


Support remains highest for healthcare workers taking strike action



Almost half think employers have too much power in Britain today, while three in five think workers have too little


Do you think the following have too much, too little, or about the right amount of power in Britain today?



Do you think the UK government led by Rishi Sunak is doing a good job or bad job, if either, at negotiating with trade unions to prevent public sector workers going on strike?


