Nuclear Update Dec 2011

These unedited topline findings are given in the form of percentages and are based on 993 interviews with adults aged 16+. Interviews were conducted face-to-face, in-home, in 144 sampling points across Great Britain, between 2-8 December 2011. Data have been weighted to reflect the population of Great Britain. The survey was funded by Ipsos MORI.

COMPARISONS ARE MADE WITH A SERIES OF SURVEYS, USING THE SAME METHODOLOGY, CONDUCTED ON BEHALF OF THE NIA.

An asterisk (*) indicates a percentage of less than 0.5%, but greater than zero. Where percentages do not add up to 100% this may be due to computer rounding, multiple responses or exclusion of 'don't know' or 'not applicable' categories.
