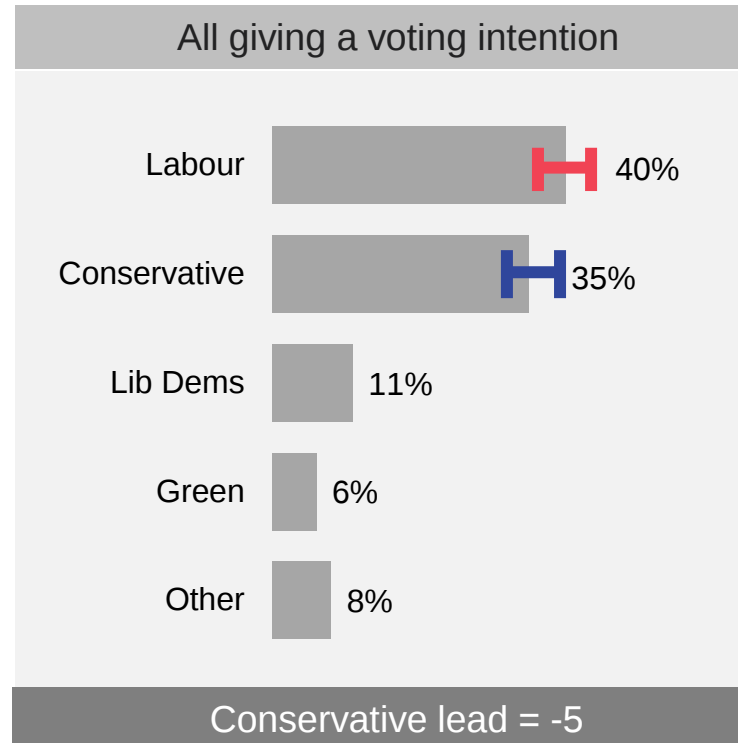
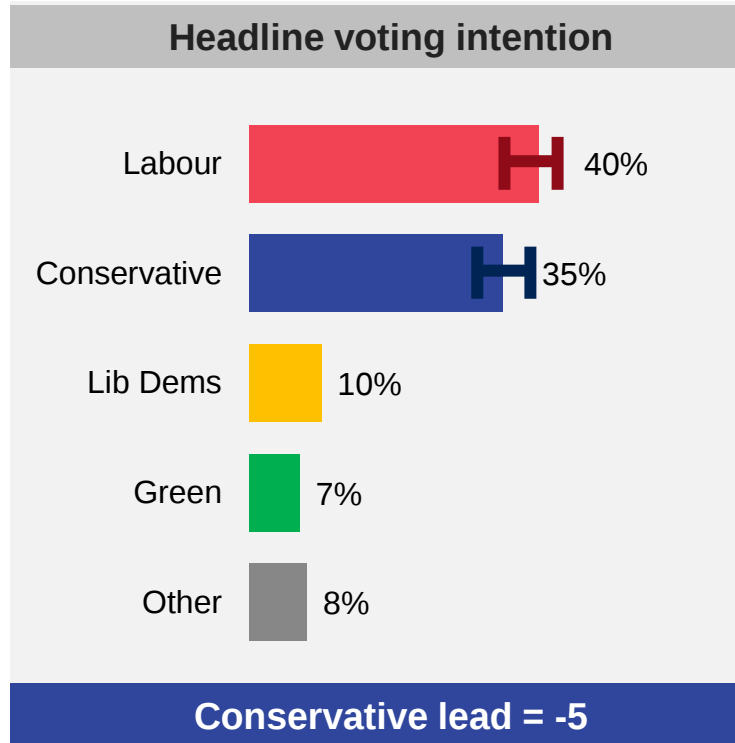

Voting Intention: March 2022

How do you intend to vote in the General Election? Will you vote...?



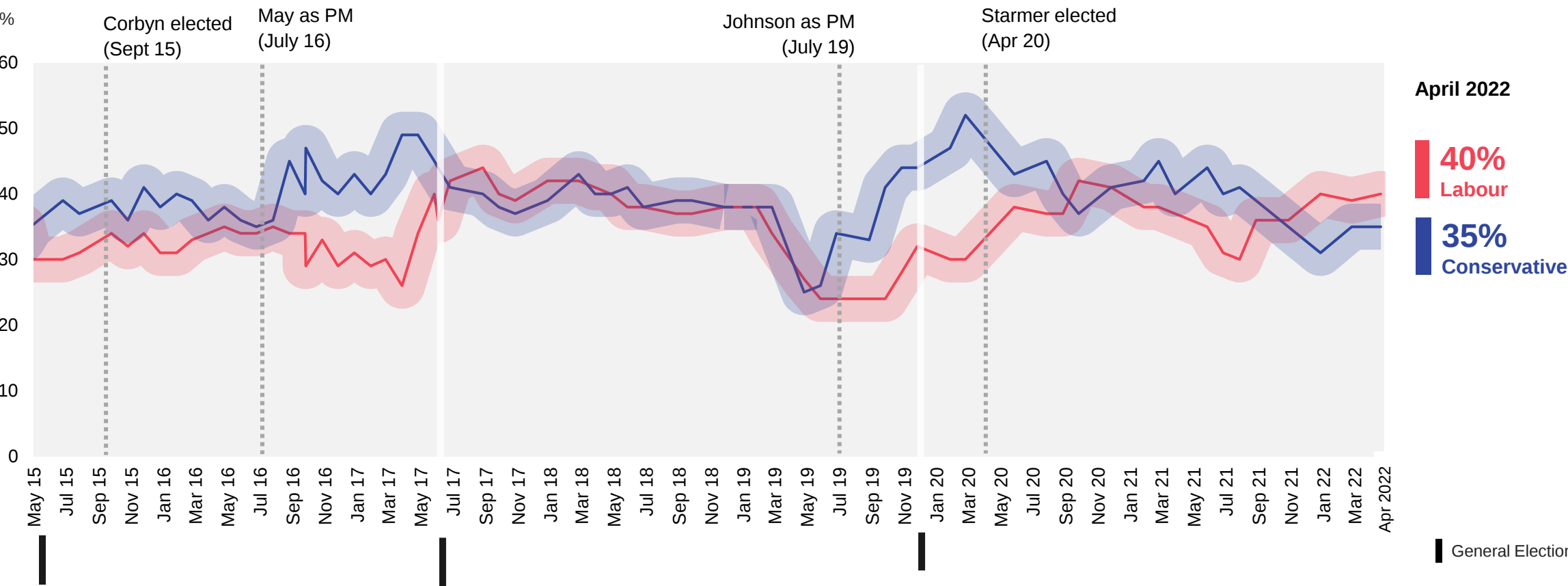
Base: 1,006 British adults 18+, 20th April– 28th April 2022; Headline Voting Intention: all 9/10 certain to vote, always/usually/it depends vote in General Elections = 681. Margin of error is displayed at +/- 4% All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that they lie within 2 points. This is especially important to keep in mind when calculating party lead figures.

How would you vote if there were an election tomorrow?



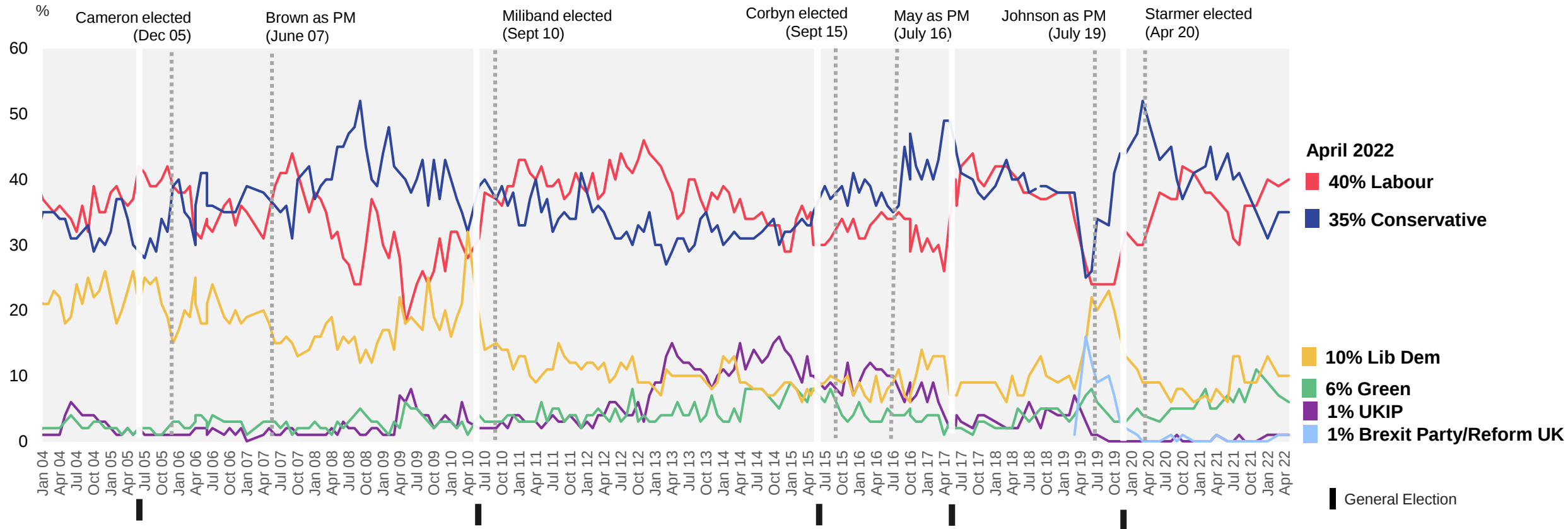

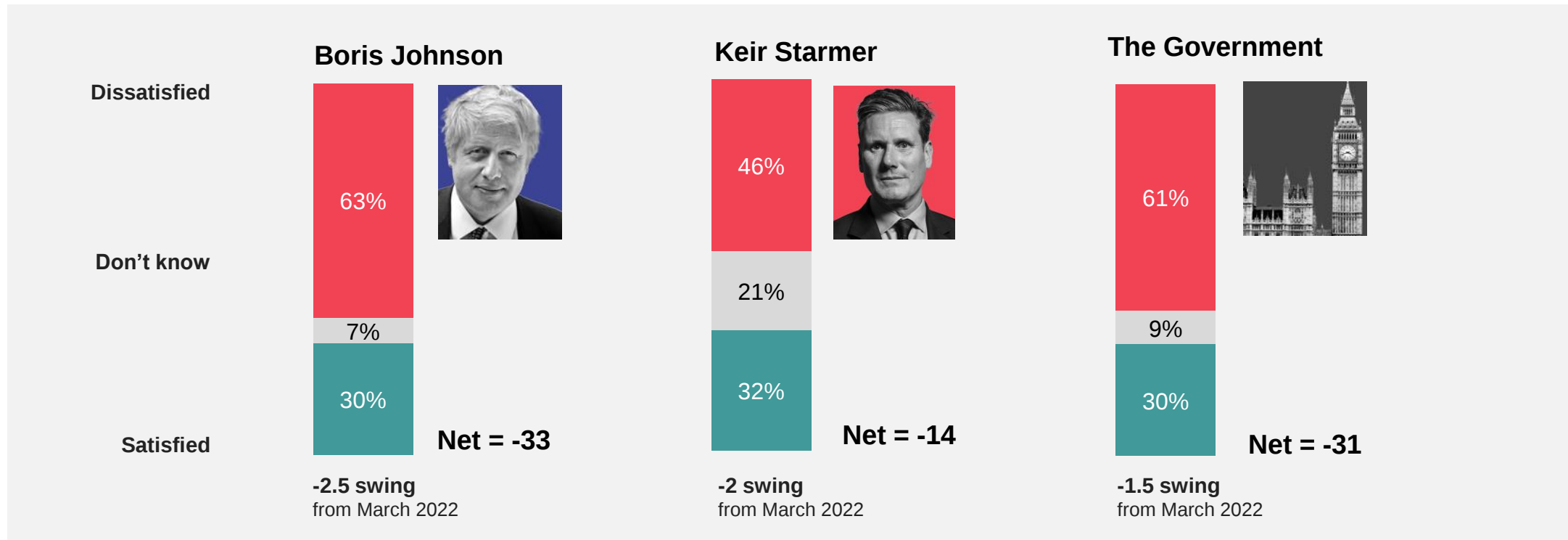

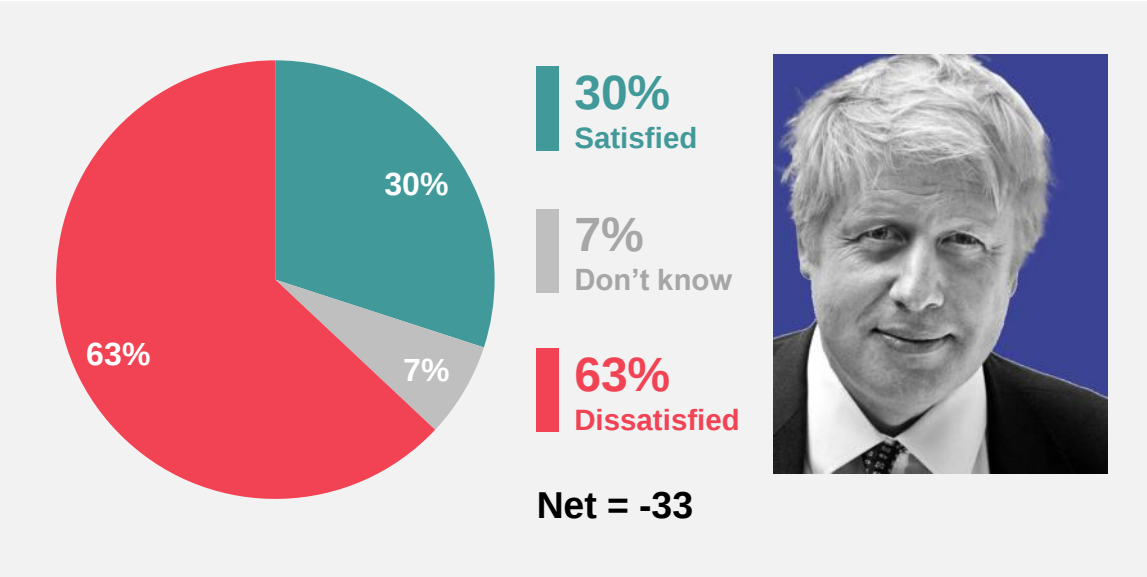

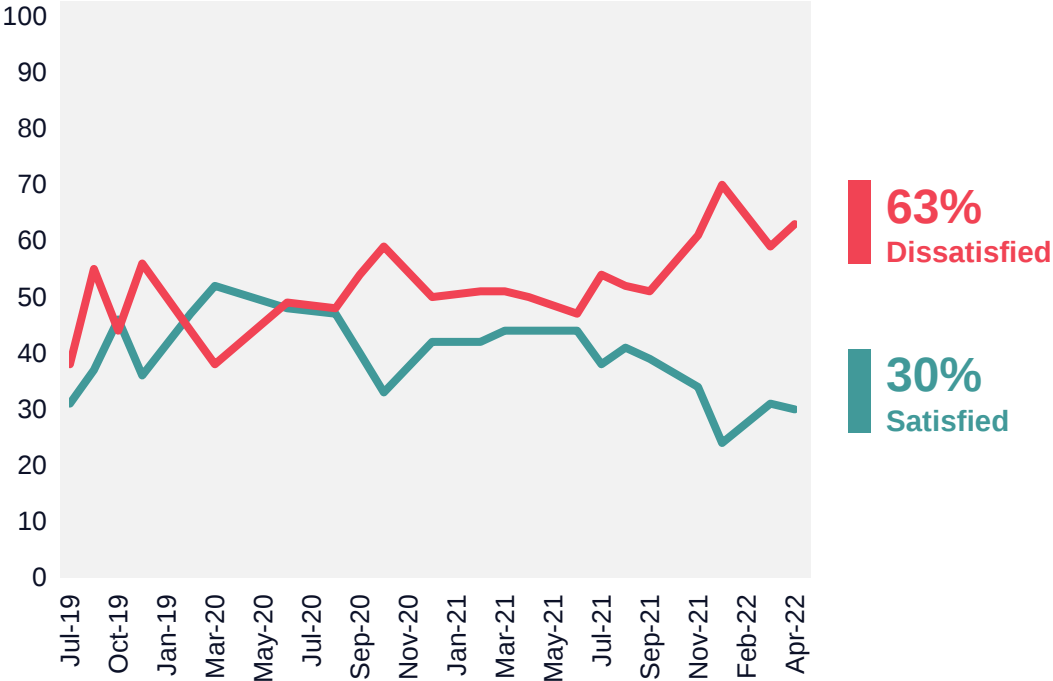

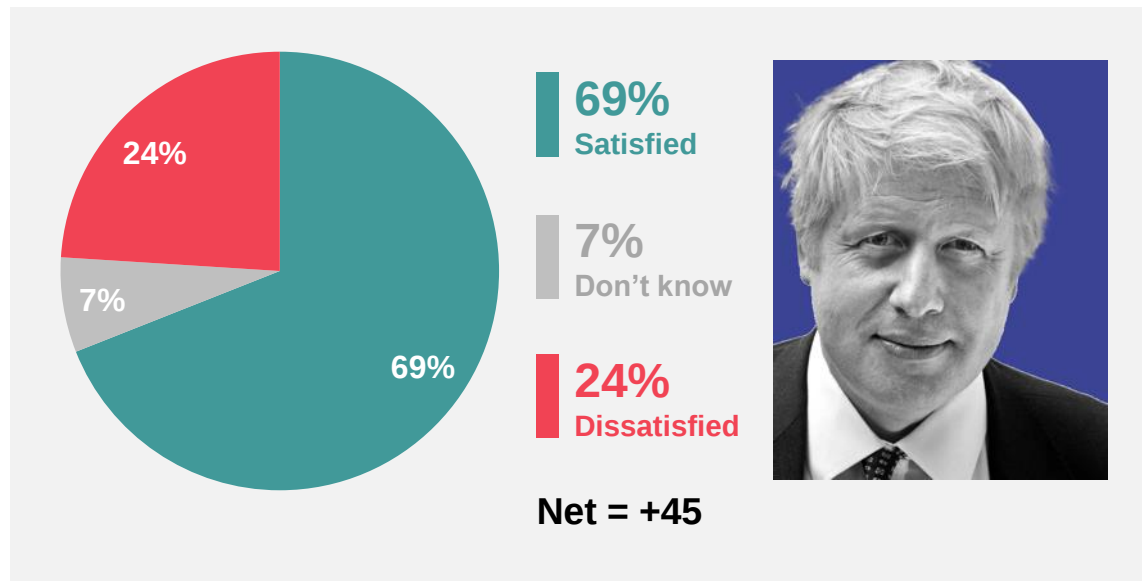

Boris Johnson: Satisfaction among Conservative supporters

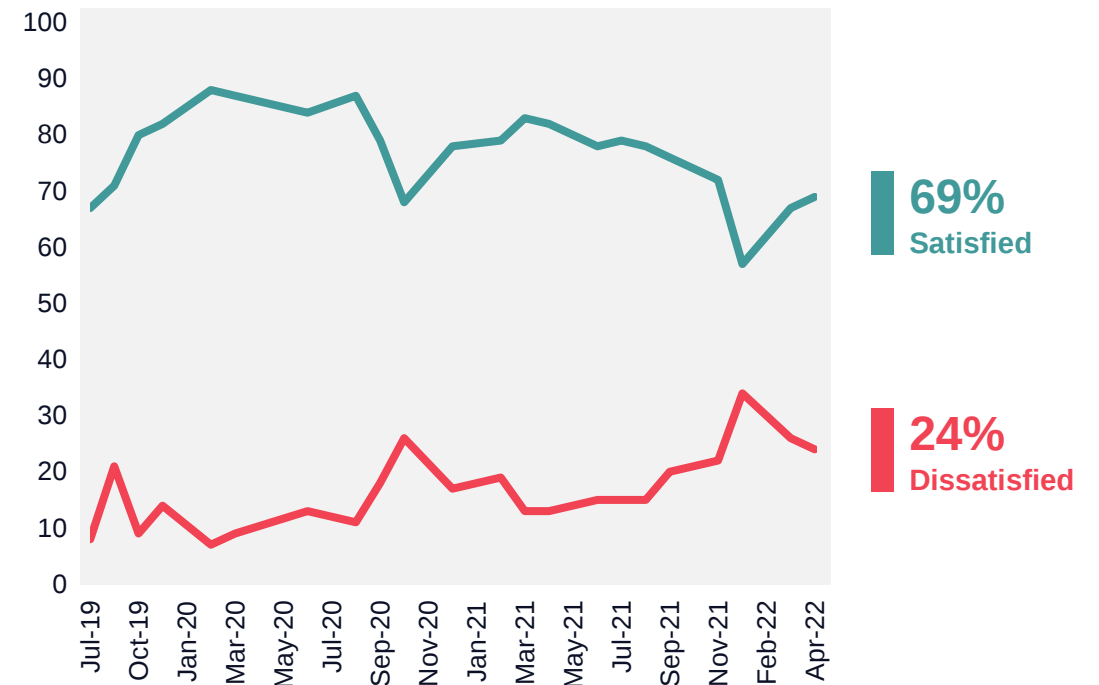

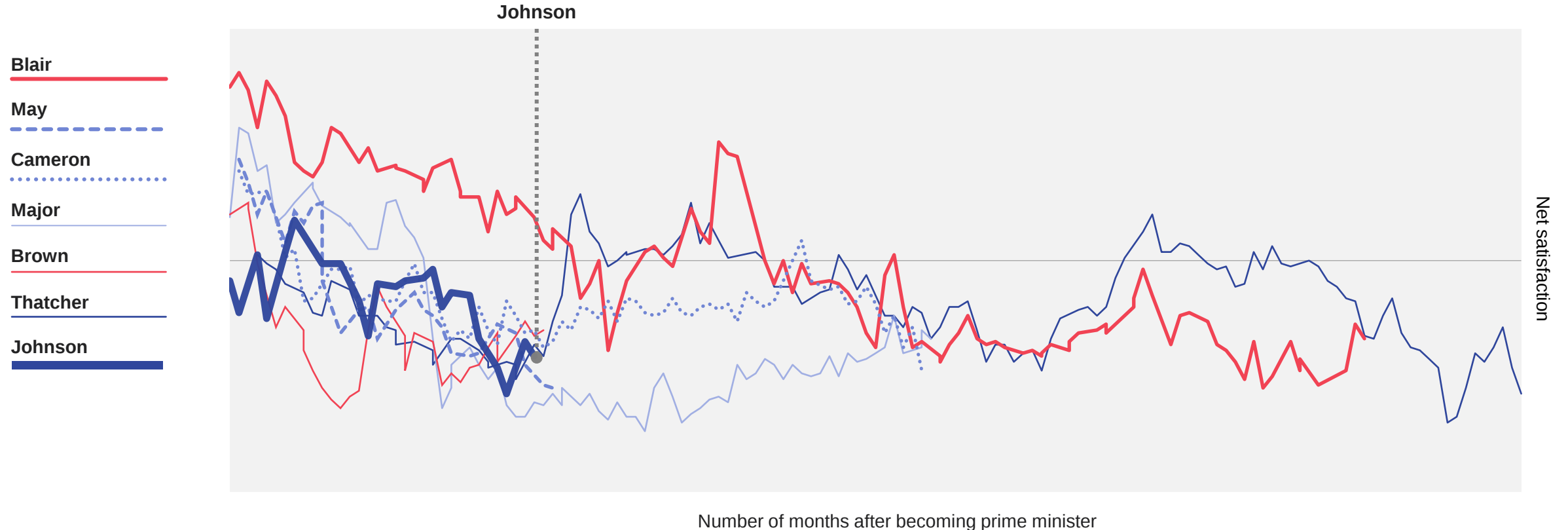

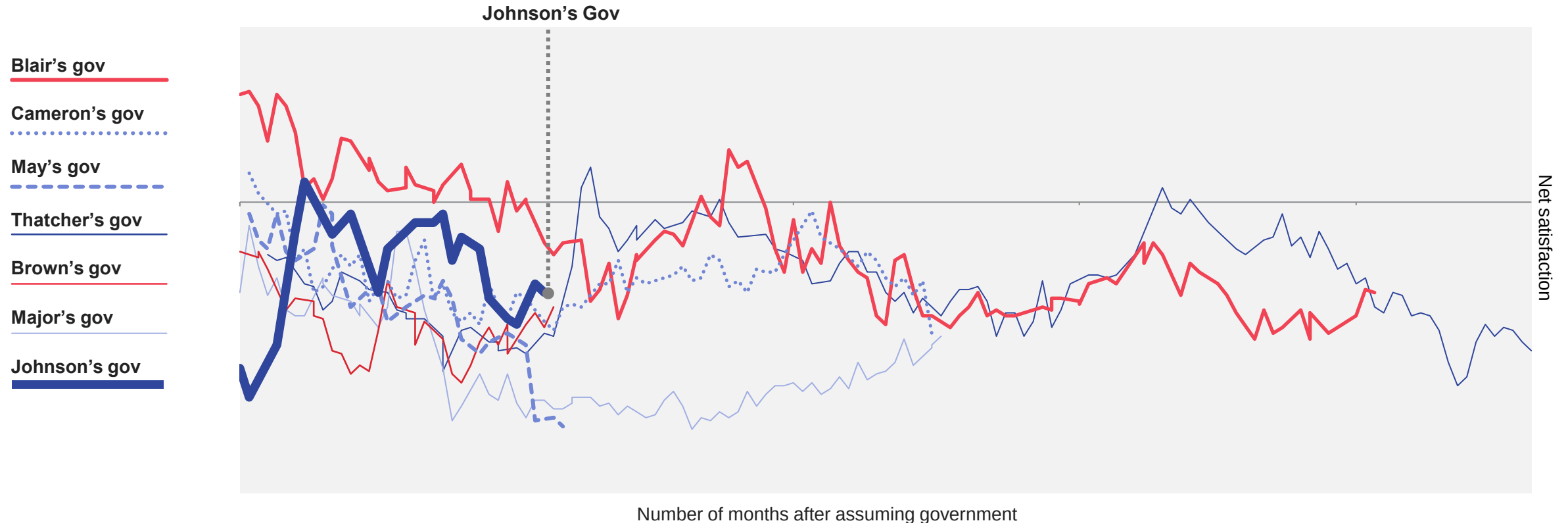

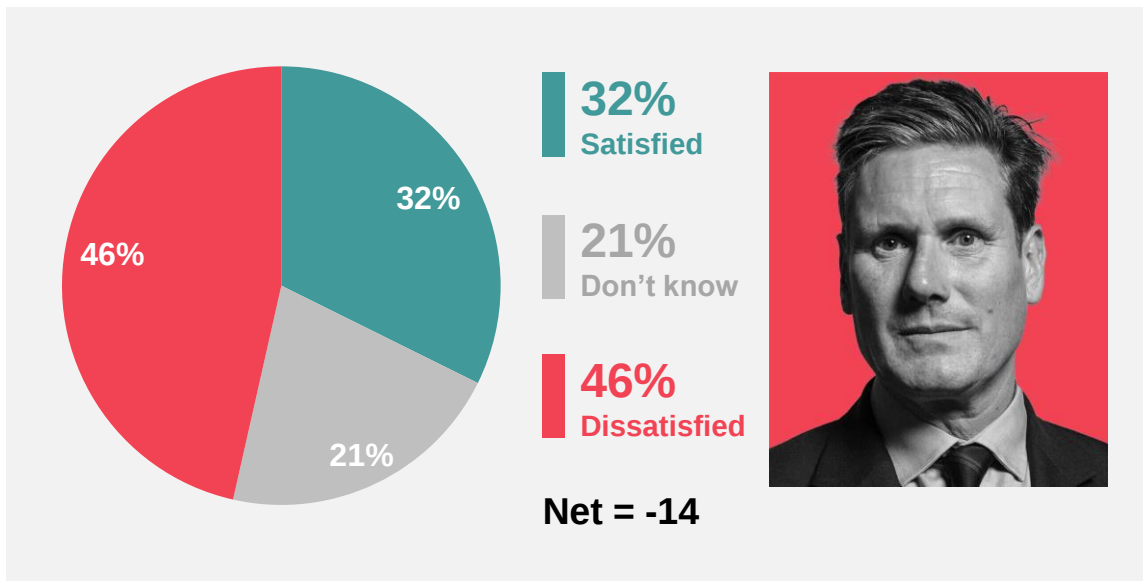

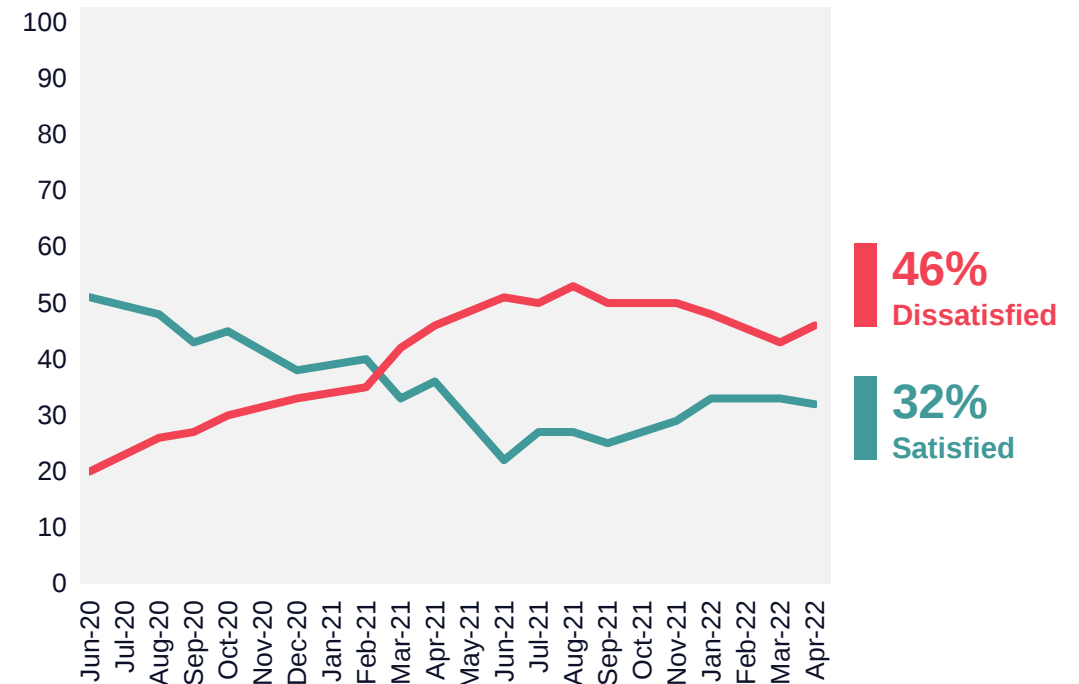

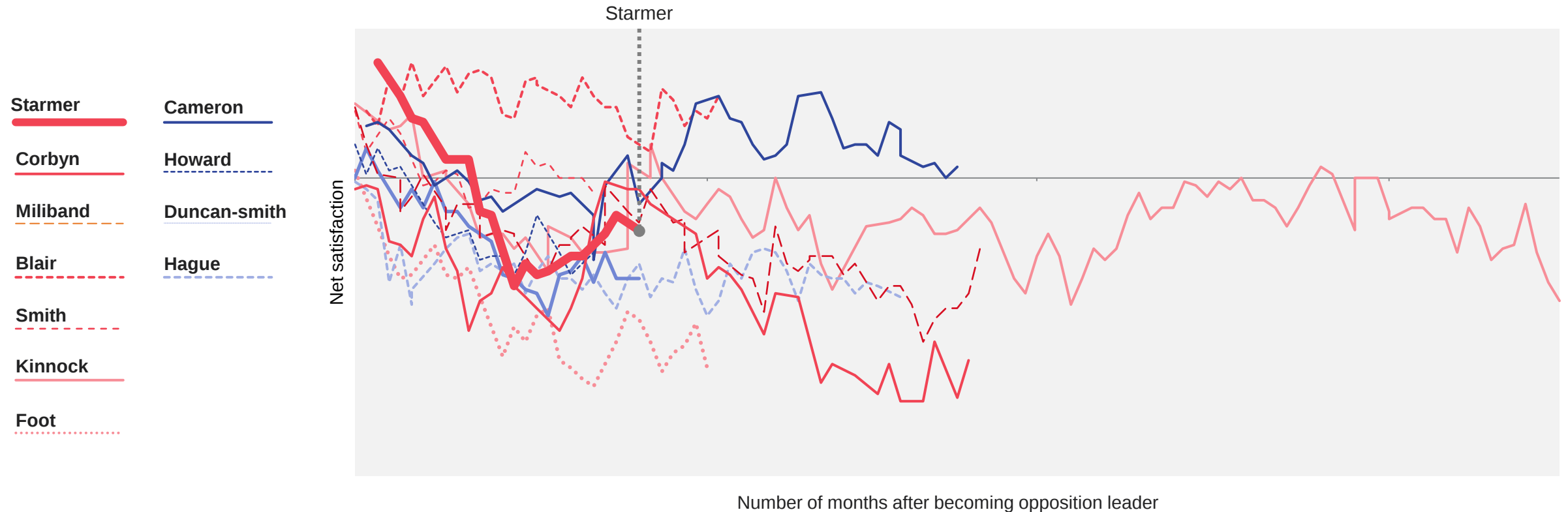

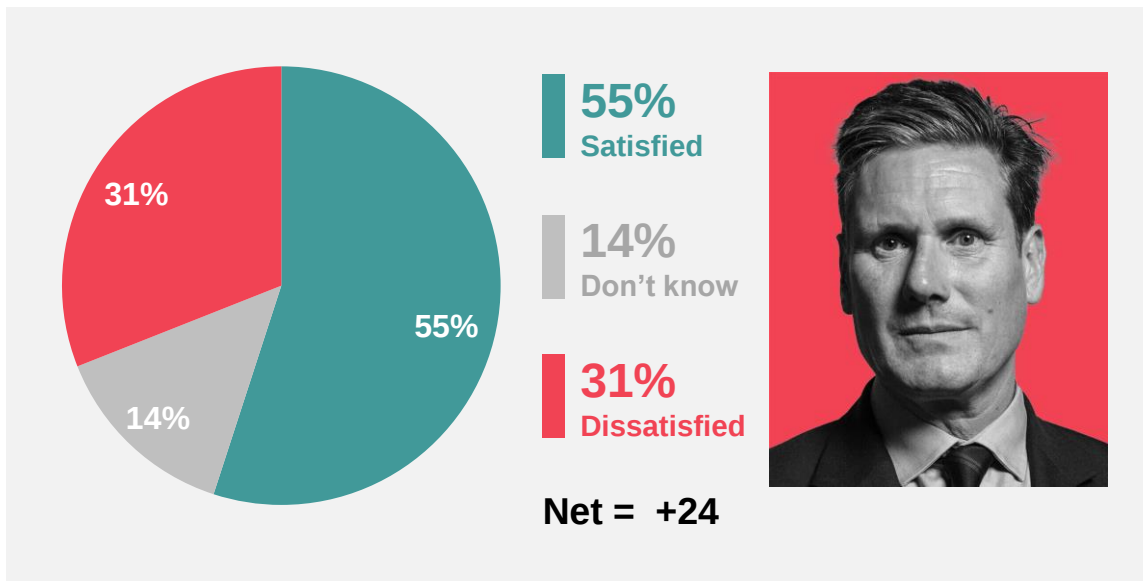

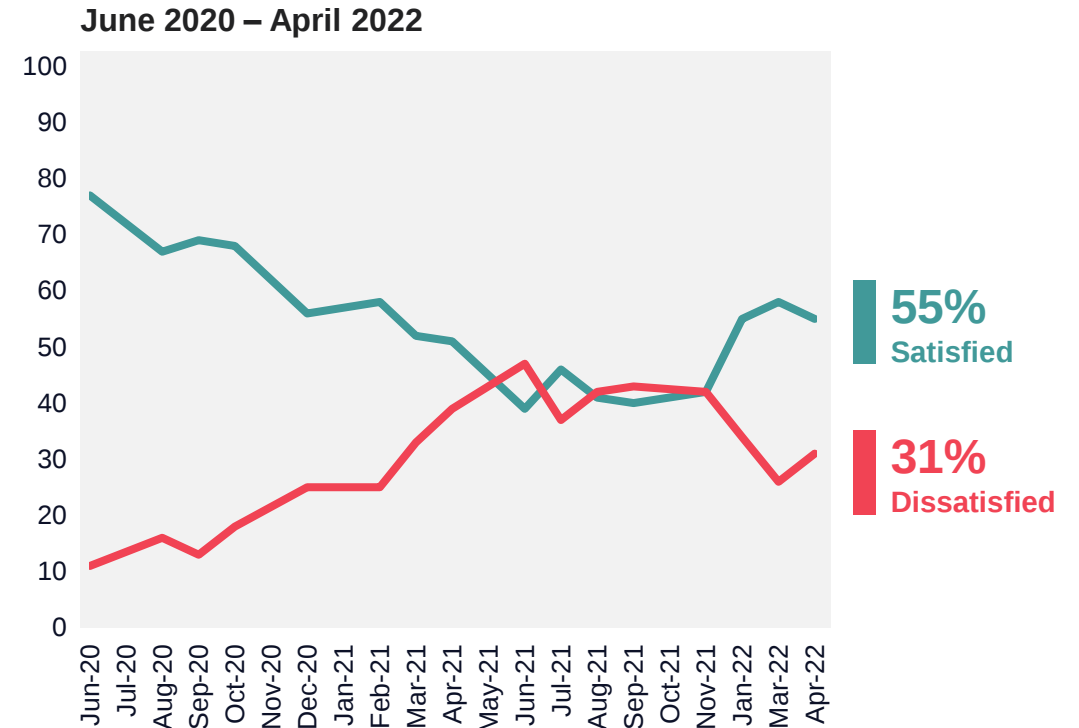
Keir Starmer: Satisfaction amongst Labour supporters

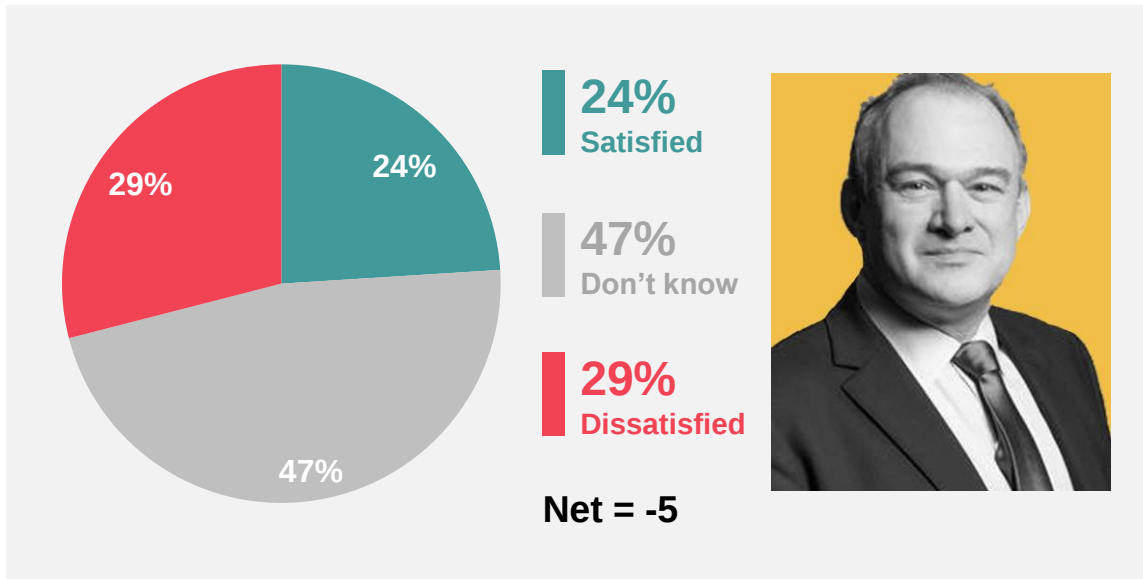

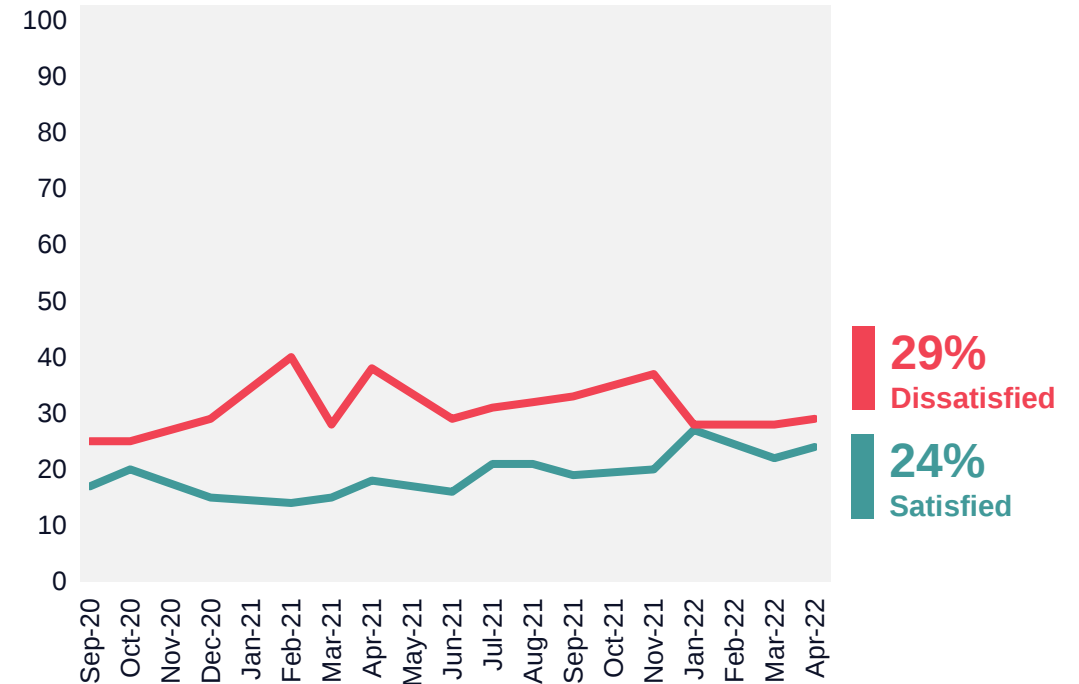

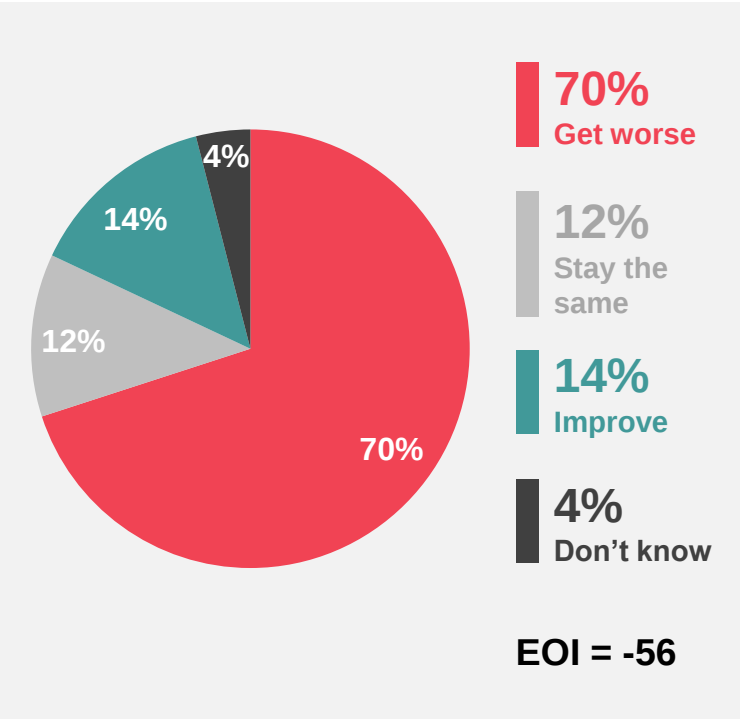

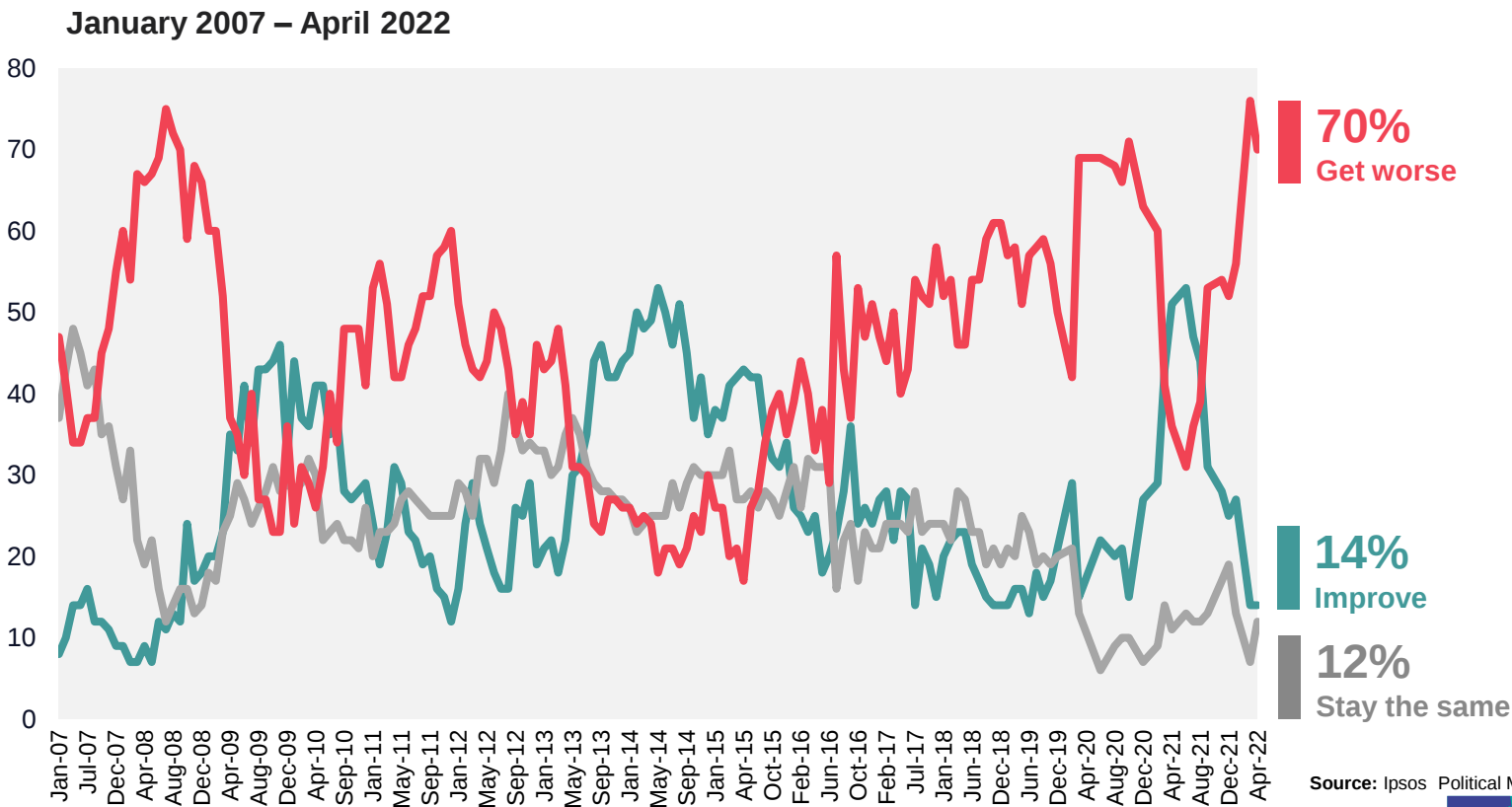
Economic Optimism Index

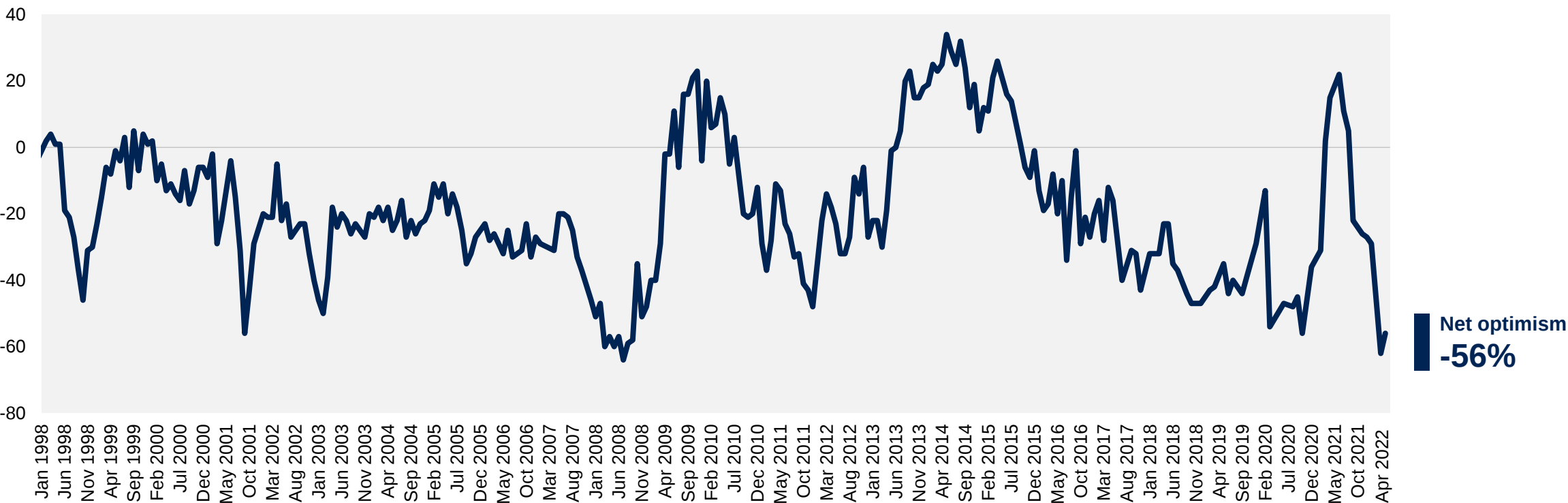

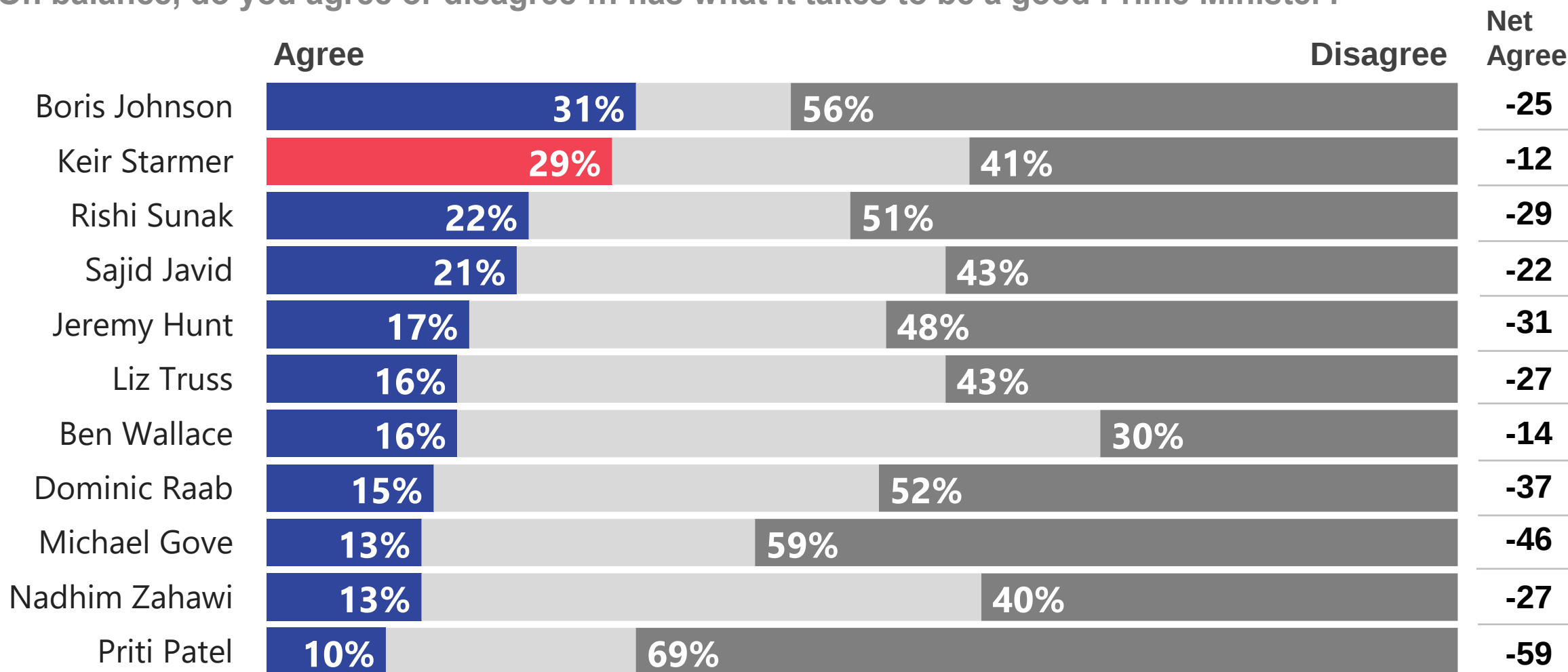

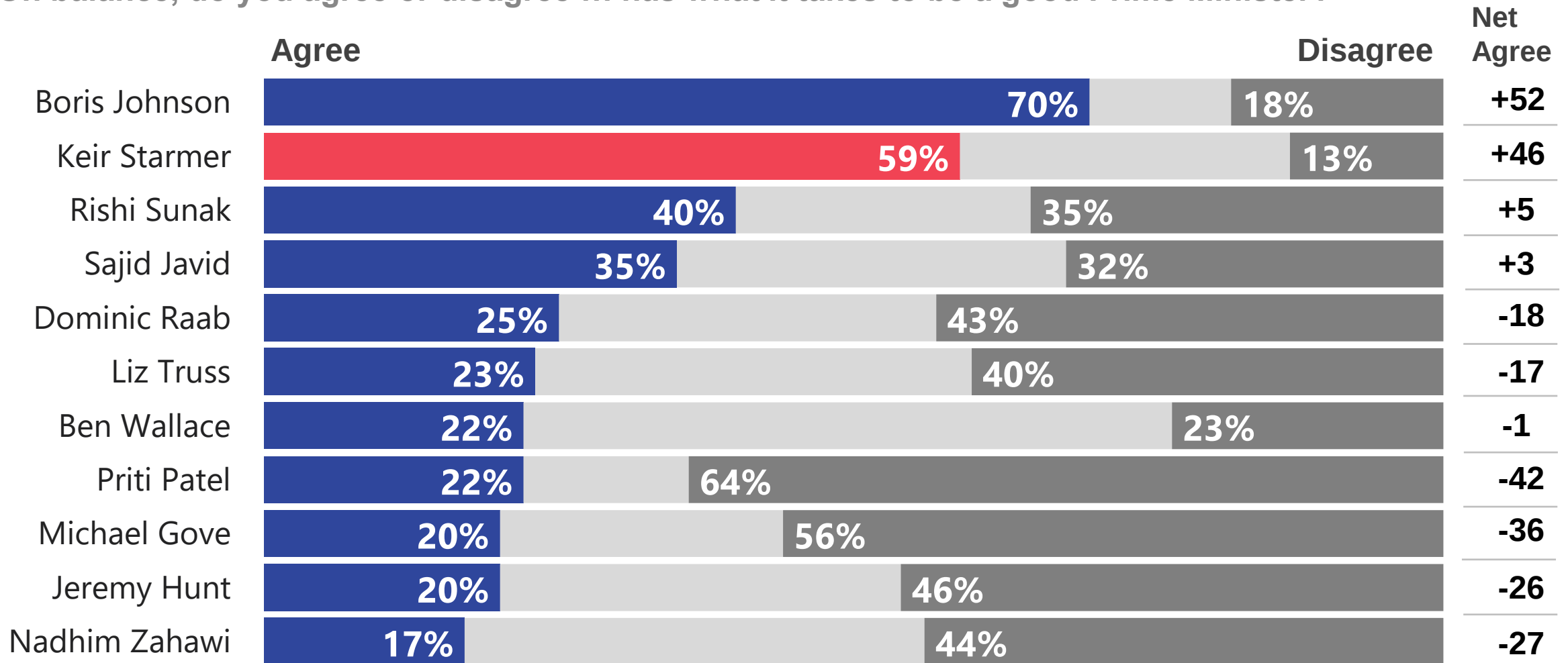

On balance, do you agree or disagree ... has what it takes to be a good Prime Minister?



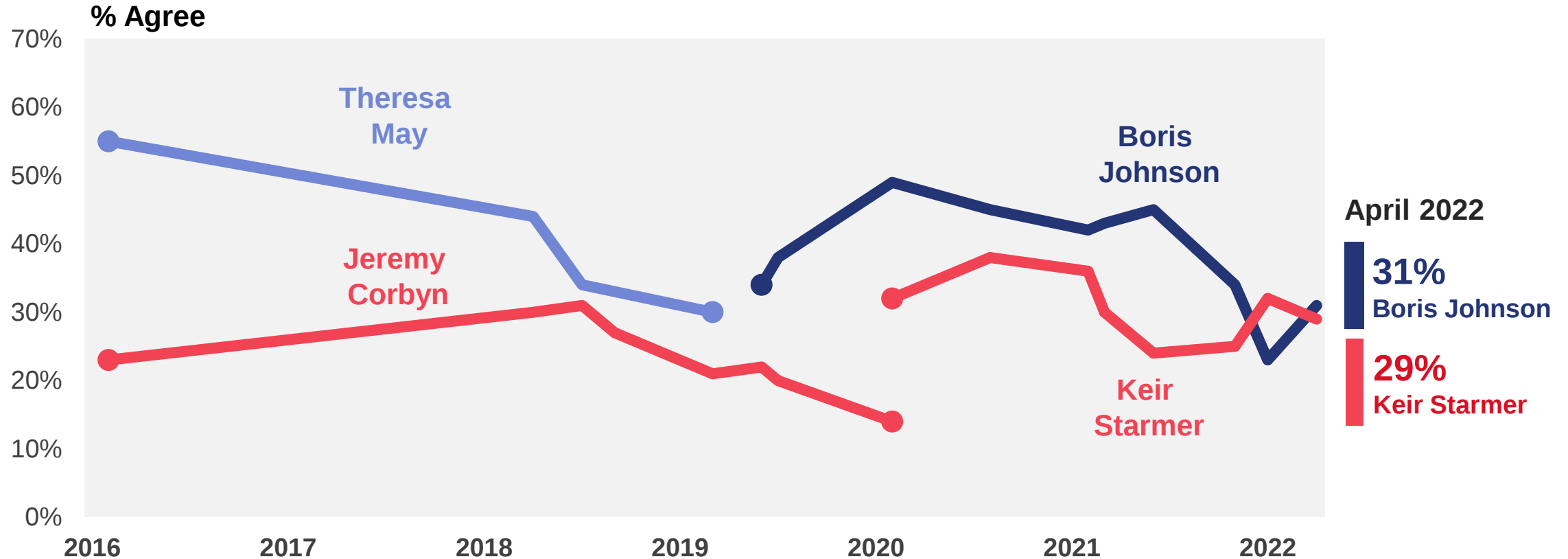

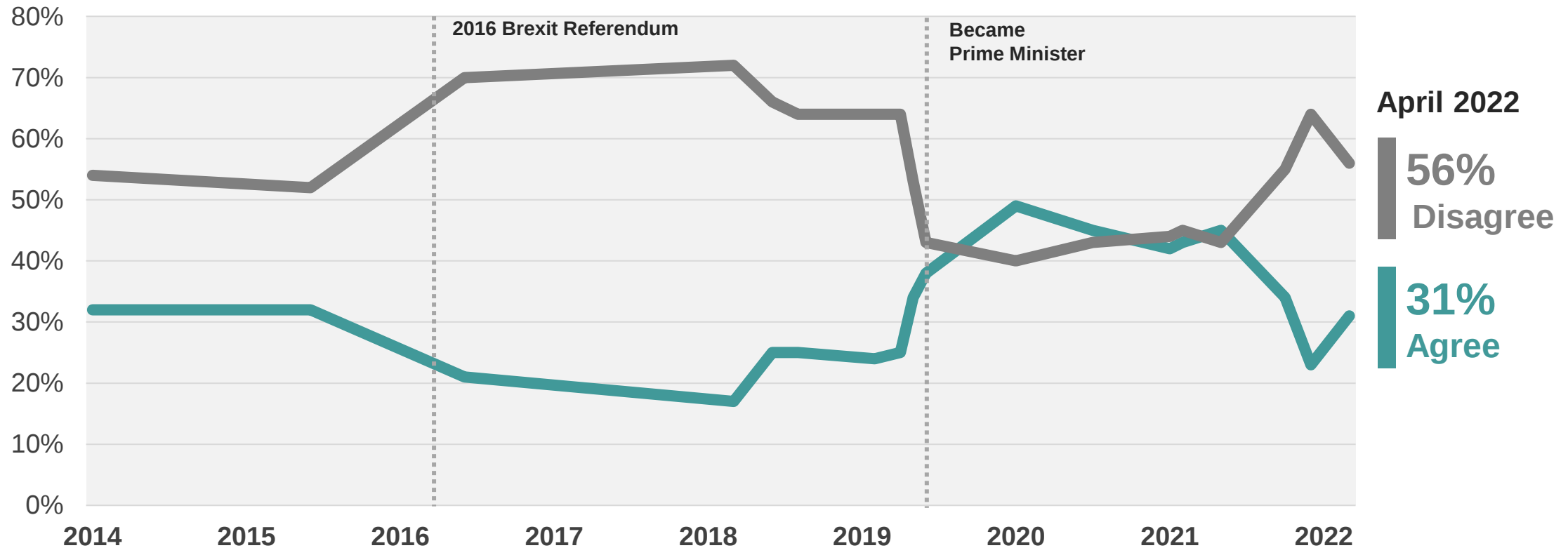

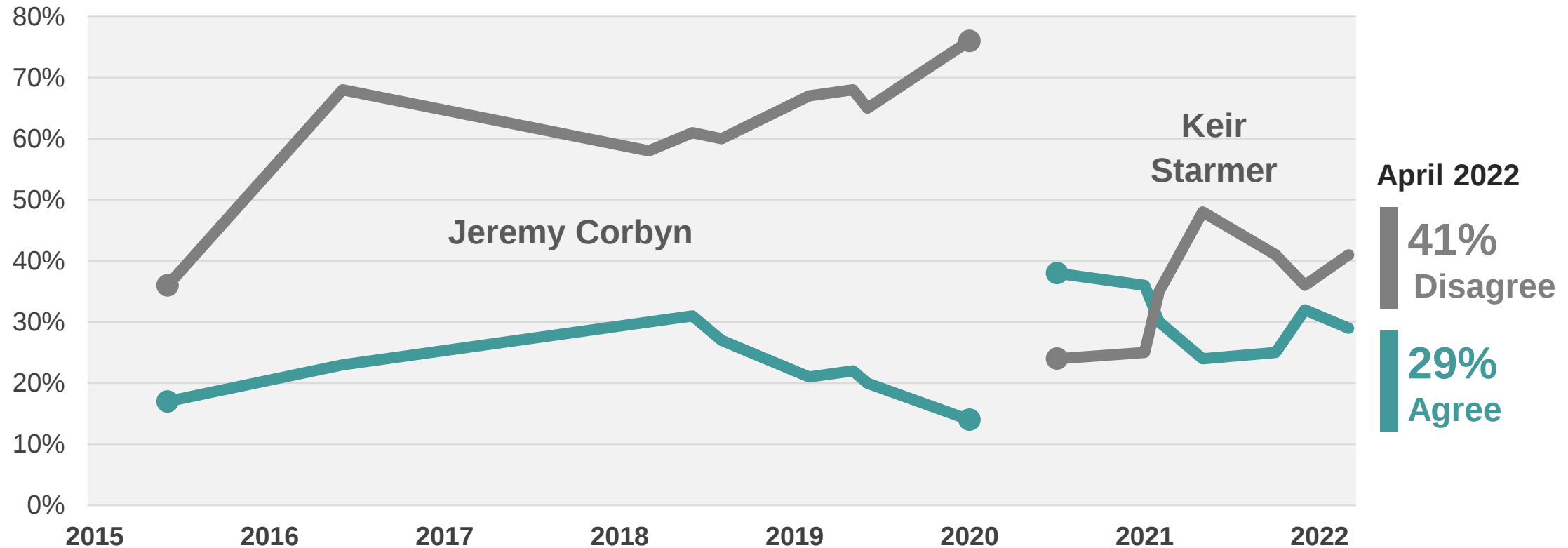

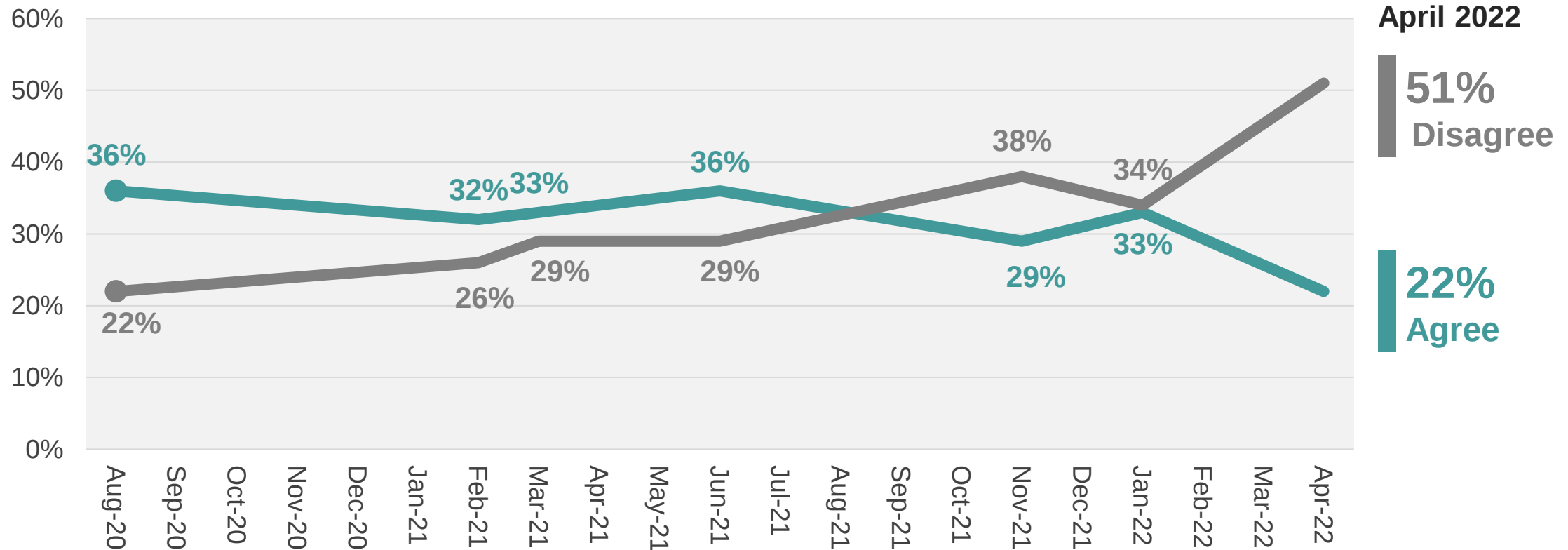

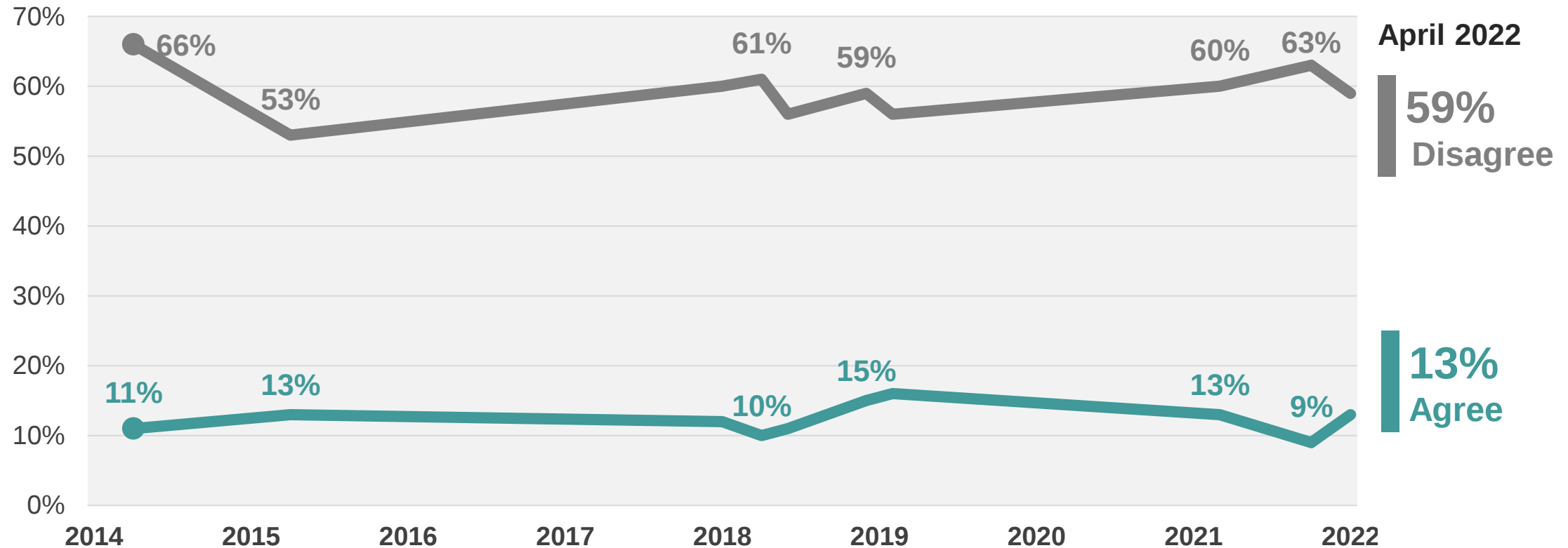

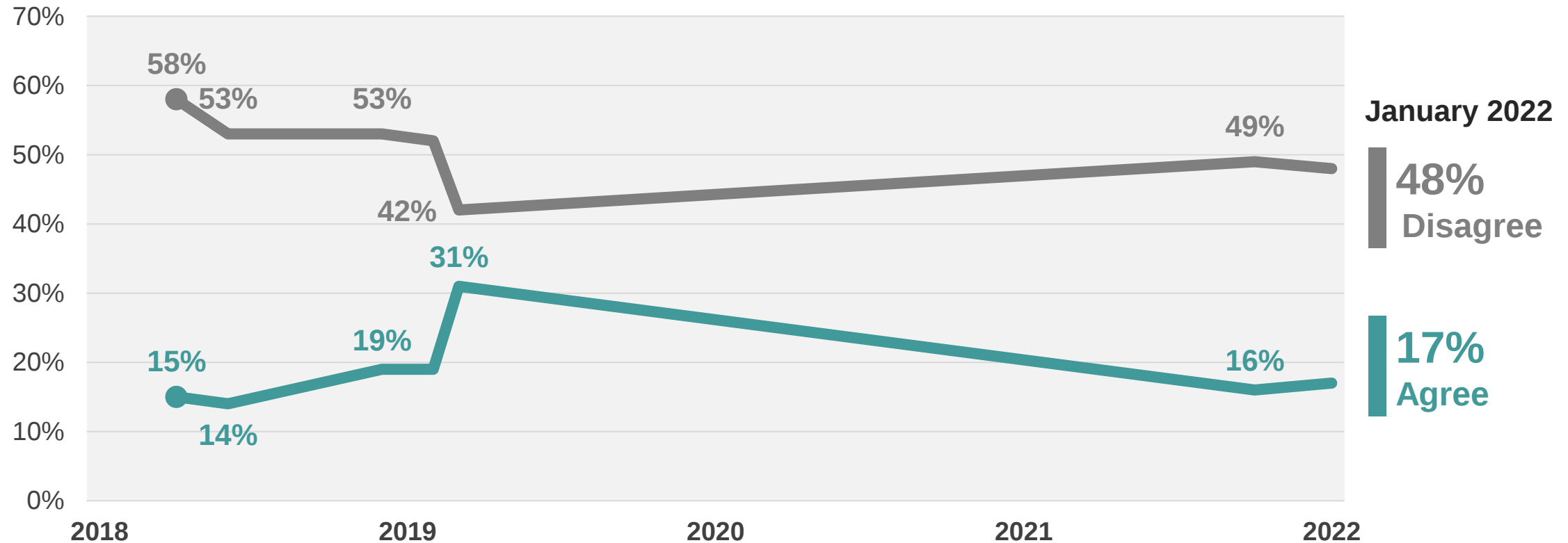

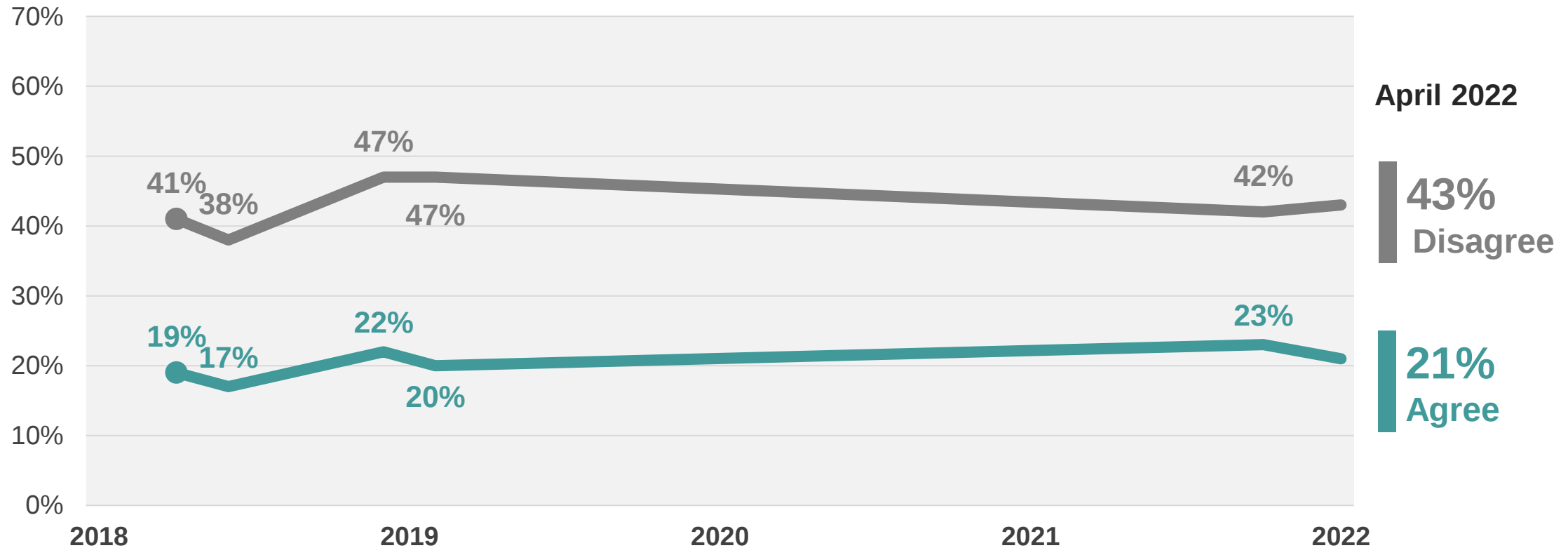

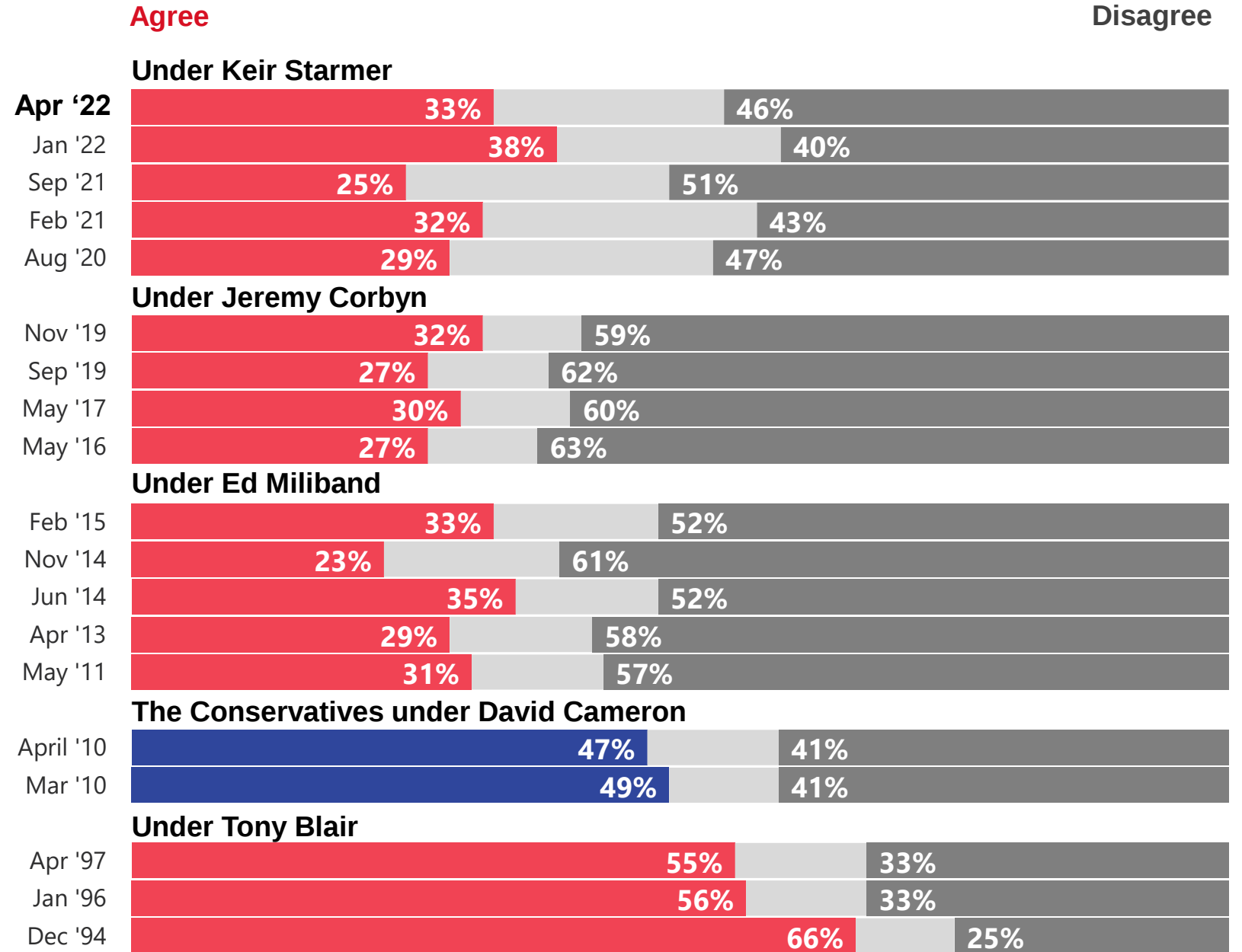

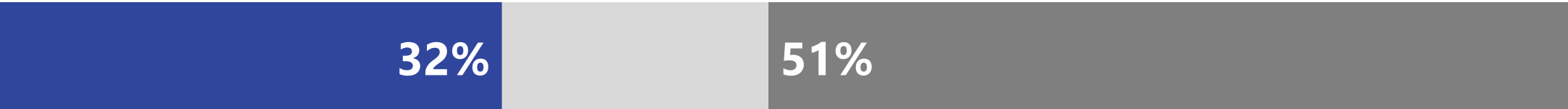

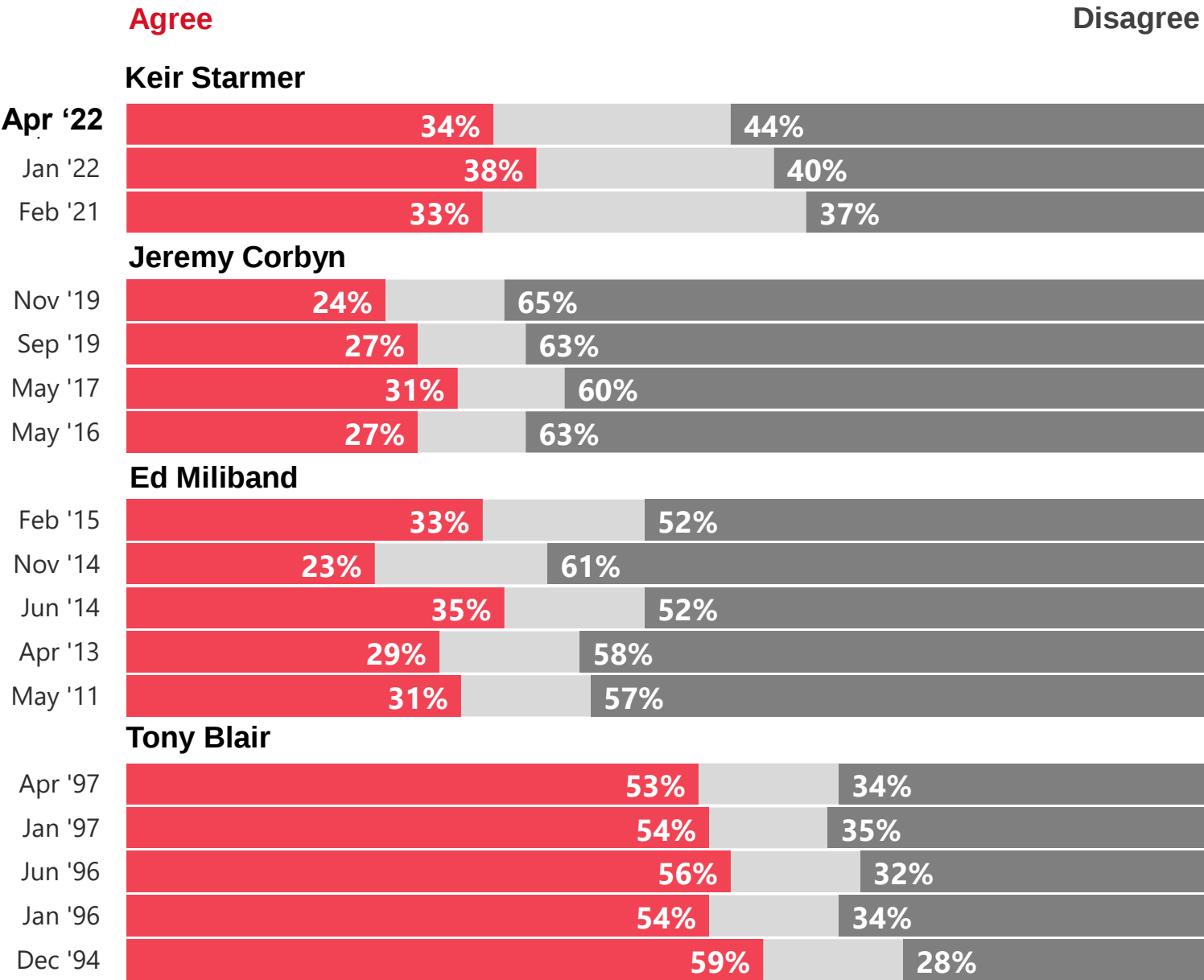

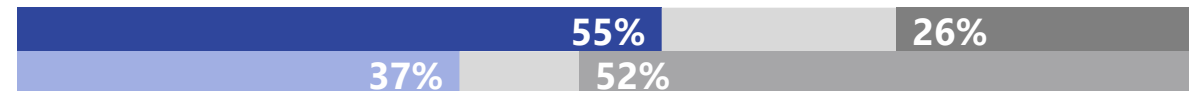

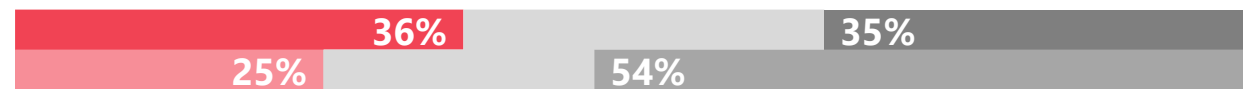

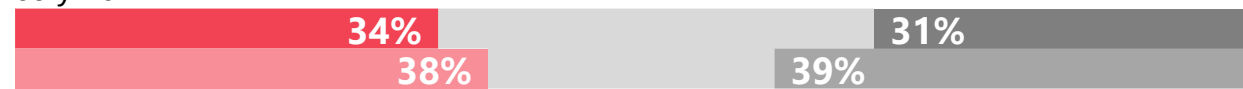

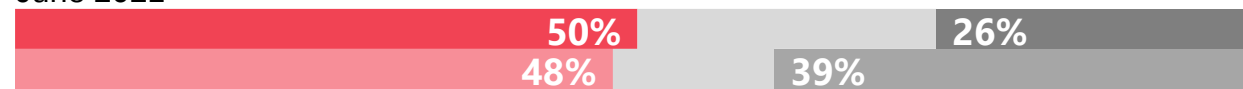

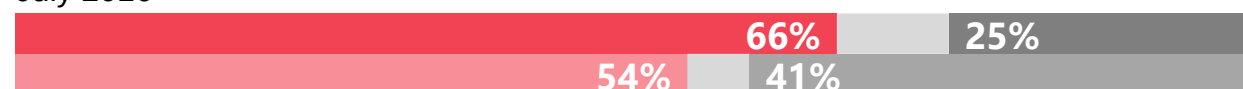

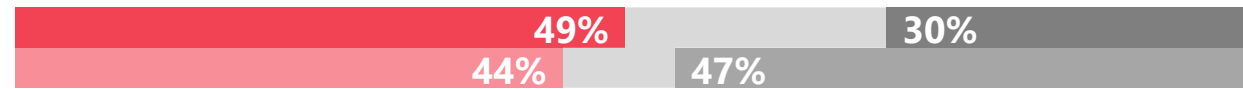

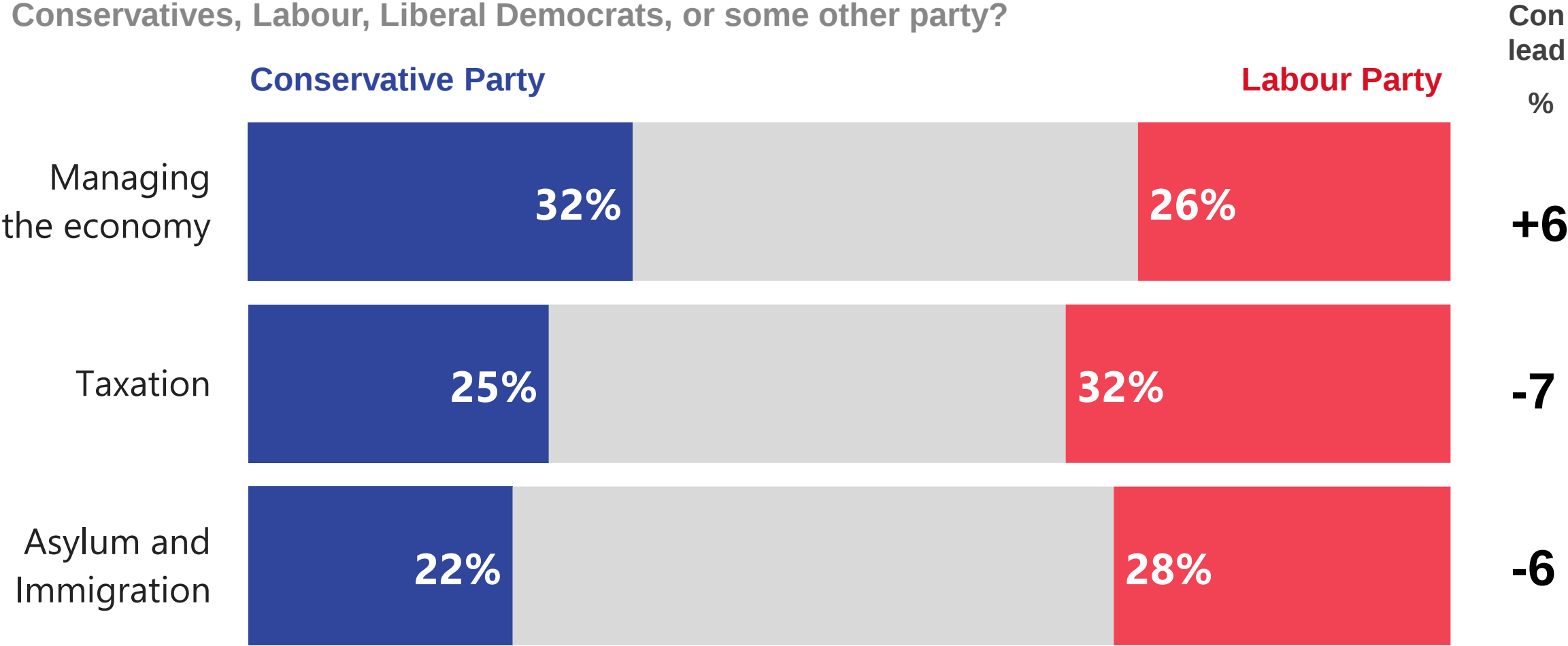

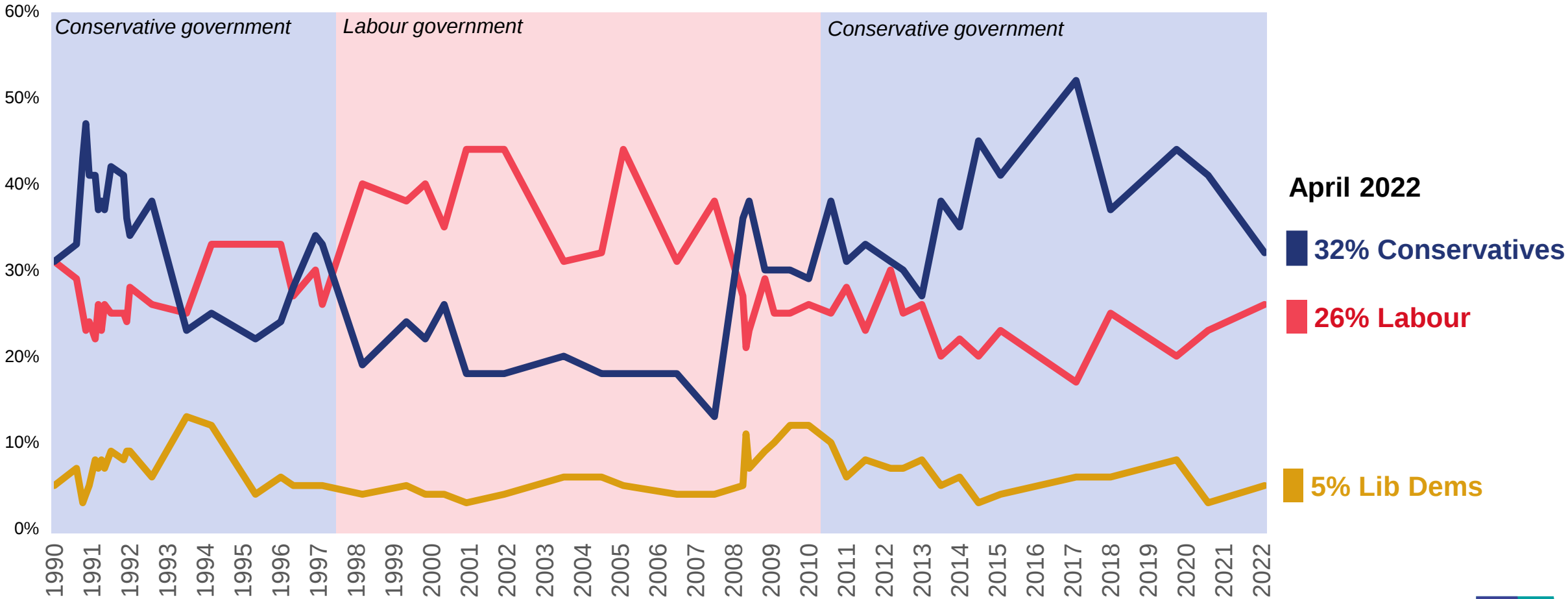
Which party do you think has the best policies on ... the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats, or some other party?

Which party do you think has the best policies on managing the economy, the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats or some other party?



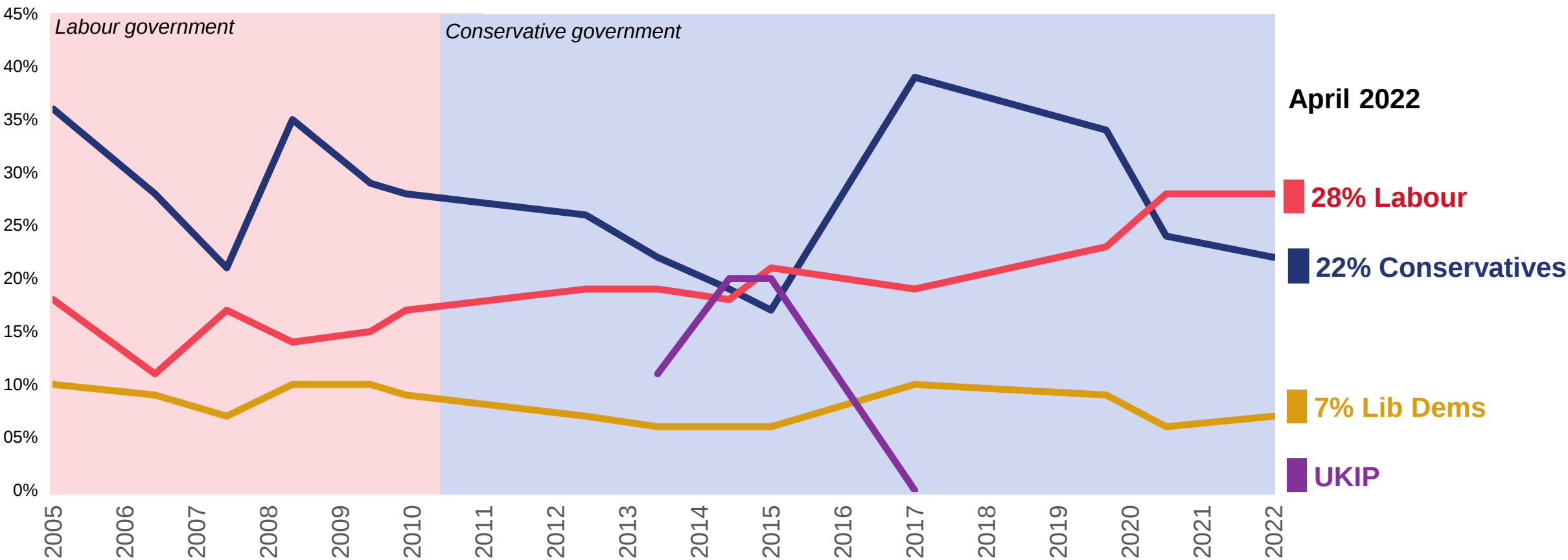

Which party do you think has the best policies on asylum and immigration, the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats or some other party?



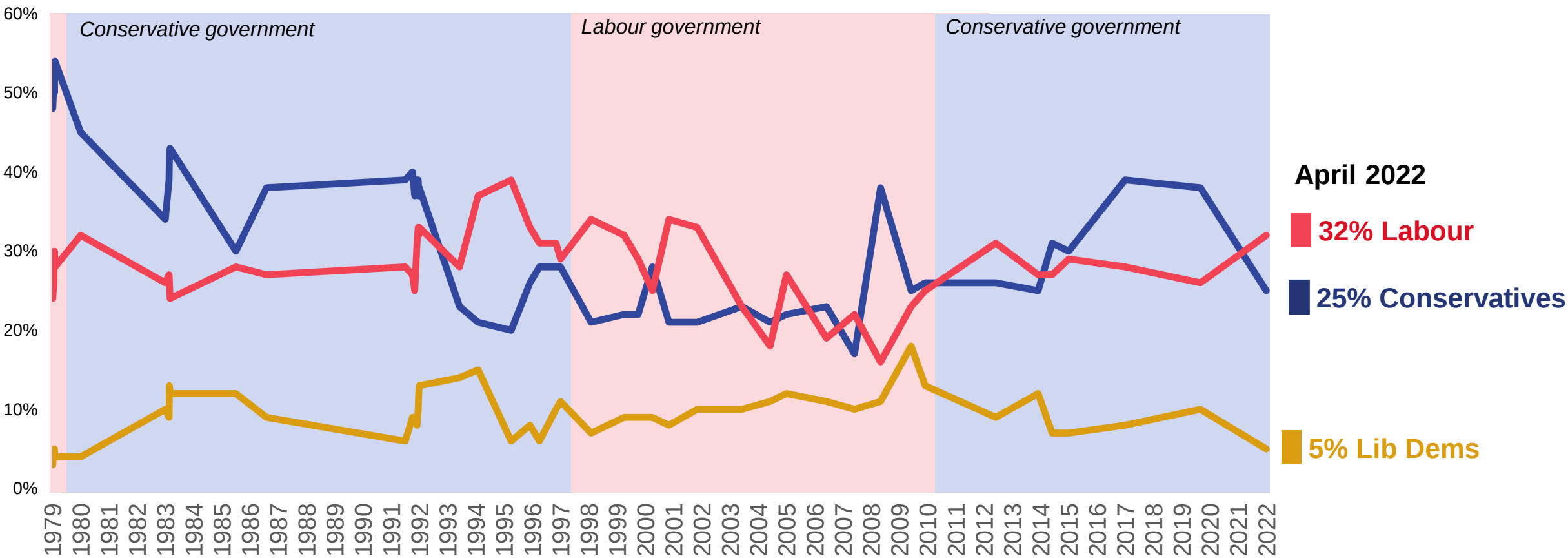

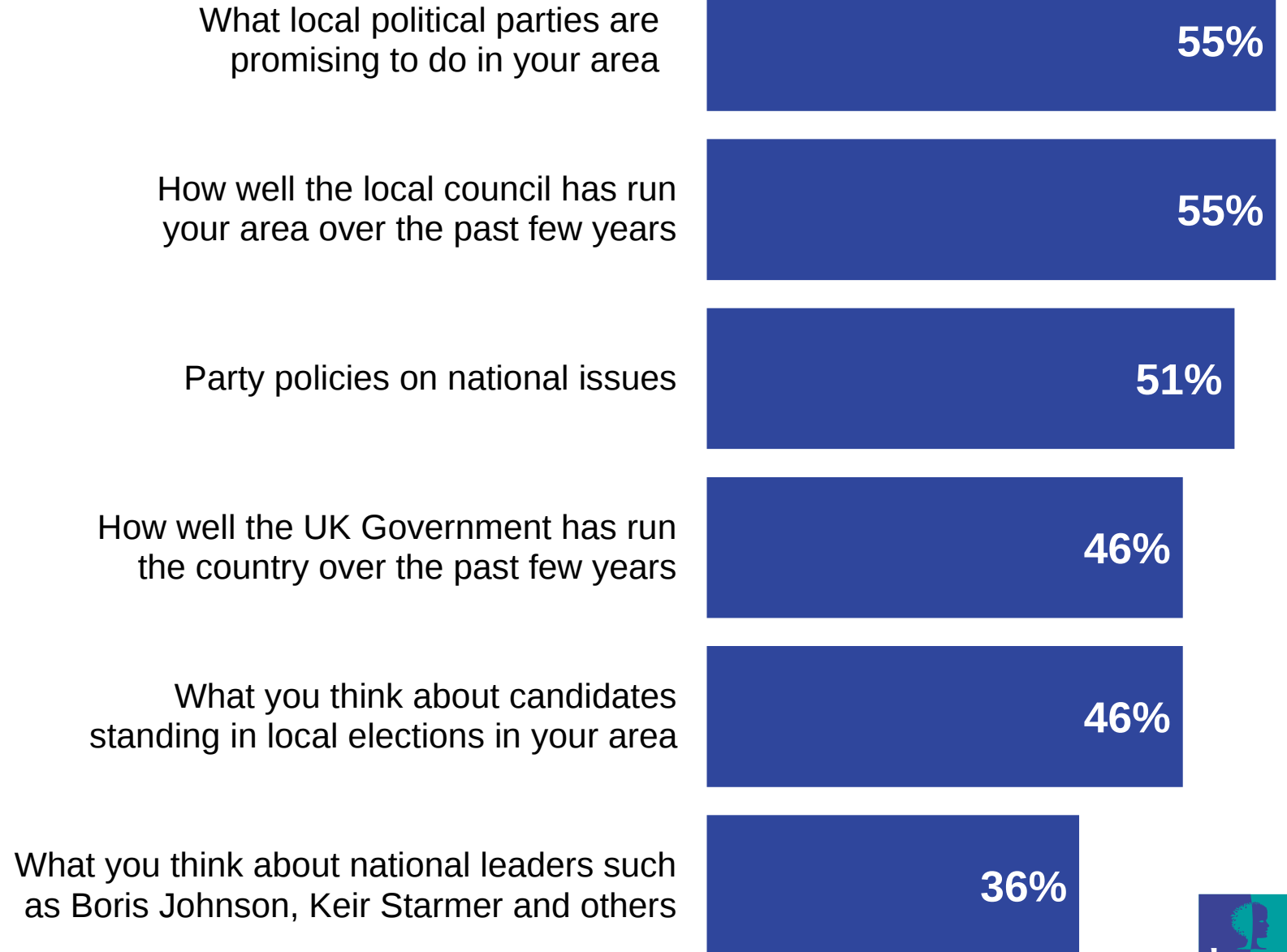

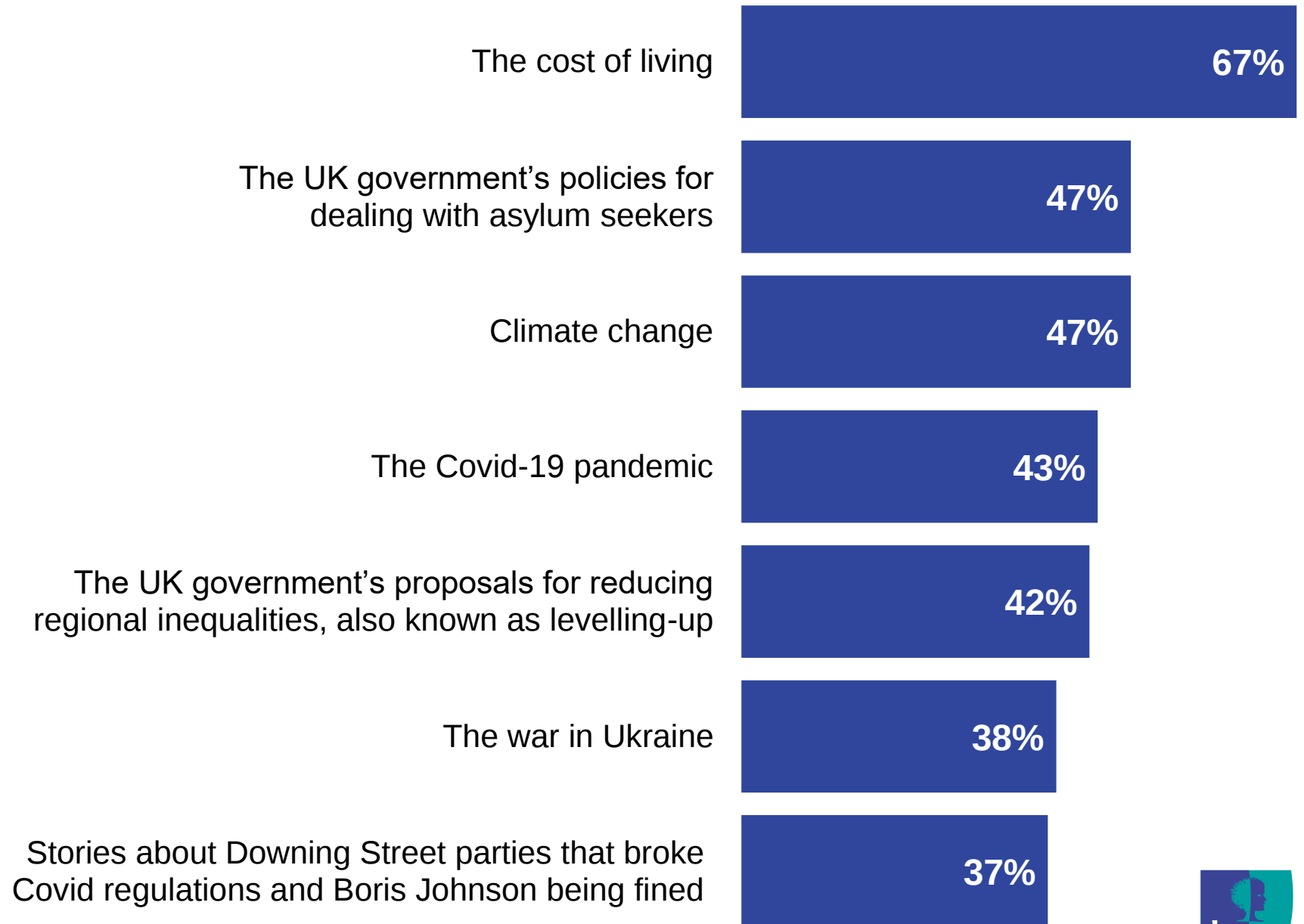
