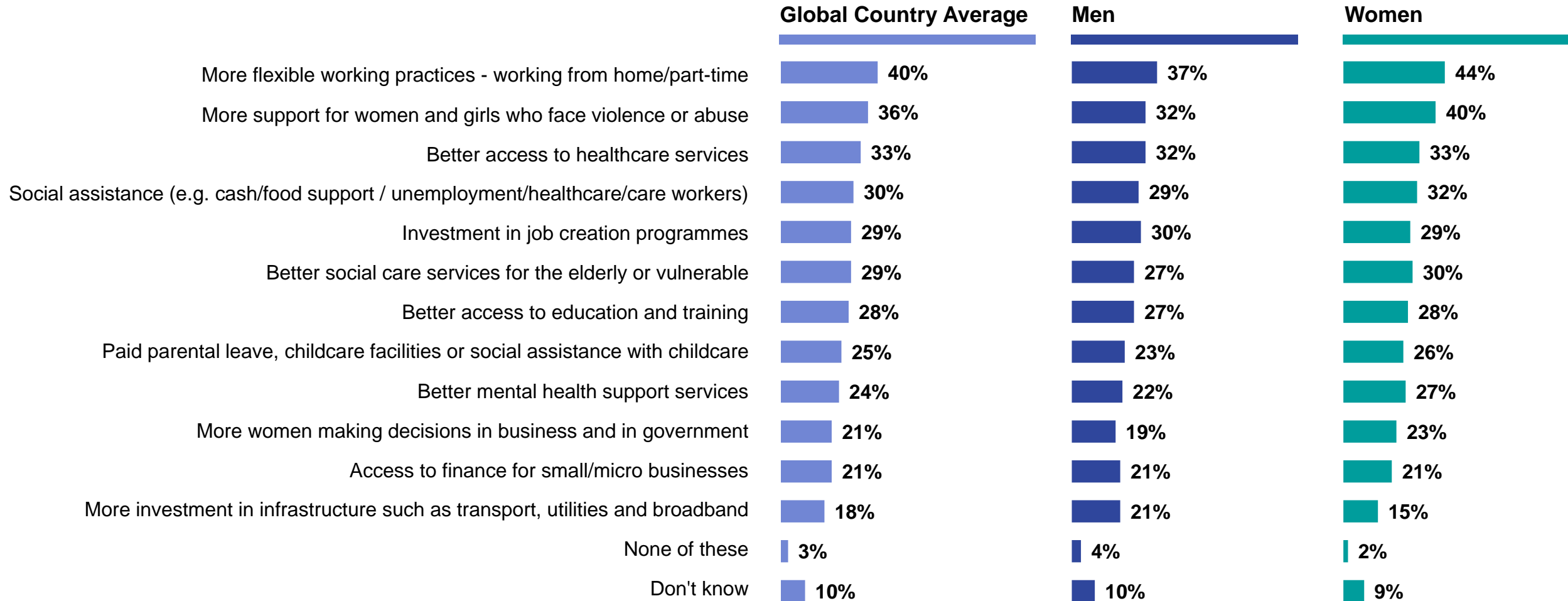


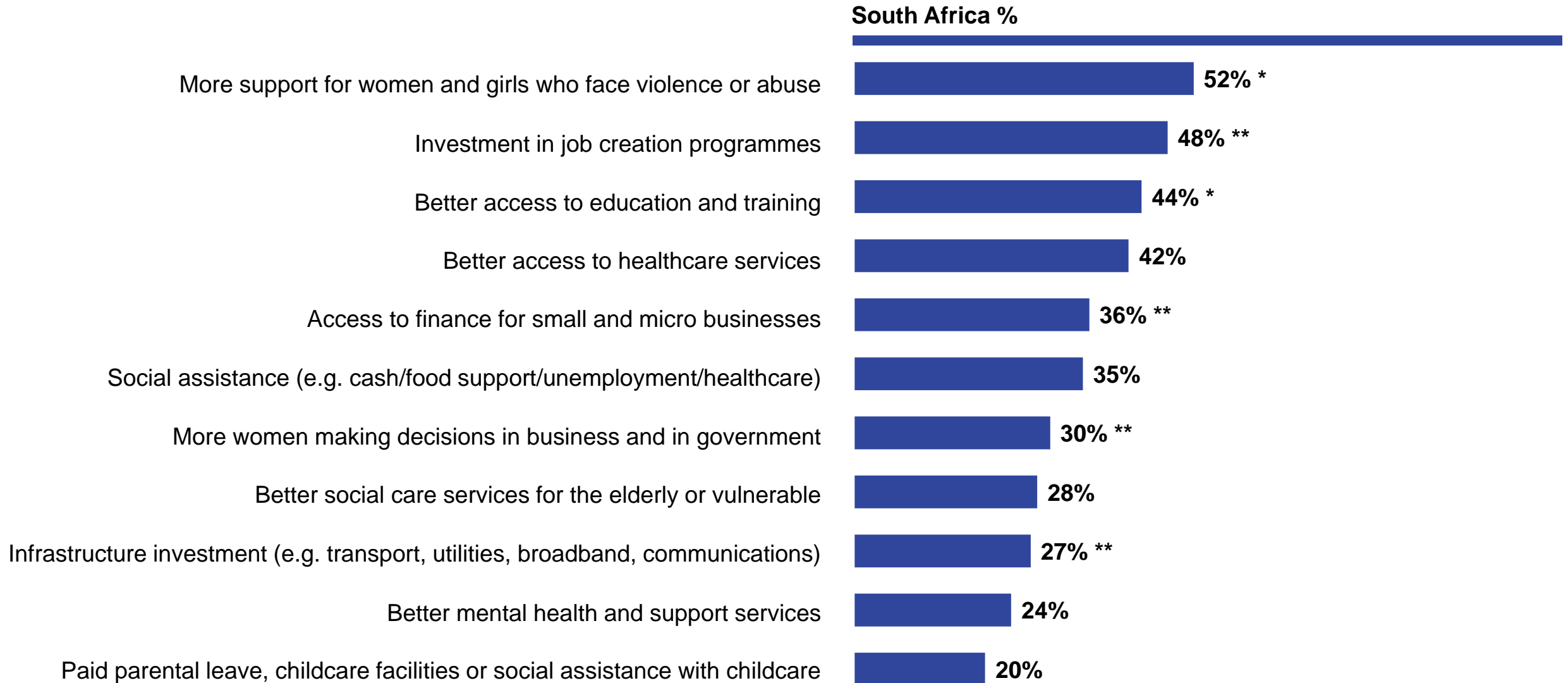

Which four or five, if any, of the following, do you think are the most important to ensure that the programme for recovery after the Coronavirus pandemic in [country] addresses issues facing women?



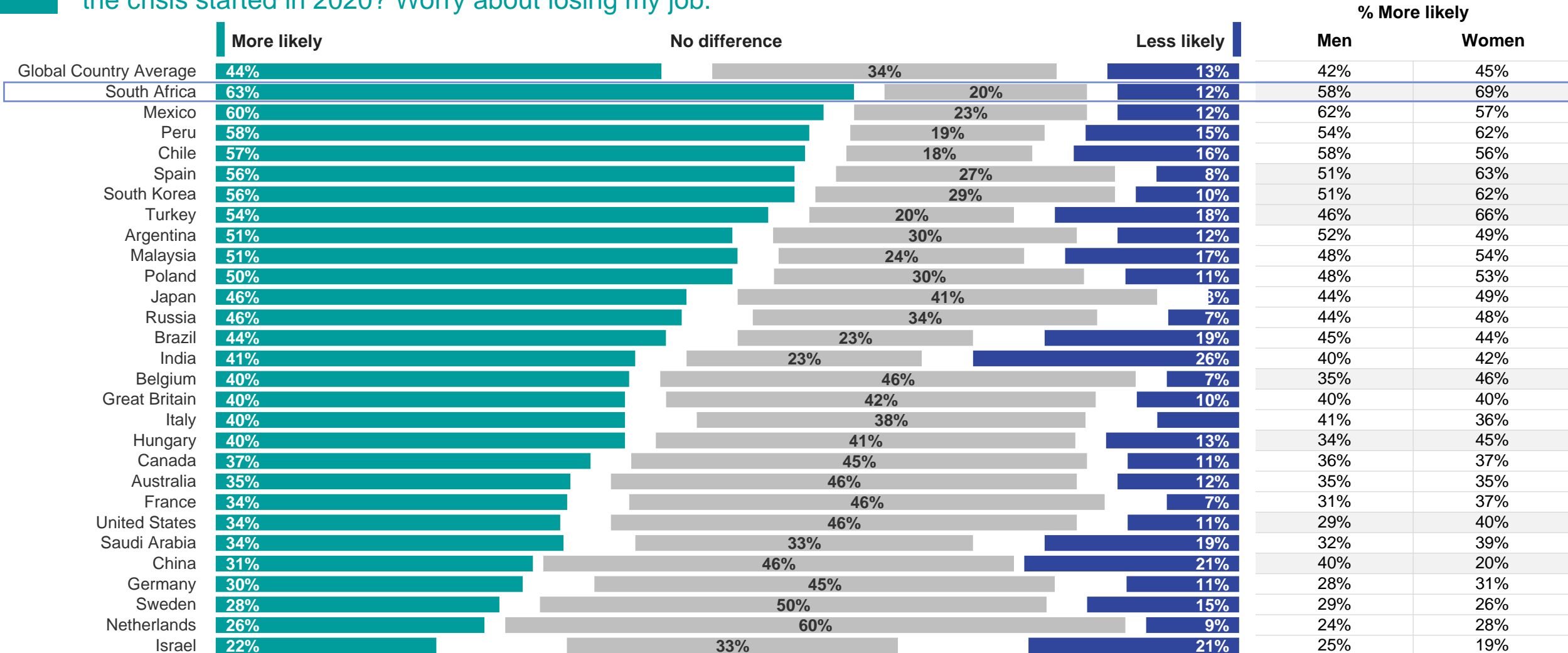
# FOR ONLINE SOUTH AFRICANS IT IS THE TOP PRIORITY TO ADDRESS THE MATTER OF GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE TO ENSURE THAT ISSUES FACING WOMEN ARE CONSIDERED WHEN PLANS ARE MADE FOR THE RECOVERY FROM THE PANDEMIC.



OVERALL, 44% OF PEOPLE IN WORK SAY THEY ARE NOW MORE LIKELY NOW TO WORRY ABOUT LOSING THEIR JOB THAN THEY DID BEFORE THE CRISIS STARTED. A THIRD (34%) SAY THERE IS NO DIFFERENCE, WHILE 13% SAY THEY ARE LESS LIKELY TO WORRY NOW.
