The price that households in the UK have to pay for their home energy (electricity and/or gas) at the moment



More than four fifths are concerned about the UK's reliance on energy imports and feel there is a chance that energy supplies to people's homes could be affected








How dependent the UK is on energy imports from other countries


And three quarters think the chances of interruptions to energy supply will increase in the next 6 months






There is support for investment to reduce the UK's reliance on imported energy

There is particular support for investment in renewables and improving energy efficiency, though fewer support investments in nuclear or fossil fuel production





And support for investment remains strong even if this leads to increases in energy bills or taxes





Technical notes

- The research was carried out by Ipsos.
- Ipsos interviewed a representative quota sample of 1,027 adults aged 16-75 in Britain using its online i:omnibus on 9th-10th March 2022.
- The sample obtained is representative of the population with quotas on:
 - Age
 - Gender
 - Region
 - Working Status
- The data has been weighted to the known offline population proportions for age, working status and social grade within gender, and for government office region and education, to reflect the adult population of Britain.
- · All surveys are subject to a range of potential sources of error.
