






#### Westminster Voting Intention: November/December 2022

How would you vote if there were a General Election tomorrow?












# Westminster 'de facto referendum' Voting Intention: November/December 2022

As you may know, the UK Supreme Court has ruled that the Scottish Parliament cannot hold another independence referendum without the UK Government's agreement. In this case, Nicola Sturgeon has said that the SNP will treat the next UK General Election as a 'de facto' referendum, campaigning on the single issue of independence.

In this scenario, how would you vote in a General Election?














# Holyrood Constituency Voting Intention: November/December 2022

If there were elections to the Scottish Parliament tomorrow, how would you use this constituency vote?














What do you see as the most important issue/issues facing Scotland today?
















#### All likely to vote and expressing a voting intention





If a referendum were held tomorrow about Scotland's constitutional future, how would you vote in response to the following question: Should Scotland be an independent country?










## Nicola Sturgeon: satisfaction trends




