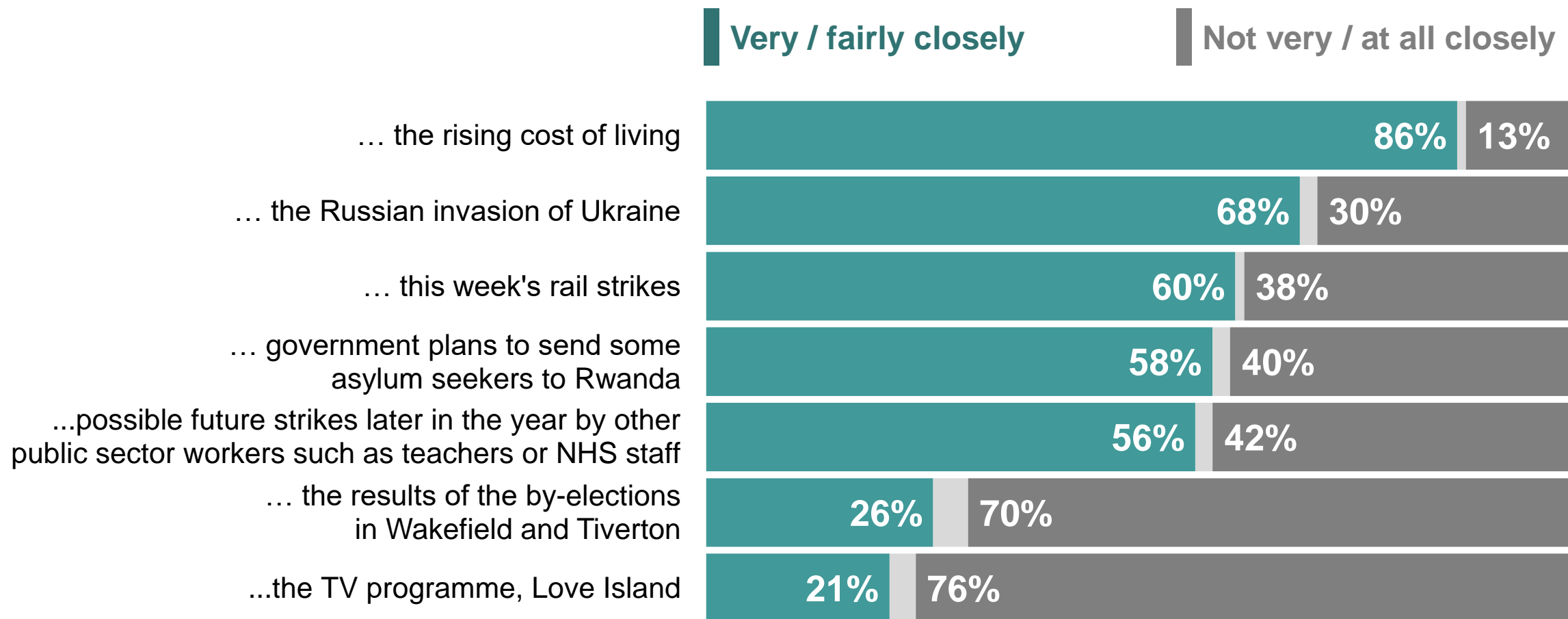

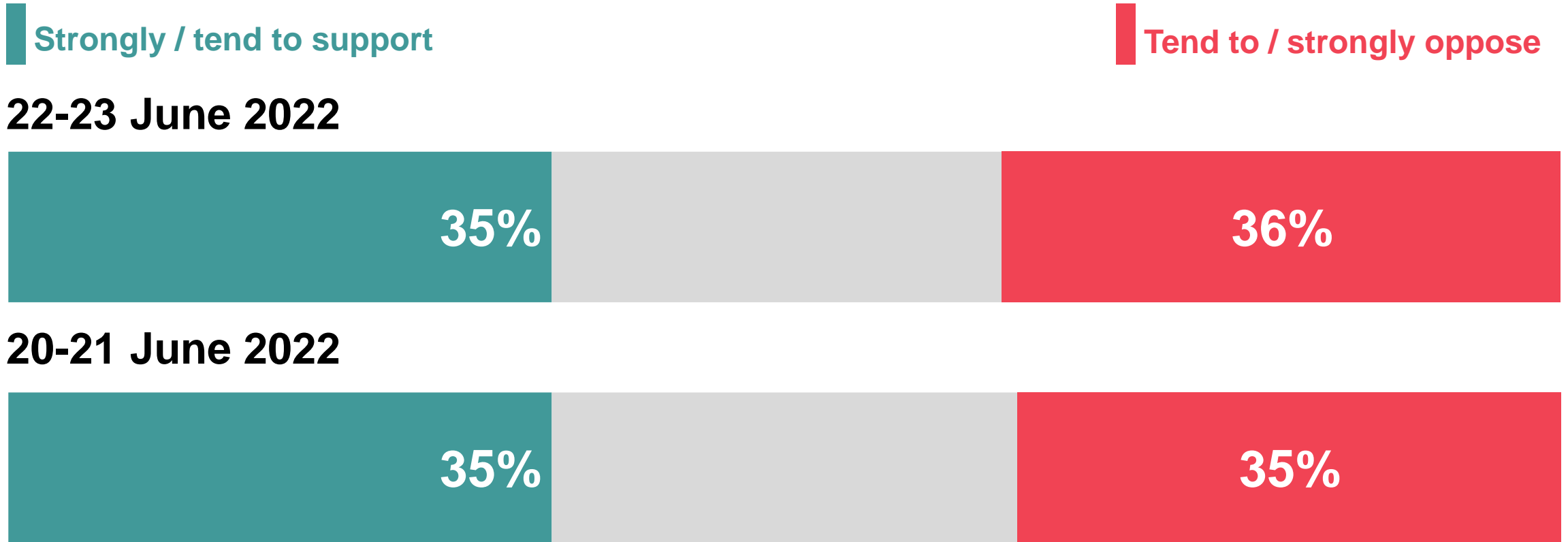
How closely, if at all, have you been following stories about...?

Public opinion remains split over recent rail strikes

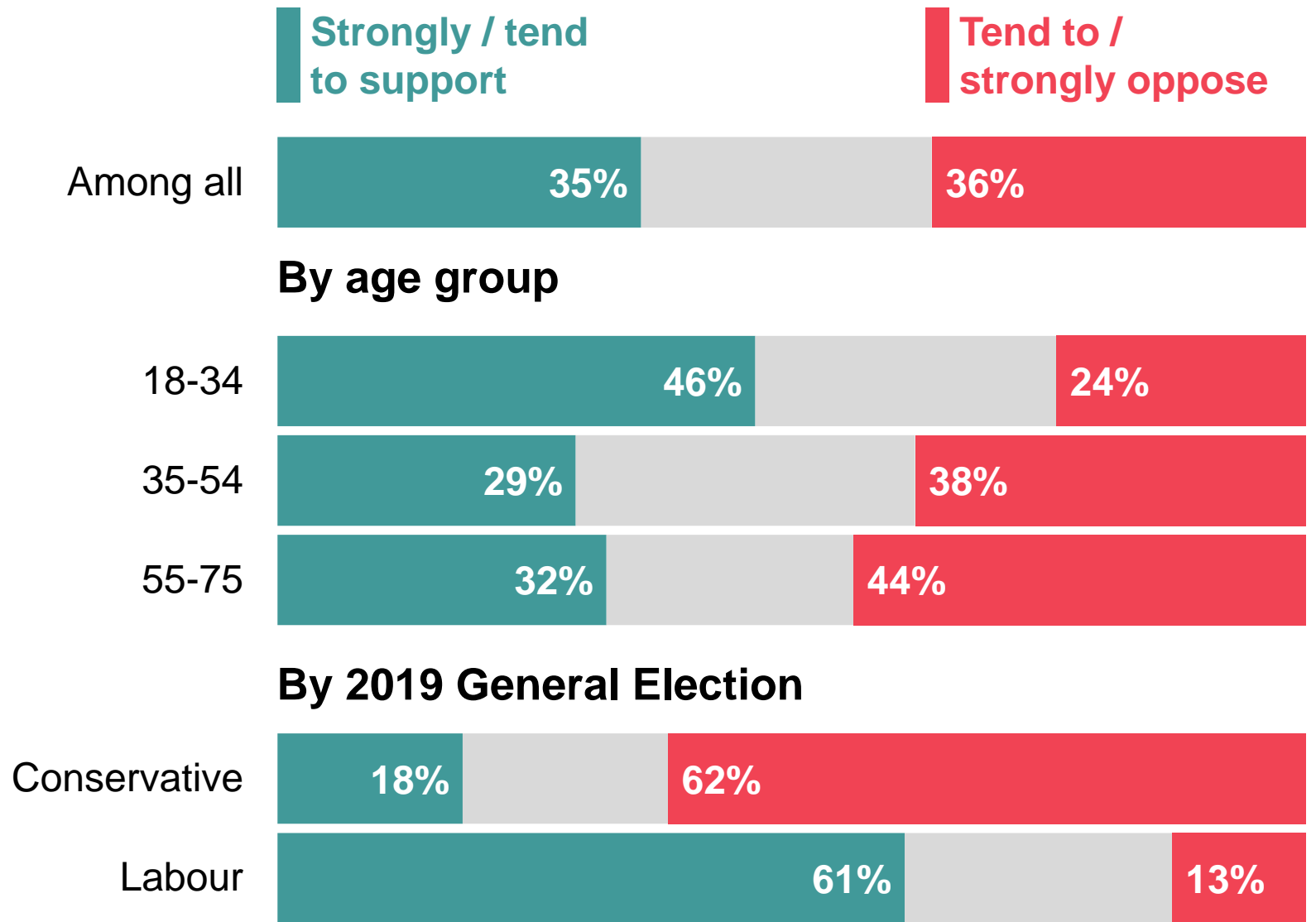
As you may know there were rail strikes this week and over the weekend. From what you know, or have heard, to what extent, if at all, do you support or oppose these strikes?

As you may know there were rail strikes this week and over the weekend. From what you know, or have heard, to what extent, if at all, do you support or oppose these strikes?

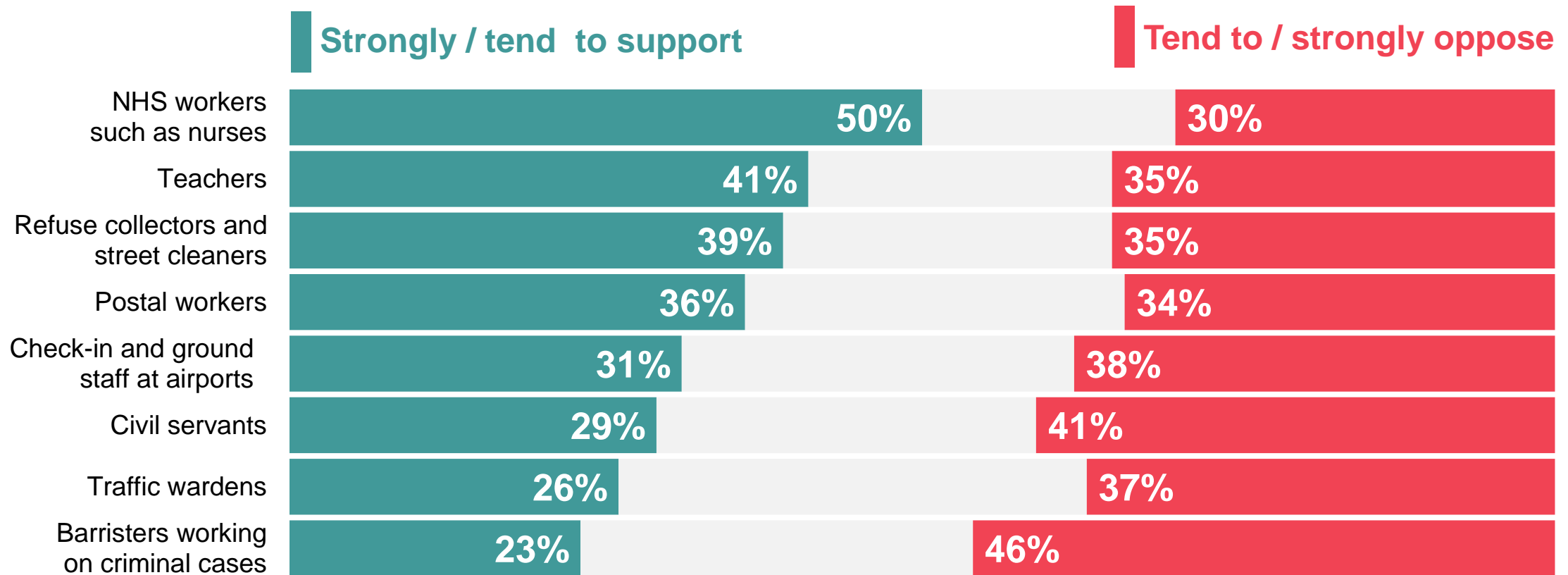
