49pc parents want schools closed: report

With over 7,000 deaths, only 35pc people consider Covid-19 as a threat

ISLAMABAD: While the threat perception regarding Covid-19 has decreased across the country, 49 percent of parents do not want to send their children to school, according to a survey.

Moreover, income of 83pc of people has decreased due to the pandemic. But half of Pakistanis are optimistic that the Covid-19 vaccine will be available before the end of 2020.

The survey, "Worsening Covid-19 realities and diminishing threat perceptions", was conducted by a research company, Ipsos.

During the survey, 1,072 people were contacted through phone calls from Oct 28 to Nov 4. As many as 54pc of the respondents were from Punjab and Islamabad, 25pc from Sindh, 16pc from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 3pc from Balochistan and 2pc from AJK. Around 74pc of the respondents were males and 26pc females, 82pc belonged to urban

and 18pc to rural areas.

The report stated that in April there were over 2,000 cases of Covid-19 and 25 deaths but 50pc of people were taking the virus as a threat to themselves and 83pc considered it a threat to Pakistan. However, in November while over 350,000 cases and 7,000 deaths had been reported, only 35pc of people considered the disease as a threat to themselves and 43pc as a threat to Pakistan.

The survey claimed that the public awareness level remained stagnant at 86pc for the last six months but increased after a sudden surge in positive cases to 92pc.

After dropping to ever lowest figures in September, the threat perception has suddenly risen sharply across all levels in November compared to September. However, it is still low compared to April.

Pakistanis have expressed highest trust in local news channels and religious centres for Covid-19 updates while negligible trust is shown in the social media.

Moreover, parents' concern regarding sending their children to schools seemed rebounding. In September, 90pc of parents were comfortable with sending their children to school but this percentage has now shrunk to 51pc.

The survey also showed that 20pc Pakistanis feared the second wave of the virus since August mainly due to non-implementation of the standard operating procedures (SOPs).

ISLAMABAD: A survey conducted by Ipsos has revealed that price hike has been felt across Pakistan, bottom end socio-economic classes are most worried about it, and consider the federal government responsible for it.

The survey, conducted from October 28 to November 04 with interviews of over a thousand respondents shows that half of the Pakistanis blame federal government for the inflation, only 15 percent consider previous governments to be responsible. 49 percent respondents said the Centre is responsible, 17 percent respondents considered provincial governments responsible, 8 percent people blamed it on unknown mafia, 5 percent







Despite the coronavirus pandemic raging in Pakistan, with a worryingly high number of new infections reported each day, 51% of parents say they are comfortable sending their children to school, a survey has revealed.

The IPSOS survey also found, however, that this number has dropped in November, from 90% in September.

The survey sought responses through Computer Assisted Telephonic Interviews (CATI), taken from 1,013 Pakistani adults aged above 18, between September and November.



Most Pakistanis fear country headed in wrong direction: survey

ISLAMABAD: Majority of Pakistanis continue to fear that the country is heading in the wrong direction since last year, claims a survey.

France-based organisation Ipsos, in its survey titled "Consumer Confidence Survey in Pakistan", released on Sunday claimed that four in five Pakistanis continued to fear that the country was heading in the wrong direction since last year.

It also revealed that three in four Pakistanis expressed dissatisfaction with the way things are going in Pakistan today, while the same proportion of Pakistanis described as bad the current economic situation in the country.

The survey, which the organisation asserted was based on 1,000 samples collected from urban and rural areas of the country from people aged 18-plus years with (male and female 50:50pc) in September this year, said that unemployment was a worrying issue which got amplified by 11 per cent people since last year, followed by increasing inflation and poverty.

The survey report, while clubbing various stated responses by theme stated that 75pc of the most worrying issues related to economic despair of the masses. It also stated that significant increase in inflation and poverty are at the top since August last year.


