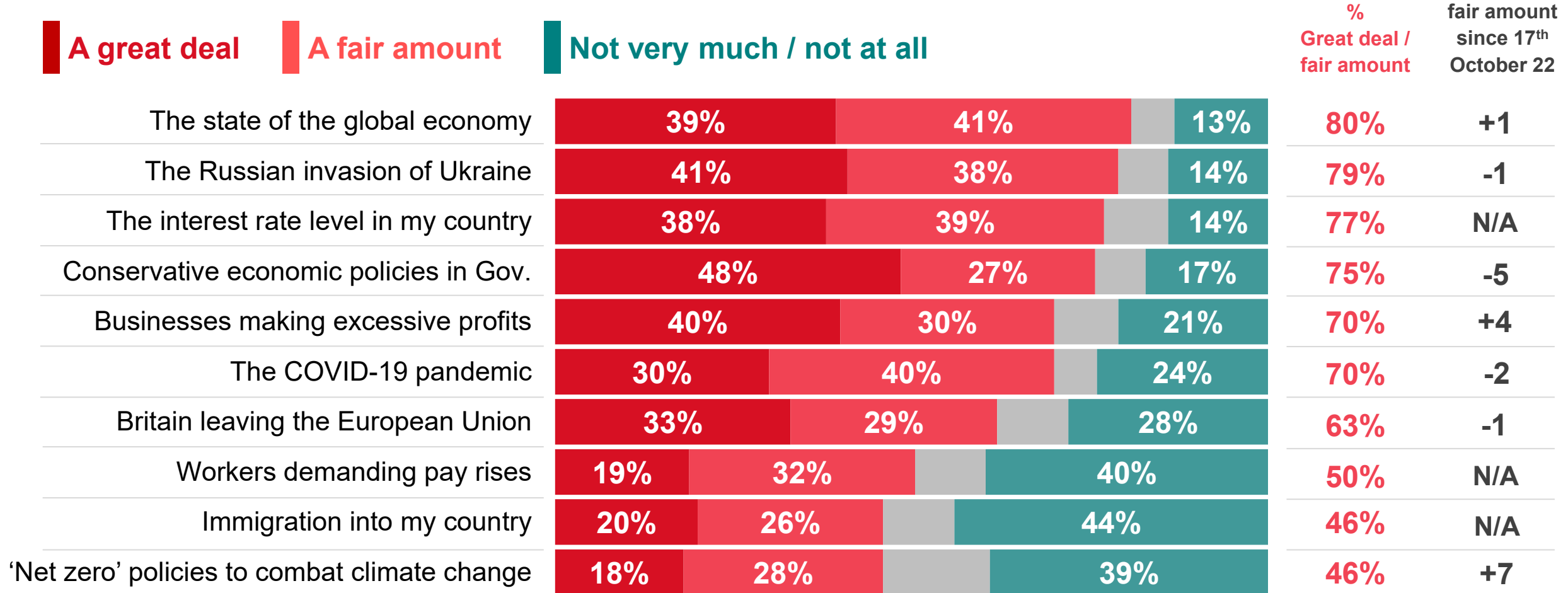

What factors contribute to Britain's rising cost of living?

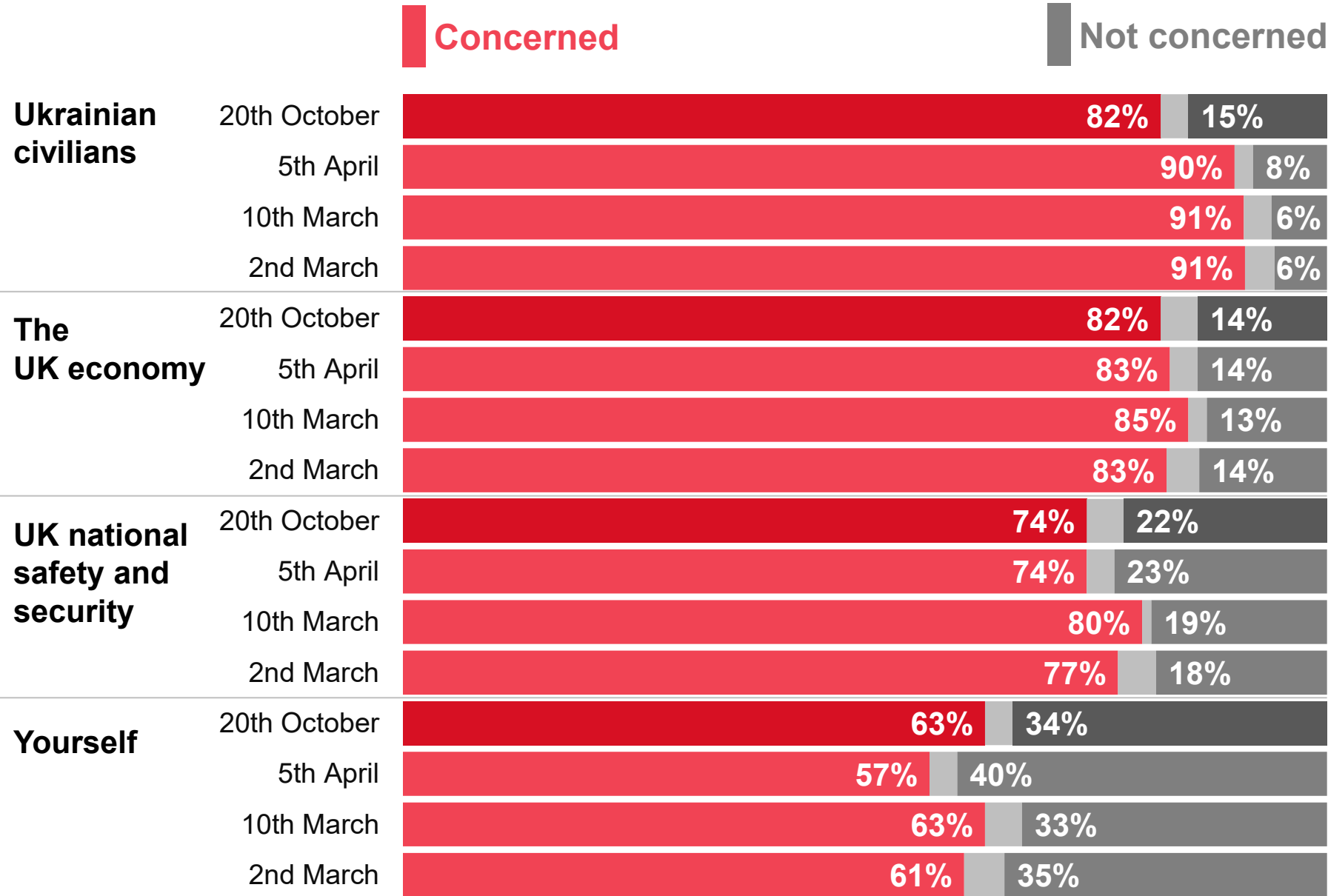
How much, if at all, do you think each of the following are contributing to the rising cost of living in Britain today?

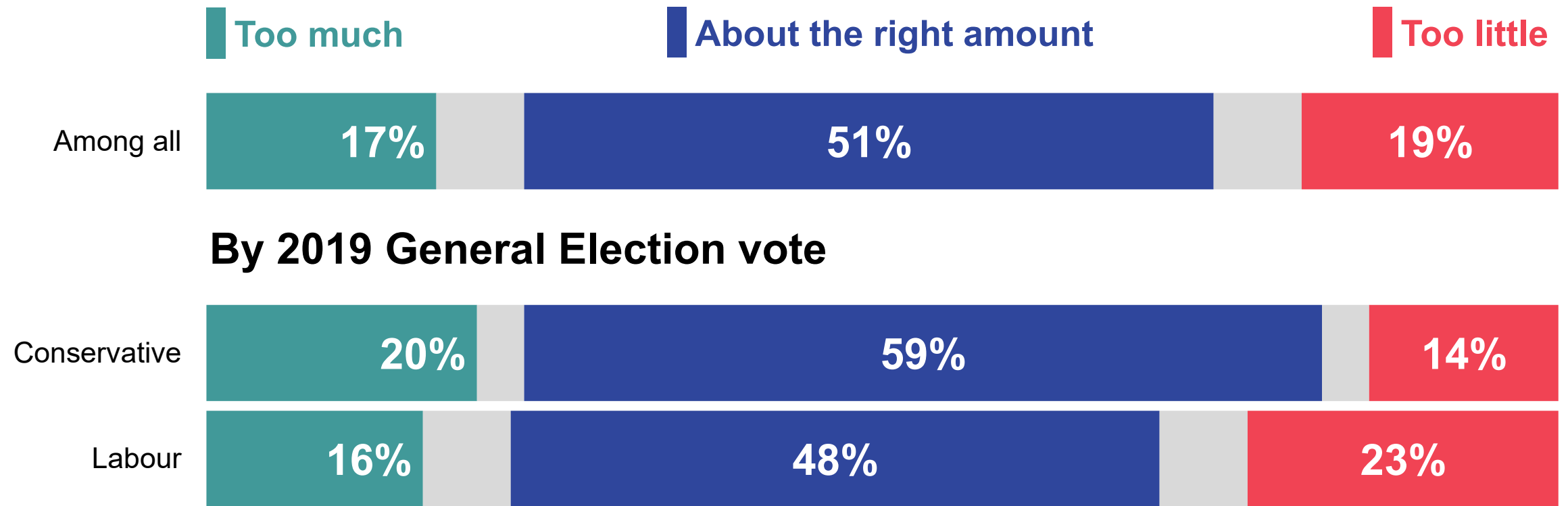

Half say the UK has provided about the right amount of support to Ukraine

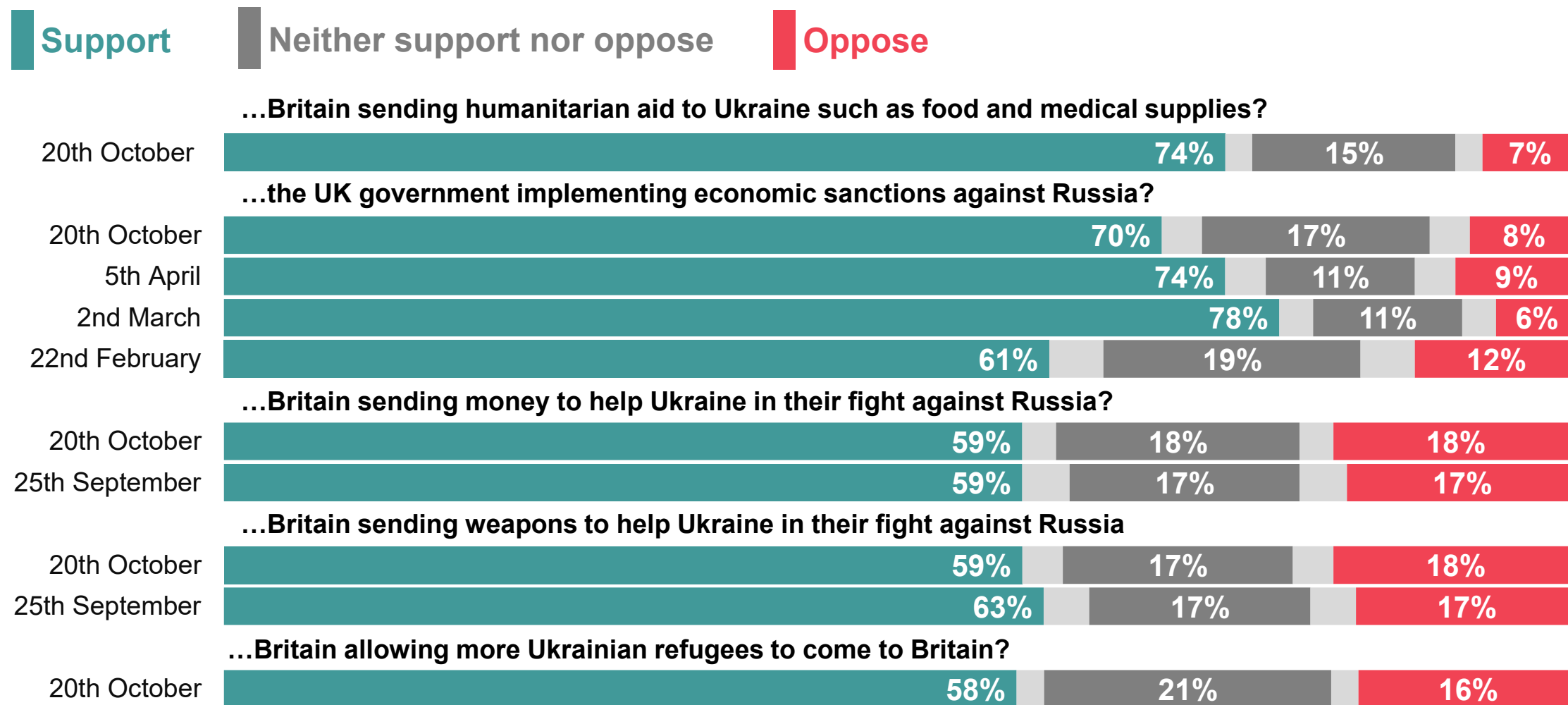
And taking everything into account, do you think the UK has provided too much, too little, or about the right amount of support to Ukraine?

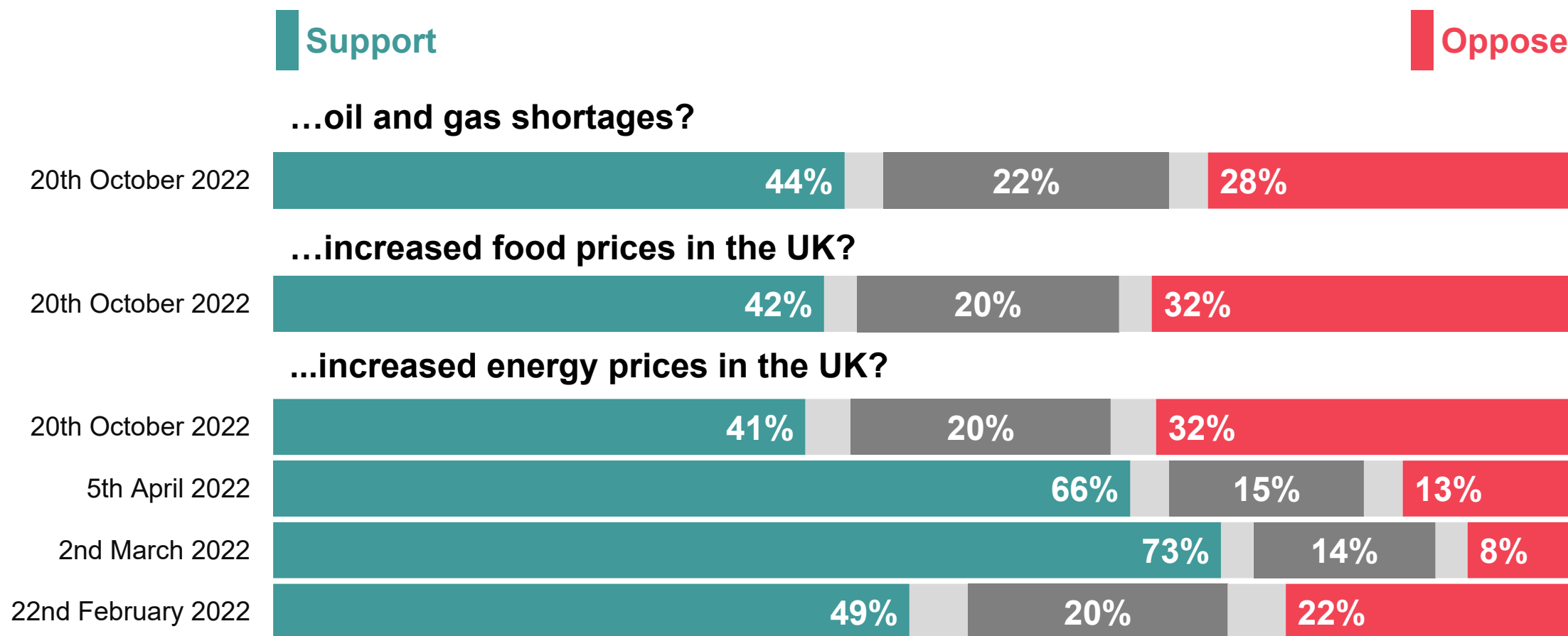
Clear majorities are supportive of Britain sending help to Ukraine and implementing economic sanctions against Russia

More than half think economic sanctions are necessary to support Ukraine and end the war, even if this means prices will remain higher for a while

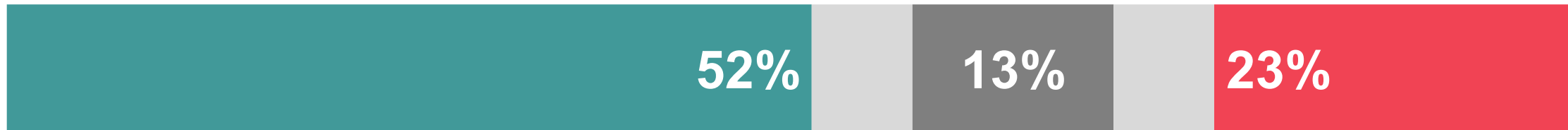
All in all, which of the following two opinions is closest to how you feel?
