


How closely have you followed these news stories?




Six in ten Britons think workers have too little power in Britain today. Public are more split on trade unions / employers.




The large majority of Britons think it is important to have trade unions to protect workers' interests

Majority of Britons say most strikes in recent years caused unnecessary disruption, but two in five say they were mostly justified


Thinking about the strikes you are aware of in recent years, generally speaking, how often, if at all, would you say...?



When prompted with the causes and consequences of the strikes, support for them rises slightly

The planned strikes mean that only around a fifth of rail services will run on strike days and about 60% on non-strike days. The railway unions are protesting against job cuts, pay freezes and changes to railway workers' employment terms and conditions. 
