


Four in five do not currently have private medical insurance



The public are largely divided over the influence of health-related employer benefits in applying for/accepting new roles, though private medical or dental insurance would influence around half of the public when going for a new job


If you were to apply for a new job, to what extent, if at all, would each of the below employer benefits influence whether you would apply for/accept a role?
