


Most still support Nurses and Ambulance workers taking strike action, though around 1 in 4 are opposed. Support for other sectors is more varied.

Half think the Government is more at fault for the length of the industrial dispute with junior doctors, with 1 in 4 thinking they're equally at fault


From what you know and/or have heard about the dispute between the government and junior doctors, which of the following statements, if either, comes closest to your view?



Half of Britons think the Government is more at fault for the length of the industrial dispute with teachers


From what you know and/or have heard about the dispute between the government and teachers, which of the following statements, if either, comes closest to your view?


