About the Study

This Spectrum News/Ipsos immigration poll was conducted May 24 to 31, 2021, by Ipsos using the KnowledgePanel®. This poll is based on a representative sample of 1,005 U.S. adults, 505 California adult residents, and 506 Texas adult residents.

The national sample was conducted in both English and Spanish. The data were weighted to adjust for gender by age, race/ethnicity, education, household income, English proficiency, and region. The demographic benchmarks came from geodemographic distributions of the 18 or above population obtained from the 2019 American Community Survey (ACS). Metro benchmarks were obtained from the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS). Geodemographic benchmarks used to compute the survey weights include:

- Gender (Male and Female) by Age (18-29, 30-44, 45-59, 60+)
- Race/Ethnicity (Non-Hispanic White, Non-Hispanic African American, Non-Hispanic Other, Hispanic, Non-Hispanic 2+ Races)
- Education (Less High school, High school, Some College, Bachelor+)
- Household Income (<\$25K, \$25K<\$50K, \$50K<\$75K, \$75K<\$100K, \$100K<\$150K, and \$150K+)
- ACS language (English Proficient, Bilingual/Spanish Proficient, Non-Hispanic)
- Census Region (Northeast, Midwest, South, West) by Metro status (non-metro, metro)

The California sample was conducted in both English and Spanish. The data were weighted to adjust for gender by age, race/ethnicity, education, household income, and English proficiency. The demographic benchmarks came from geodemographic distributions of the 18 or above California population obtained from the 2019 American Community Survey (ACS). Geodemographic benchmarks used to compute the survey weights include:

- Gender (Male and Female) by Age (18-29, 30-44, 45-59, 60+)
- Race/Ethnicity (Non-Hispanic White, Non-Hispanic African American, Non-Hispanic Other/2+ Races, Hispanic)

- Gender (Male and Female) by Age (18-29, 30-44, 45-59, 60+)
- Race/Ethnicity (Non-Hispanic White, Non-Hispanic African American, Non-Hispanic Other/2+ Races, Hispanic)
- Education (Less High school, High school, Some College, Bachelor+)
- Household Income (<\$25K, \$25K<\$50K, \$50K<\$75K, \$75K<\$100K, \$100K<\$150K, and \$150K+)
- ACS language (English Proficient, Bilingual/Spanish Proficient, Non-Hispanic)





The margin of sampling error among the national sample of adults is plus or minus 3.4 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. The margin of sample errors among the California and Texas adult residents sample are plus or minus 5.0 and 5.2 percentage points, respectively. The margin of sampling error takes into account the design effect, which was 1.23 for the national sample, 1.33 for the California sample, and 1.43 for the Texas sample. The margin of sampling error is higher and varies for results based on sub-samples. In our reporting of the findings, percentage points are rounded off to the nearest whole number. As a result, percentages in a given table column may total slightly higher or lower than 100%. In questions that permit multiple responses, columns may total substantially more than 100%, depending on the number of different responses offered by each respondent.
