


When it comes to the NHS the public are most concerned about long waiting lists, a lack of doctors or nurses and present staff being overworked

Three in four say that NHS waiting times are too long for both emergency and non-emergency treatment and care


For each of the following, do you think NHS waiting times are too long or at an acceptable level?
