

To what extent, if at all, do you think Prince Charles would do a good job or bad job as King?





To what extent, if at all, do you think Prince Charles would do a good job or bad job as King?



To what extent, if at all, do you think Prince Charles would do a good job or bad job as King?





To what extent, if at all, do you think Prince William would do a good job or bad job as King?





Likely



Do you think that the Queen should abdicate at some stage, or should she remain Queen as long as possible?






Britons are split over whether the Royal Family is an expensive luxury the country cannot afford

Technical notes

- The research was carried out by Ipsos UK.
- Ipsos UK interviewed a representative quota sample of 1,039 adults aged 16-75 in Great Britain. Interviews took place on the online Omnibus using the Ipsos.Digital platform between 13th and 14th May 2022.
- The sample obtained is representative of the population with quotas on:
 - o Age
 - \circ Gender
 - o Region
 - Working Status
 - Social Grade
- The data has been weighted to the known offline population proportions for age, working status and social grade within gender, and for government office region and education, to reflect the adult population of Great Britain.
