

Reuters/Ipsos Poll: Russia/Ukraine Crisis

Topline Findings

Washington, DC, February 24, 2022 – A new Reuters/Ipsos poll, completed Wednesday, February 23, 2022, finds that only a third of Americans approve of the way Joe Biden has been handling the issues with Ukraine (34%) and Russia (32%). It also found that 77% are very or somewhat concerned about the risk of Russia invading Ukraine, a reality as of this morning when Russia initiated a series of strikes in various Ukrainian cities. While two-thirds (66%) of Americans believe the U.S. cannot afford to take military action in Ukraine given the current economic climate, 71% believe doing nothing will encourage Russia to take military action elsewhere in Europe and Asia. However, most Americans (65%) also believe that taking military action in Ukraine would encourage attacks on the United States and the West. Consequently, only 2 out of 5 (38%) Americans support sending troops to Ukraine to help defend them from a Russian invasion, and only 34% support using air strikes to help the Ukrainian army. Most Americans (72%) believe the United States should continue its diplomatic efforts with Russia and place additional economic sanctions against Russia (69%). Finally, when asked who they believe is most to blame for the current situation between Russia and Ukraine, half of Americans (50%) say it is Russian President Vladimir Putin.

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About the Study

These are some of the findings of an Ipsos poll conducted between February 22 and February 23, 2022 on behalf of Thomson Reuters. For this survey, a sample of 1,004 adults age 18+ from the continental U.S., Alaska, and Hawaii was interviewed online in English. The sample includes 420 Democrats, 394 Republicans, and 131 Independents.

The sample was randomly drawn from Ipsos' online panel, partner online panel sources, and "river" Sampling and does not rely on a population frame in the traditional sense. Ipsos uses fixed sample targets, unique to each study, in drawing a sample. After a sample has been obtained from the Ipsos panel, Ipsos calibrates respondent characteristics to be representative of the U.S. Population using standard procedures such as raking-ratio adjustments. The source of these population targets is U.S. Census 2019 American Community Survey data. The sample drawn for this study reflects fixed sample targets on demographics. Posthoc weights were made to the population characteristics on gender, age, race/ethnicity, region, and education.

Statistical margins of error are not applicable to online non-probability polls. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including but not limited to coverage error and measurement error. Where figures do not sum to 100, this is due to the effects of rounding. The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus 3.8 percentage points for all respondents. Ipsos calculates a design effect (DEFF) for each study based on the variation of the weights, following the formula of Kish (1965). This study had a credibility interval adjusted for design effect of the following (n=1,004, DEFF=1.5, adjusted Confidence Interval=+/-5.3 percentage points).

The poll also has a credibility interval of plus or minus 5.9 percentage points for Democrats, plus or minus 6.0 percentage points for Republicans, and plus or minus 10.5 percentage points for independents.
