



## Voting Intention: June 2023

### How do you intend to vote in the General Election? Will you vote...?








**Base: 1,033** British adults 18+, 14-20 June 2023; Headline Voting Intention: all 9/10 certain to vote, always/usually/it depends vote in General Elections = 635. Margin of error is displayed at +/- 4% All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that they lie within 2 points. This is especially important to keep in mind when calculating party lead figures.

How would you vote if there were an election tomorrow?












### Satisfaction with leaders and the Government: June 2023




















## **Keir Starmer: Satisfaction amongst Labour supporters**



Number of months after becoming opposition leader










### **Economic Optimism Index**

Do you think that the general economic condition of the country will improve, stay the same or get worse over the next 12 months?



Do you think that the general economic condition of the country will improve, stay the same or get worse over the next 12 months?























Looking ahead to the next General Election, which, if any, issues do you think will be very important to you in helping you decide which party to vote for?











Which party do you think has the best policies on ... the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats, or some other party?



Which party do you think has the best policies on managing the economy, the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats or some other party?
















Which party do you think has the best policies on housing, the Conservatives, Labour, Liberal Democrats or some other party?
















### Almost three in five say they know too little about what Labour or the Conservatives would do in office, after the next election




