


Over half support Liz Truss resigning as Prime Minister, similar levels who said the same about Johnson earlier this year


Would you support or oppose Liz Truss resigning as Prime Minister?



Only 13% think Truss will win the next General Election, and just 14% say she will be able to unite the Conservatives – worse scores than Johnson in June

How likely or unlikely do you think it is that Liz Truss will...?








Two in three think Kwasi Kwarteng changed Britain's economy for the worse whilst he was Chancellor of the Exchequer, just 6% say for the better




One in three think Jeremy Hunt will make no difference to Britain's economy, whilst a quarter say he will change it for the worse






How confident, if at all are, you that ... have a good long-term economic plan for Britain?









Perceptions of the British economy: Trend
