


Support for strikes has risen across all sectors since April, with healthcare workers continuing to have the highest levels of support.



Thinking about the strikes taken by various sectors over the past year more generally, do you think they will have a positive or negative impact on each of the following in the long-term, or will they make no difference?













Just a quarter of 2019 Conservative voters think Rishi Sunak's Government is doing a good job on strike negotiations

Do you think the UK government led by Rishi Sunak is doing a good job or bad job, if either, at negotiating with trade unions to prevent public sector workers going on strike?


