



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
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
Gender Roles in the Household

Close to 9 in 10 agree that household chores can be equally shared by husband and wife. But a significant proportion of men and women agree that the husband's primary responsibility is to earn enough income for the household and the wife's primary responsibility is to look after the household.













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Share of Household Responsibilities

More women take on the daily household responsibilities of cleaning, laundry, cooking and grocery purchase. Whereas men are taking on more responsibility around household repairs, management of tech devices and car maintenance, which tend to be lower in frequency.

24% of women say they are the main person responsible for paying of bills while 9% of men say their wives are. Both genders are aligned on the responsibility of purchasing meals.

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Satisfaction vs Stress of Carrying Out Responsibilities

With more responsibilities sitting on the shoulders of women, fewer women (54%) than men (75%) say they are happy about their household and caring responsibilities. This gap is wider between mothers (47%) and fathers (78%).



QB2. Thinking about your current household / caring responsibilities, how happy are you to be doing them? (SA)




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Satisfaction vs Stress of Carrying Out Responsibilities

Satisfaction is significantly higher among women who work from home.

25% of women who are working from home say they are very happy to be doing their domestic responsibilities. Only 8% of women not working from home say they are very happy.



QB2. Thinking about your current household / caring responsibilities, how happy are you to be doing them? (SA)




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Effect on Well-being and Career Prospects

Only 52% of women report having enough personal time to look after their physical, mental and emotional well-being, compared to 68% of men. This difference is greater among those with children where even fewer mothers (45%) say they have enough personal time.

Among parents, close to 2 in 3 agree that they are limited in the career that they can build or the jobs they can take because of child caring responsibilities. More so for mothers than fathers.






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A Gradual Shift Between Generations

Shared responsibilities is highest for those below 34 years old, showing a gradual shift between generations. More young women say their spouses are sharing tasks like household cleaning and laundry.

There is still some difference in opinion between young men and women as can be seen on a task like paying of bills. There are nearly twice the number of young women than men who claim that they are sharing this task with their spouses.
