


More than 6 in 10 think Matt Hancock has made the wrong decision to appear on I'm a Celebrity...Get Me Out of Here

As you may have heard, earlier this week, it was announced that Matt Hancock, MP for West Suffolk and former Health Secretary, would be joining the television programme 'I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out of Here!' The show takes place in Australia, starts on November 6th and lasts around three weeks for contestants that make the final.

Some people say Mr Hancock should focus on his job as an MP and should not be allowed to appear on the show whilst parliament is sitting. Mr Hancock says appearing on the show is a good way to raise important issues with the public.

Do you think Matt Hancock has made the right decision or the wrong decision, if either, to appear on I'm a Celebrity...Get Me Out of Here?





6 in 10 think an MP should have to resign to appear on I'm a Celebrity...Get Me Out of Here

Some people might think an MP appearing on "I'm a Celebrity...Get Me Out of Here!" should resign as an MP as they can no longer do their job as an MP properly. Others might think an MP should not have to resign as its only three weeks, is not uncommon for MPs to do paid work outside parliament and it can be useful as a means of engaging with the public.

In your opinion, should an MP have to resign as an MP to appear on I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out of Here, or not?


