


Looking at institutions in Britain, the public are most favourable towards the fire brigade, NHS and Armed Forces

How favourable or unfavourable is your overall opinion of the following?

In 2021, 5.2% of overall government spending was on defence¹. Britons tend to overestimate defence spending, with a mean guess of £20.34 out of every £100 spent by British government going towards the Armed Forces

A third of Brits think government spending on defence and the Armed Forces should stay about the same


Do you think government spending on defence and the Armed Forces in the UK should be...?

Brits are mostly confident in the abilities of their Armed Forces – especially in using up-to-date tech, providing a good career path and in defending Britain and assisting allies. But less confident on mental health care or support after personnel leave the service



- Strongly/ tend to oppose


