63 years ago, on 25 March 1957, the six founding Member States of the European Union (Belgium, France, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and West Germany) signed the Treaty of Rome, establishing the European Economic Community.

This forms the legal basis of today's European Union which covers 28 countries in economic and political cooperation through a series of treaties, institutions, the single market, free movement of goods, services, people and money.

Is Europe going in the right direction now?


Q: Generally speaking, would you say things across the European Union are heading in the right direction or are they off on the wrong track?


