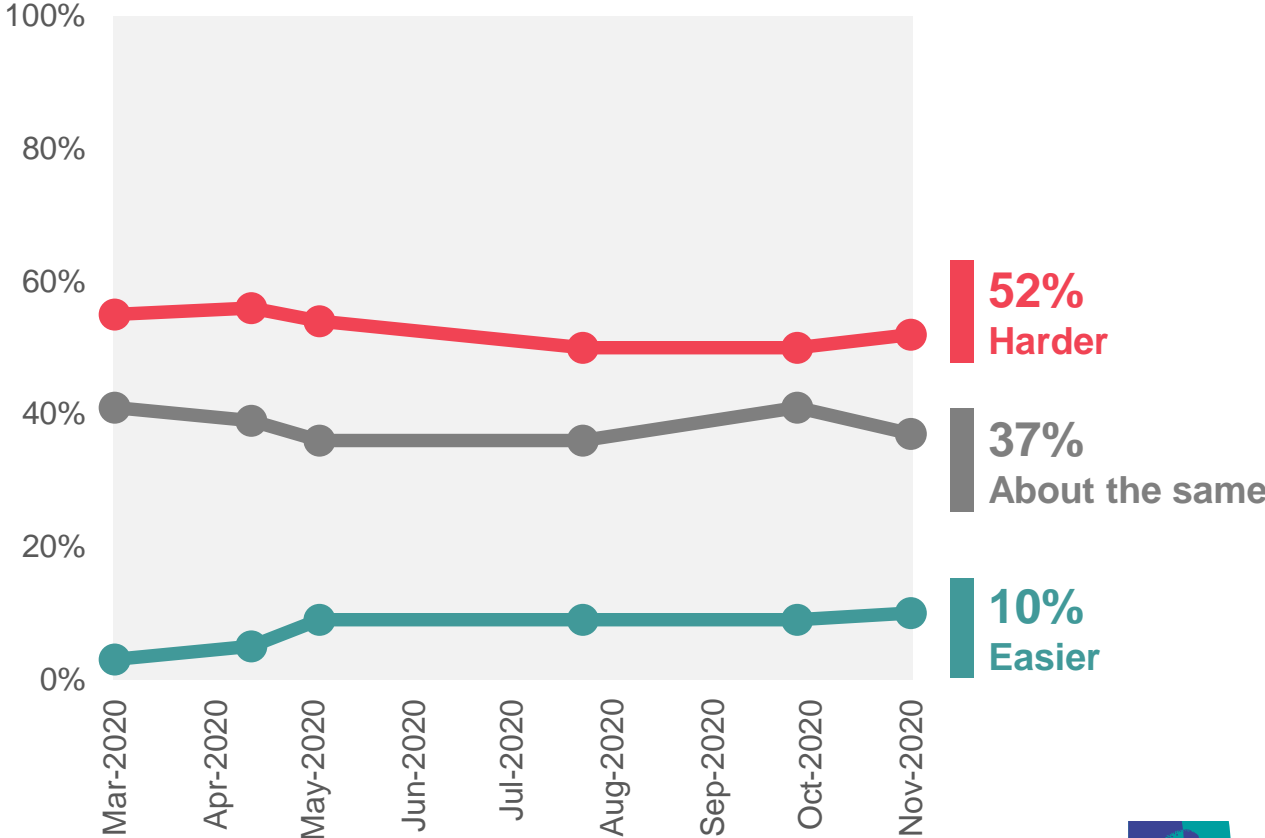

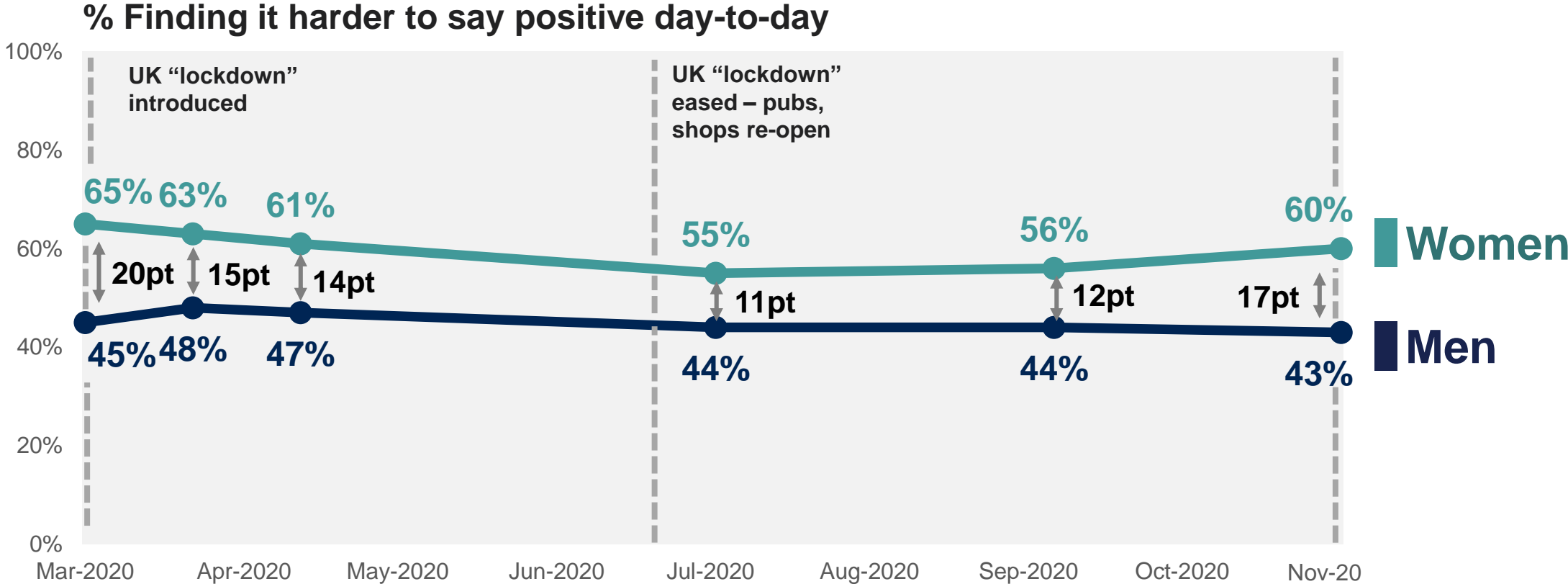

Women have been consistently more likely than men to say they are finding it harder to stay positive day to day

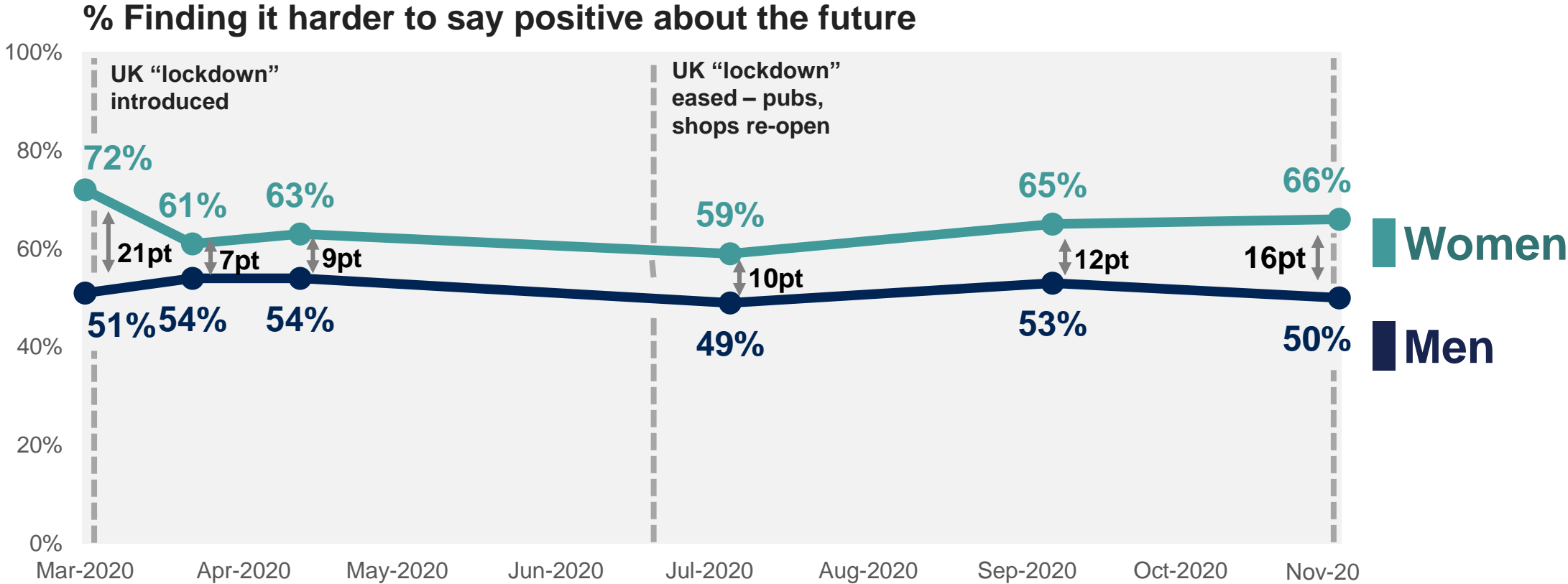

Women are more likely than men to say they are finding it harder to stay positive about the future

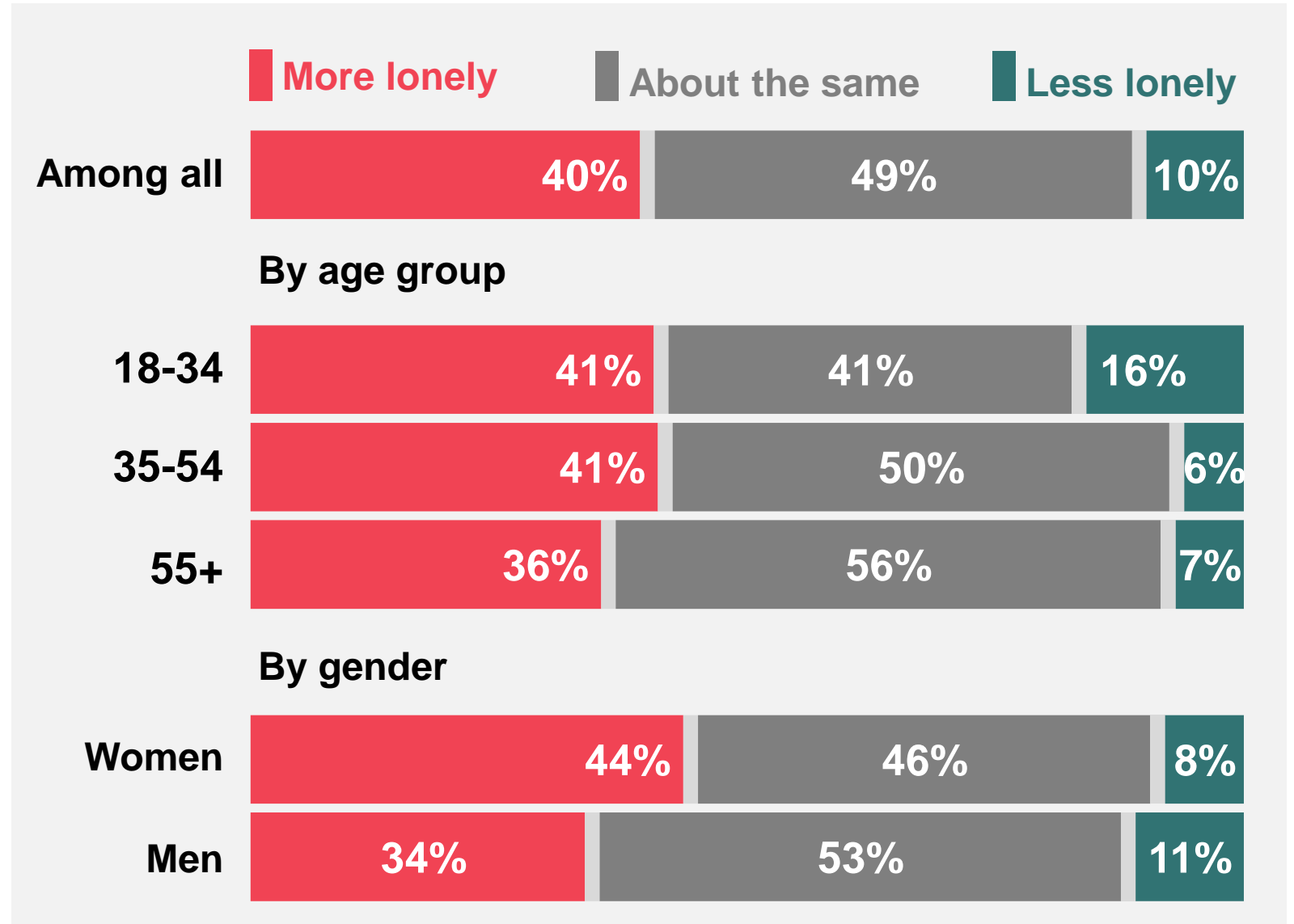

Loneliness since the Coronavirus outbreak began

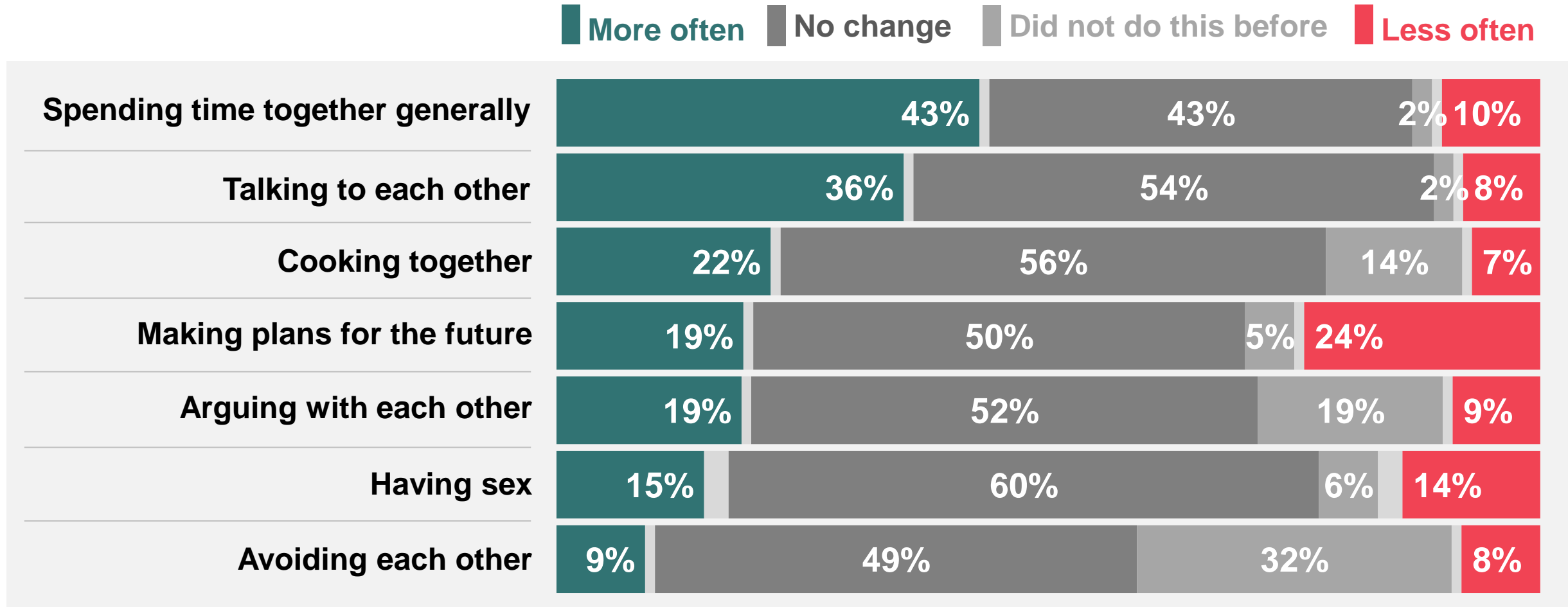
Since the Coronavirus outbreak began, would you say you have felt more lonely, less lonely or about the same compared with before the outbreak?

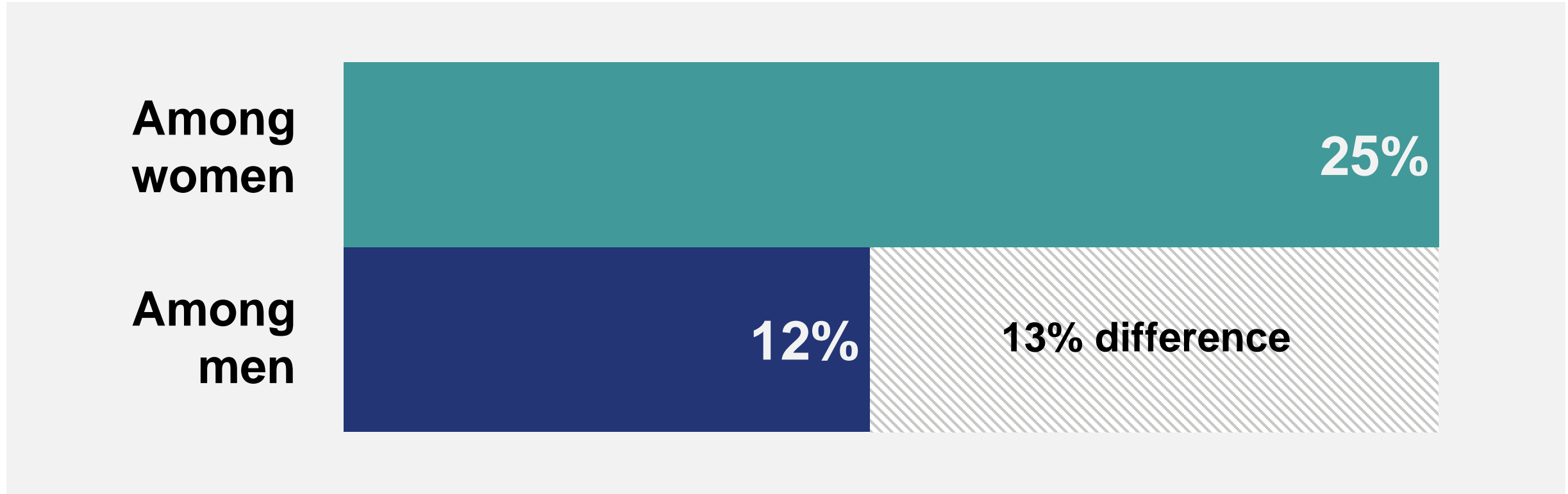

% in a relationship who say they have been arguing more since the Coronavirus outbreak

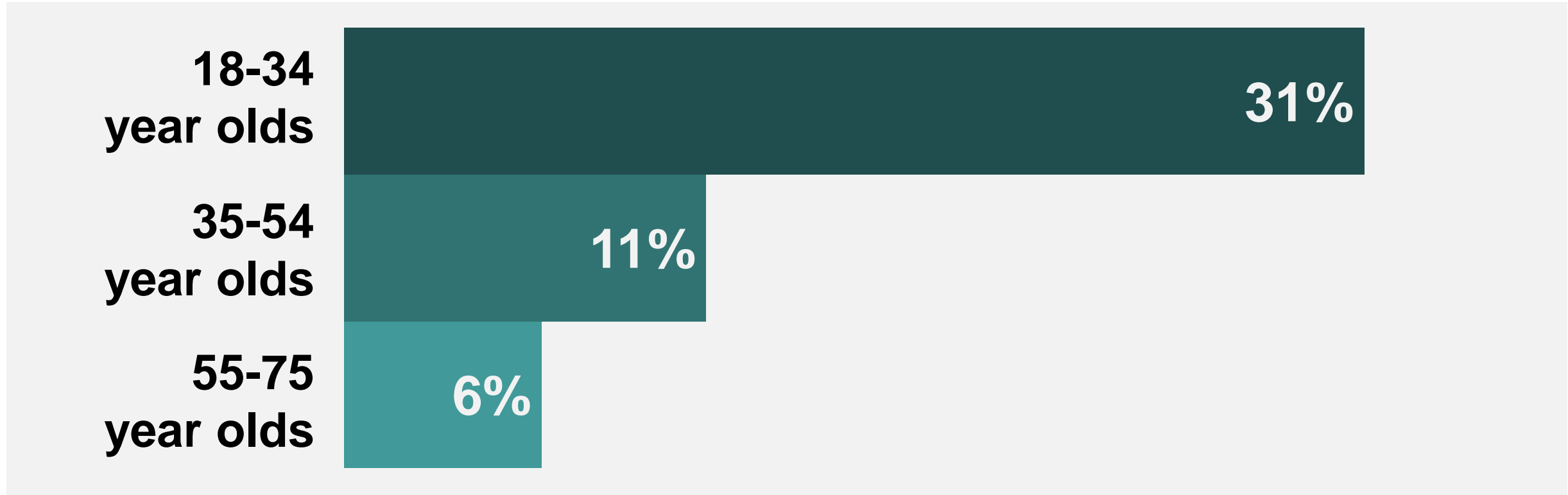

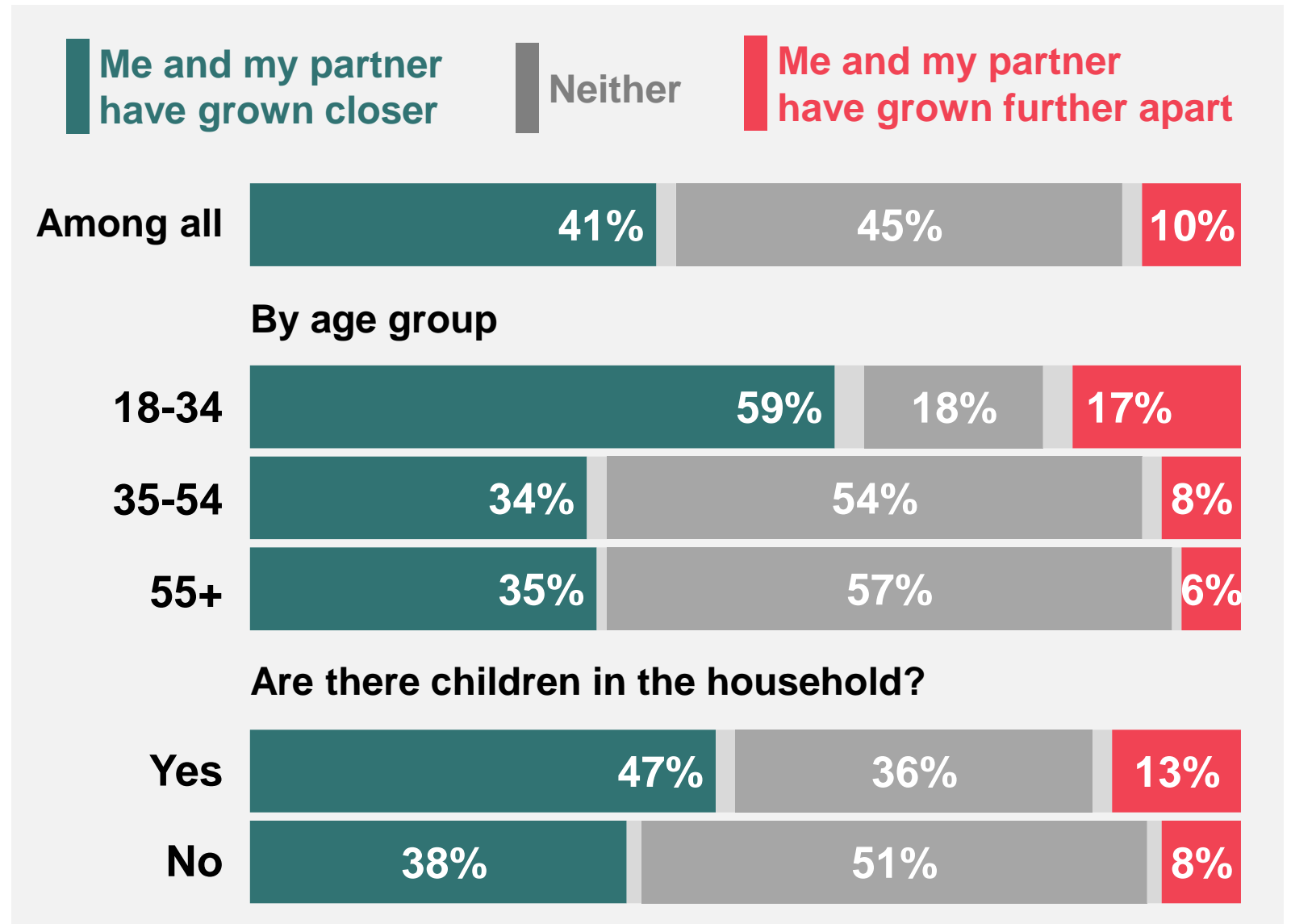
% who say they have been having sex with their partner more since the Coronavirus outbreak

Have you broken the Coronavirus rules for romance?

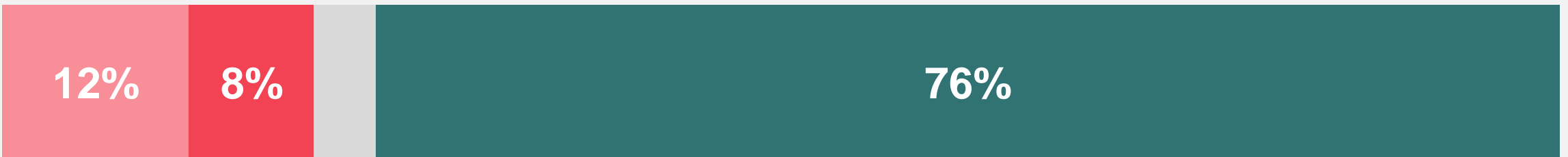

Total broken the rules: 20%

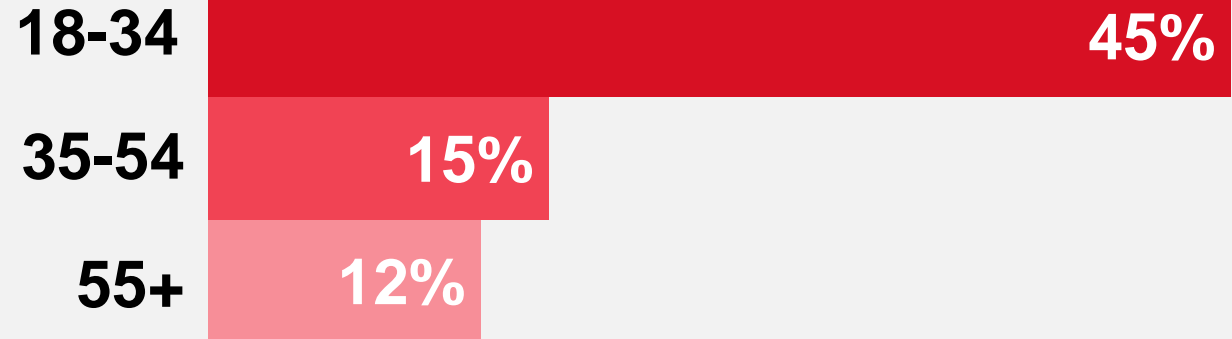

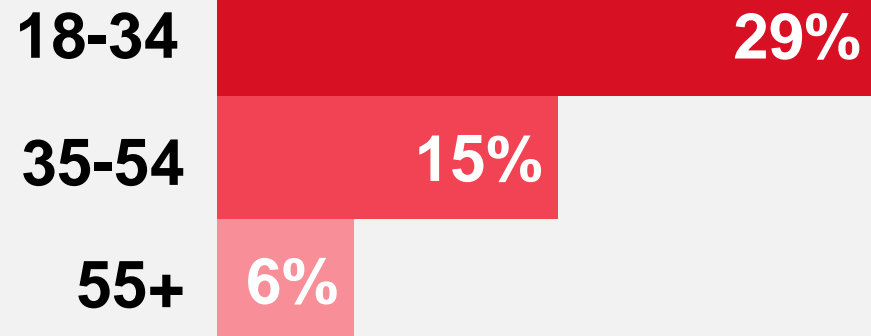
