

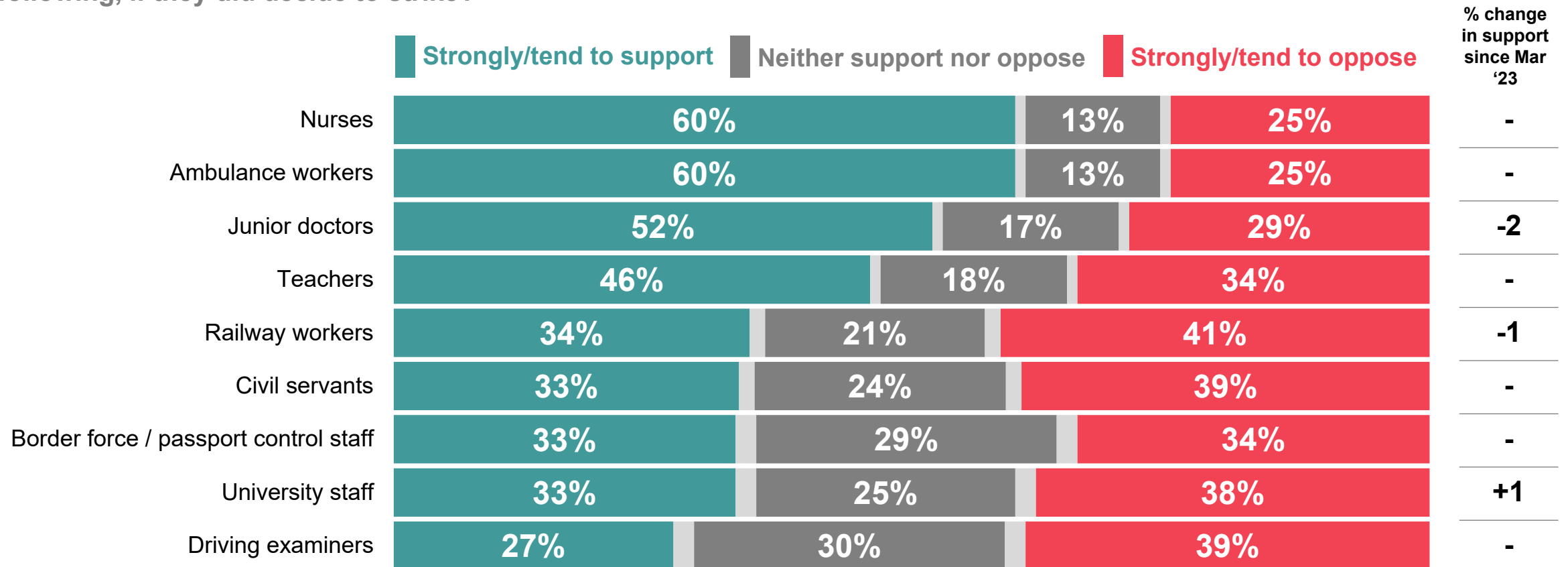


Ipsos **Public attitudes towards** **strike action by teachers**

April 2023

Support for strikes across sectors is largely unchanged from last month, with healthcare workers continuing to have the highest levels of support.

As you may know, workers from some sectors have been on strike over the past year or are considering strike action in the future. From what you know or have heard, to what extent, if at all, would you support or oppose strikes by each of the following, if they did decide to strike?

Support for striking teachers by parents – February 2023



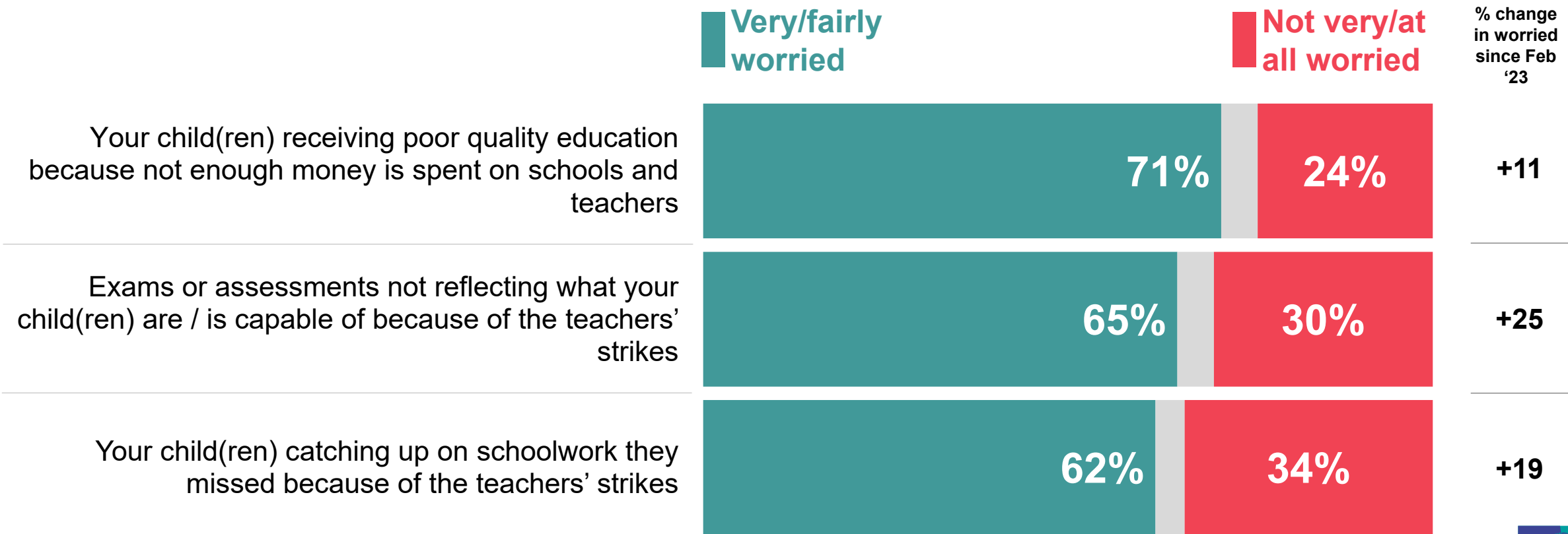

Please rate, how much you are worried, or not, about...?

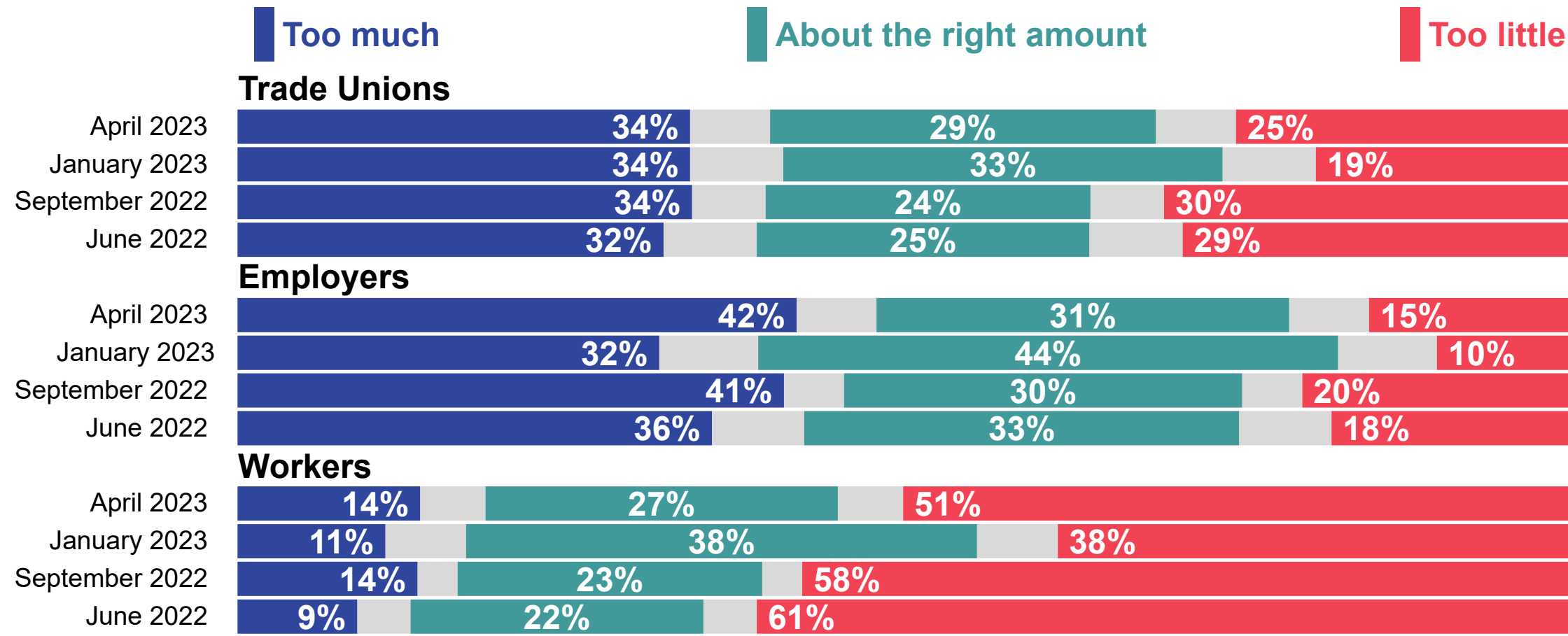
