

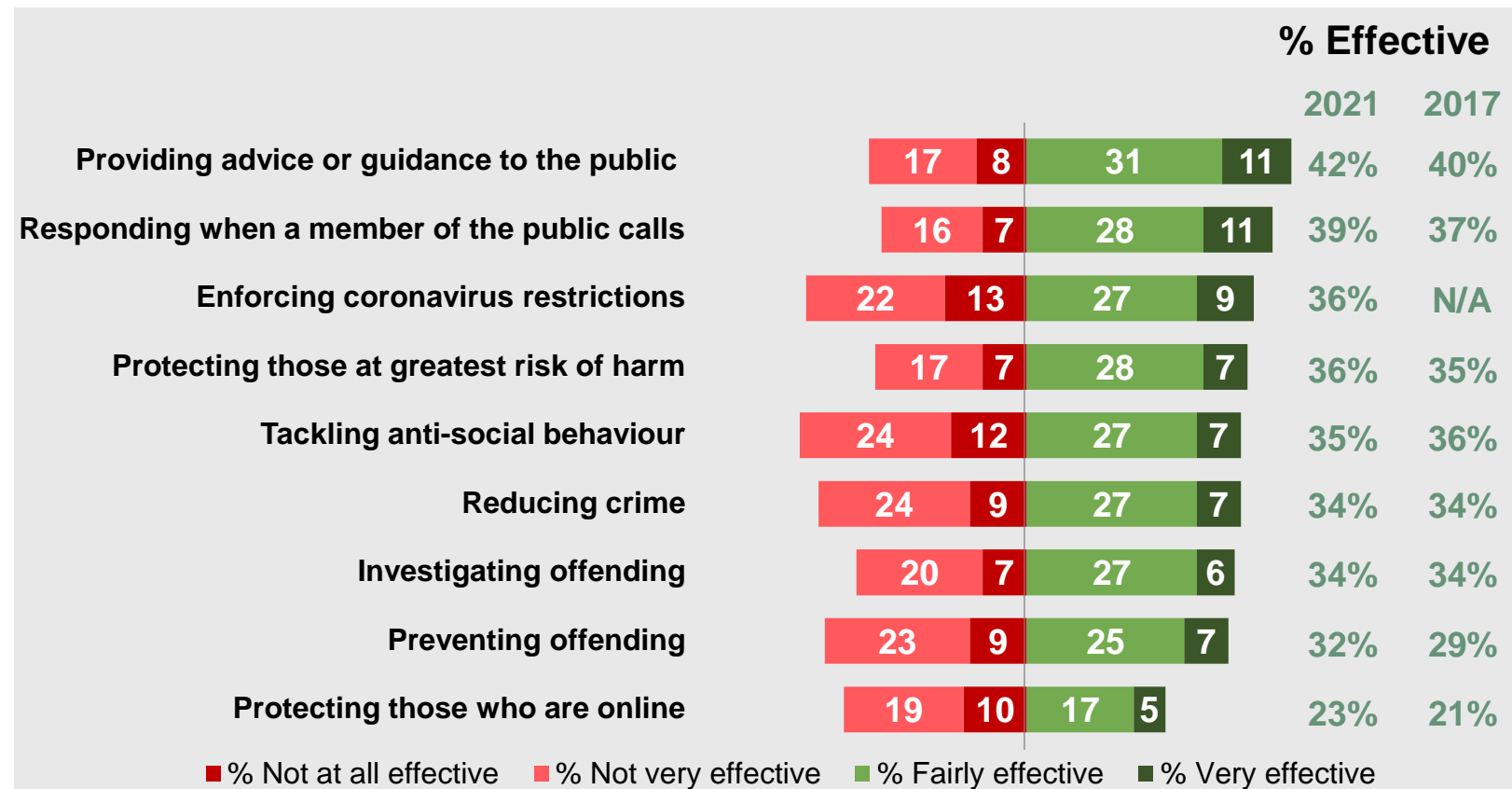
Public perceptions of local policing and the police

Fieldwork: April 2021

Perceptions of how effective local police are have remained largely stable since 2017

In the past 12 months how effective, if at all, do you think the police in your local area have been at each of the following?

- Public opinion on how effective local police are is largely similar to that recorded in 2017.
- People view local police as most effective at providing advice or guidance to the public (42%) and responding when called (39%).
- The public feel local police are least effective in protect people online (23%).



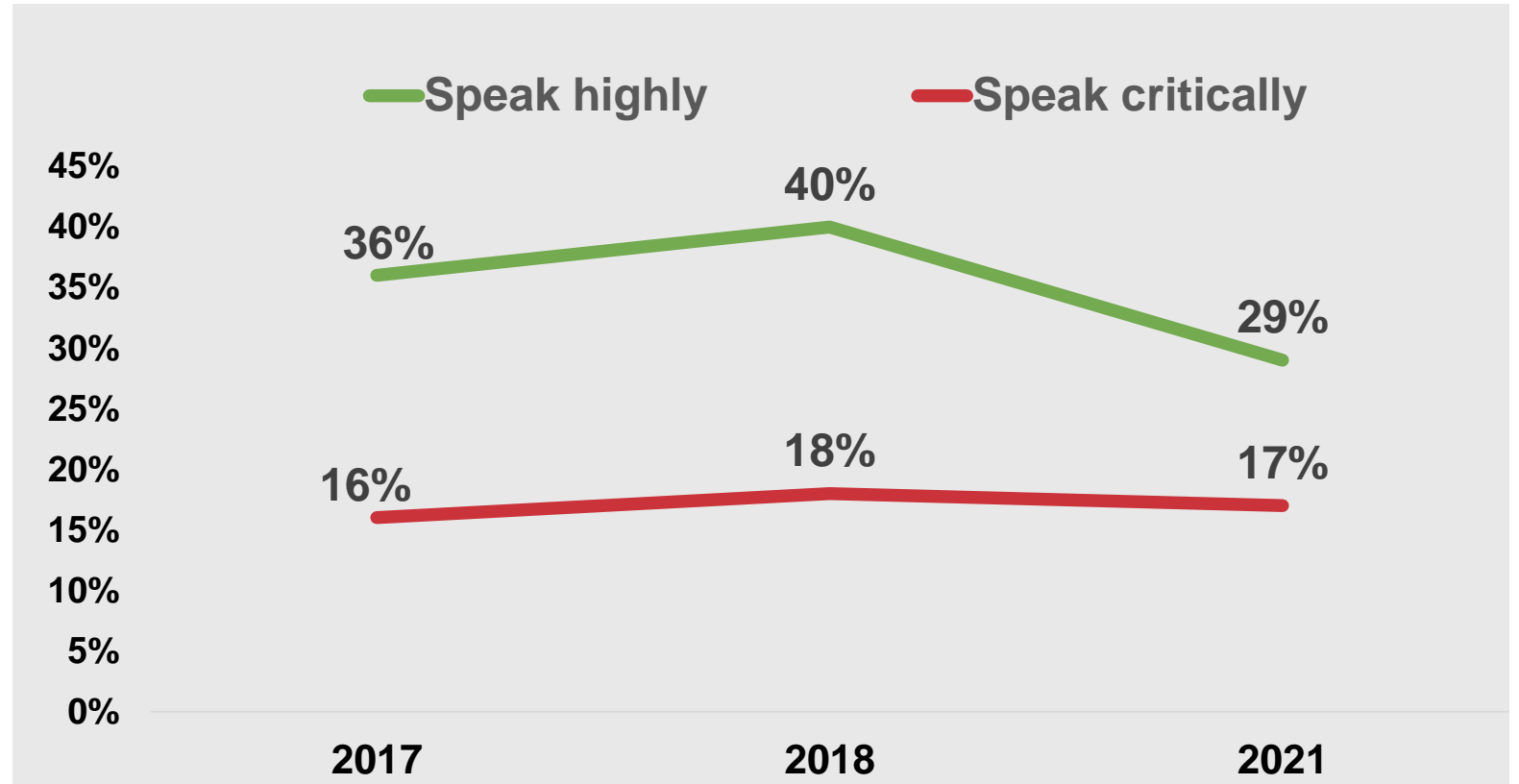

Three in ten say they would speak highly of local police – which has fallen over the last three years

Thinking now about the police in your local area, which of these phrases best describes the way you would speak about them to other people?

- The proportion of respondents who would speak highly of the police has dropped since last measured in 2018.
- The proportion who would speak critically of local police, however, has remained stable.

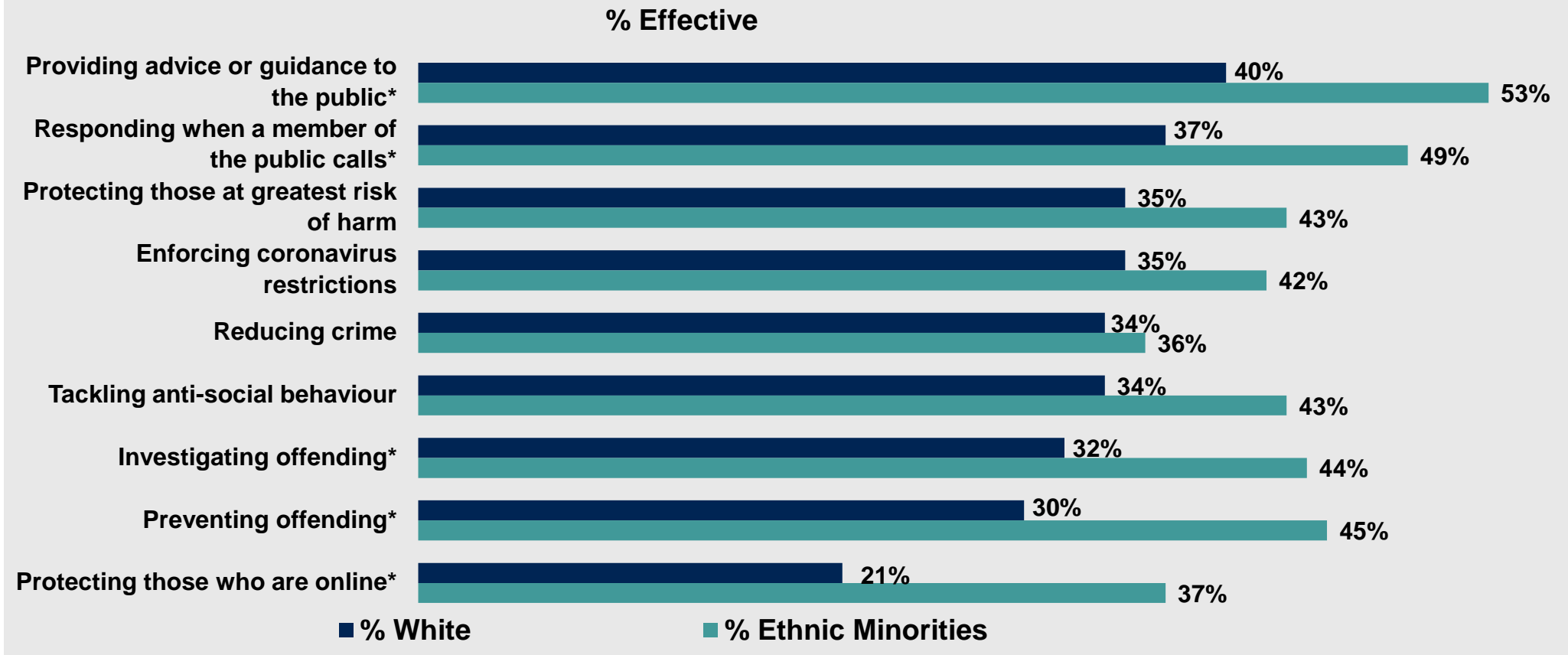

Ethnic minorities are more positive about how effective local police are in some areas of policing than White people

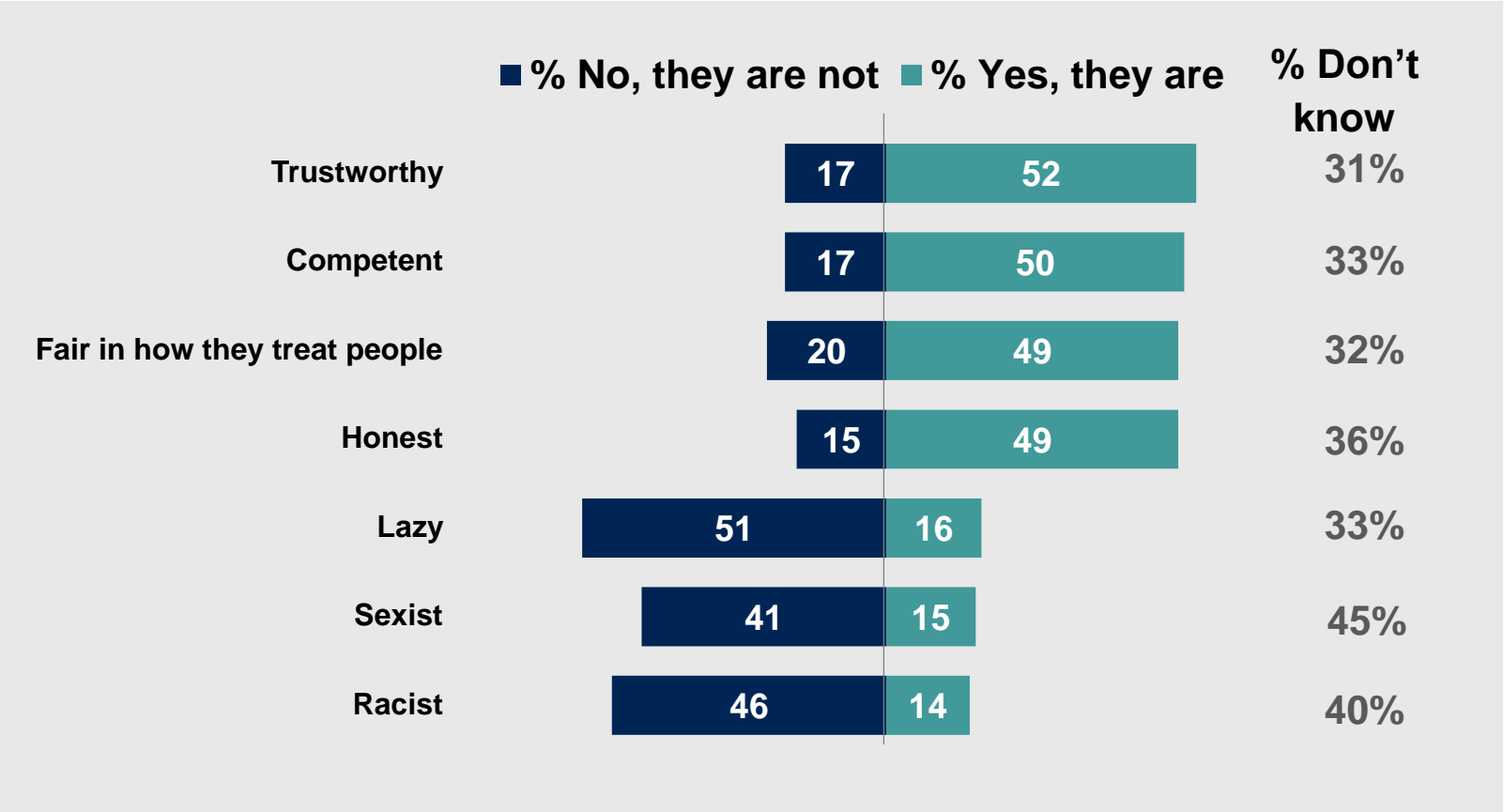

**Statistically significant difference*

Overall, the public are fairly positive about the characteristics police officers may have

Here is a list of characteristics that a police officer may have. Thinking about the police in your area, please indicate whether you think that, on the whole, they are or are not...?

- Generally, respondents are more likely to see police officers as having more positive, rather than negative, attributes.
- Roughly half of respondents say that police officers are trustworthy, competent, fair in how they treat people, or honest.
- Around one in six think police officers are lazy, sexist or racist.



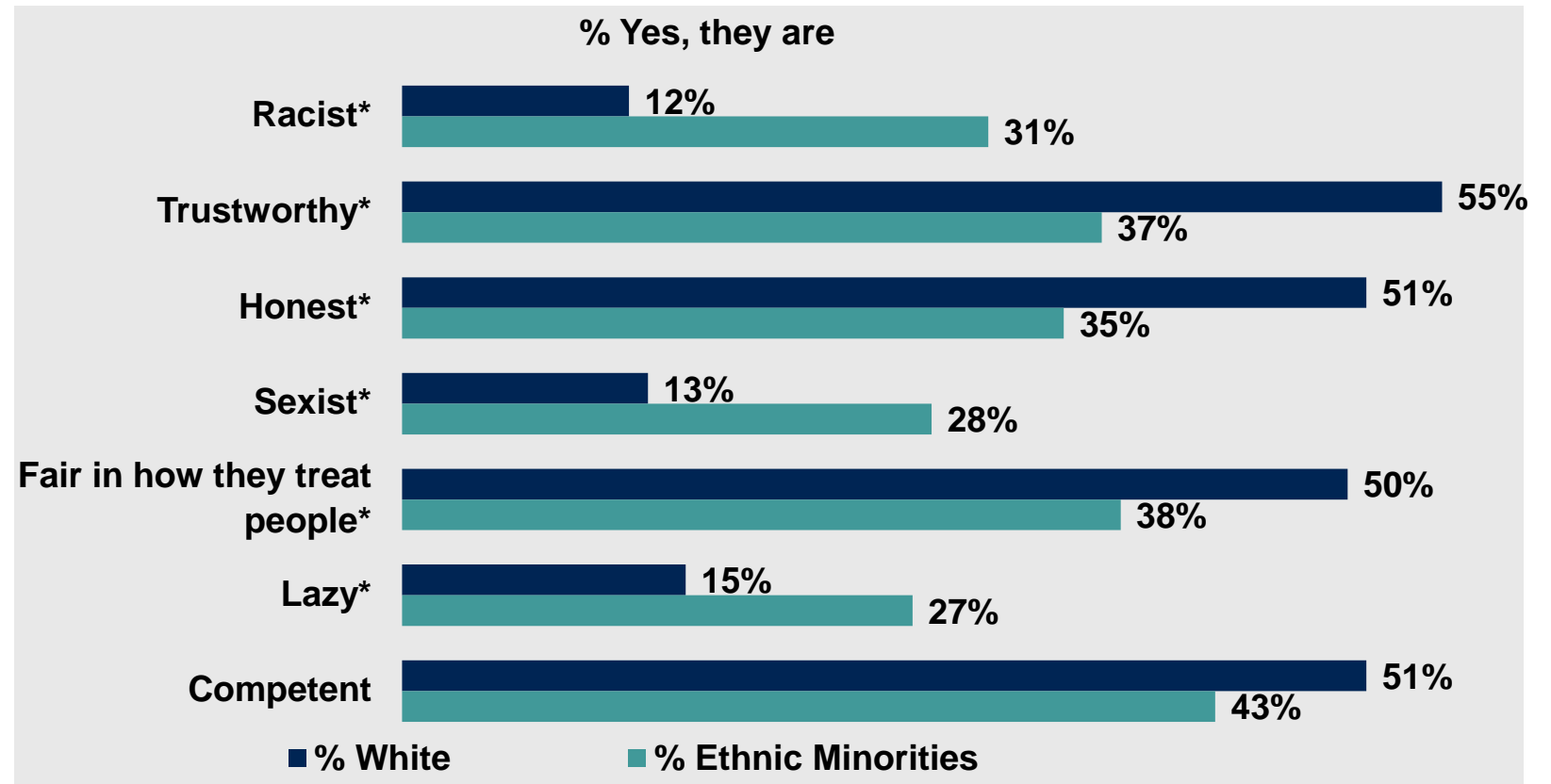

Ethnic minorities are more likely to say police officers are racist and are more negative about them on other attributes

Here is a list of characteristics that a police officer may have. Thinking about the police in your area, please indicate whether you think that, on the whole, they are or are not...?

- Three in ten (31%) ethnic minorities think that police officers are racist, compared with just 12% of White people.
- White people hold more positive views of police officers; half or more think they are trustworthy, honest, fair in how they treat people, and competent. This is lower among ethnic minority respondents.
